3 GENERAL SECTIONS

- 4 Sec. 201. In accordance with the provisions of section 30 of
- 5 article IX of the state constitution of 1963, total state spending
- 6 from state resources in this appropriation act for the fiscal year
- 7 ending September 30, 2010 is \$5,500,000.00 and state appropriations
- 8 paid to local units of government are \$0.
- 9 Sec. 202. The appropriations made and expenditures authorized
- 10 under this act and the departments, commissions, boards, offices,
- 11 and programs for which appropriations are made under this act are
- 12 subject to the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1101
- **13** to 18.1594.

14 DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES

- 15 Sec. 251. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for crisis
- 16 prevention and elder law of Michigan food for the elderly project,
- 17 the department shall allocate \$25,000.00 in private authorization
- 18 to a food aid outreach project in Muskegon County.
- 19 Sec. 252. From the funds appropriated to the department of
- 20 human services for indigent burial in 2009 PA 129, the department
- 21 of human services may work with funeral directors to establish a
- 22 regional or statewide pilot program that would include the elements
- 23 described in this section. The department's pilot project shall
- 24 provide funding only for the direct cremation of bodies of indigent
- 25 persons that are not claimed by a person having the right to
- 26 control the disposition of the body. The department may select

- 1 through competitive bidding funeral directors in each county or
- 2 region of the state to supervise the disposition of the unclaimed
- 3 bodies. Until contracts based upon such competitive bidding are
- 4 entered into, the payment to a funeral director for these services
- 5 shall be \$800.00 plus mileage reimbursement for transportation
- 6 costs at the standard rate established by the department of
- 7 management and budget for travel reimbursement for nonstate
- 8 vehicles plus the cost of the cremation permit. The department may
- 9 deviate from the payment limits established in section 613(1) of
- 10 2009 PA 129 in making payments under the pilot program. The
- 11 department shall forward a copy of the pilot program to the senate
- 12 and house of representatives appropriations subcommittees on human
- 13 services.

14 DEPARTMENTS OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY

- Sec. 301. Of the funds appropriated in part 1 for the
- 16 brownfield grants and loan program, \$5,500,000.00 shall be used to
- 17 capitalize the brownfield cleanup revolving fund authorized under
- 18 section 19608 of the natural resources and environmental protection
- 19 act, 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.19608. The department is authorized to
- 20 loan up to \$5,500,000.00 from this revolving loan fund.
- Sec. 302. The unexpended funds appropriated in part 1 for the
- 22 brownfield grants and loans program are considered work project
- 23 appropriations and any unencumbered or unallotted funds are carried
- 24 forward into the succeeding fiscal year. The following is in
- 25 compliance with section 451a(1) of the management and budget act,
- 26 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1451a:

- 1 (a) The purpose of the projects to be carried forward is to
- 2 provide contaminated site cleanup.
- 3 (b) The projects will be accomplished by contract.
- 4 (c) The total estimated cost of all projects is identified in
- 5 the line-item appropriation.
- 6 (d) The tentative completion date is September 30, 2014.

DEPARTMENT OF TREASURY

- 8 Sec. 401. Unexpended appropriations of the college access
- 9 challenge grant program are designated as work project
- 10 appropriations and shall not lapse at the end of the fiscal year
- 11 and shall continue to be available for expenditure until the
- 12 project has been completed. The following is in compliance with
- 13 section 451a of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
- **14** 18.1451a:

- 15 (a) The purpose of the project is to provide assistance and
- 16 training to Michigan families, counselors, teachers, and community
- 17 leaders in applying for and securing funds for college to low-
- 18 income students.
