# SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 6242

A bill to create the Michigan new economy commission; to provide for its operation; to impose duties on certain state and local officials; to make recommendations and make certain reports; and to repeal acts and parts of acts.

### THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. As used in this act:
- 2 (a) "Michigan new economy commission" or "commission" means
- 3 the Michigan new economy commission created under section 2.
- 4 (b) "Michigan strategic fund" means the Michigan strategic
- 5 fund under the Michigan strategic fund act, 1984 PA 270, MCL
- 6 125.2001 to 125.2094.

## House Bill No. 6242 (H-1) as amended September 29, 2010

- 1 Sec. 2. (1) The Michigan new economy commission is created
- 2 within the Michigan strategic fund. The Michigan strategic fund
- 3 shall provide staff for the commission and shall carry out the
- 4 administrative duties and functions as directed by the commission.
- 5 The budgeting, procurement, and related functions as directed by
- 6 the commission are under the supervision of the president of the
- 7 Michigan strategic fund.
- 8 (2) The Michigan new economy commission shall consist of the
- 9 following members:
- 10 (a) The president of the Michigan strategic fund or his or her
- 11 designee, as a nonvoting member.
  - [(b) The chief executive officer of the Michigan economic development corporation or its successor, or his or her designee, as a nonvoting member.
- 12 (c) The director of the Michigan state housing development
- 13 authority or his or her designee, as a nonvoting member.
- 14 [(d)] The director of the state transportation department or his
- or her designee, as a nonvoting member.
- 16 [(e)] The superintendent of public instruction or his or her
- 17 designee, as a nonvoting member.
- 18 [(f)] The following members appointed by the governor, who shall
- 19 be representative of this state geographically, racially, and with
- 20 regard to gender, 1 of which as chairperson of the commission:
- (i) One member of the house of representatives from a list of 3
- 22 or more members selected by the speaker of the house of
- 23 representatives.
- (ii) One member of the house of representatives from a list of
- 25 3 or more members selected by the minority leader of the house of
- 26 representatives.
- 27 (iii) One member of the senate from a list of 3 or more members

- 1 selected by the majority leader of the senate.
- (iv) One member of the senate from a list of 3 or more members
- 3 selected by the minority leader of the senate.
- 4 ( $\nu$ ) One member representing new economy businesses.
- 5 (vi) One member representing cultural institutions.
- 6 (vii) One member representing institutions of higher education.
- 7 (viii) One member representing regional economic development.
- 8 (ix) One member representing small businesses.
- 9 (x) One member representing young professional organizations.
- 10 (xi) One member representing leadership organizations.
- 11 (xii) One member representing small business lending.
- 12 (xiii) One member representing foundations.
- 13 (xiv) One member representing early stage business financing.
- 14 (xv) One member representing cities, villages, townships, or
- 15 counties.
- 16 (xvi) Four members, at large.
- 17 (3) The members first appointed to the Michigan new economy
- 18 commission shall be appointed after January 15, 2011 and before
- **19** March 1, 2011.
- 20 (4) Members of the Michigan new economy commission shall be
- 21 appointed for terms of 4 years or until a successor is appointed,
- 22 whichever is later, except that of the members first appointed 8
- 23 shall be appointed for 1 year, 8 shall be appointed for 2 years,
- 24 and 7 shall be appointed for 3 years.
- 25 (5) If a vacancy occurs on the Michigan new economy
- 26 commission, the governor shall make an appointment for the
- 27 unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

- 1 (6) The governor may remove a member of the Michigan new
- 2 economy commission as provided in section 10 of article V of the
- 3 state constitution of 1963.
- 4 (7) The first meeting of the Michigan new economy commission
- 5 shall be called by the governor. At the first meeting, the Michigan
- 6 new economy commission shall elect from among its members a vice-
- 7 chairperson and other officers as it considers necessary or
- 8 appropriate. After the first meeting, the Michigan new economy
- 9 commission shall meet at least quarterly, or more frequently at the
- 10 call of the chairperson or if requested by 10 or more members.
- 11 (8) A majority of the members of the Michigan new economy
- 12 commission constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at a
- 13 meeting of the Michigan new economy commission. A majority of the
- 14 members present and serving are required for official action of the
- 15 Michigan new economy commission.
- 16 (9) The business that the Michigan new economy commission may
- 17 perform shall be conducted at a public meeting of the Michigan new
- 18 economy commission held in compliance with the open meetings act,
- 19 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 20 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 21 retained by the Michigan new economy commission in the performance
- of an official function is subject to the freedom of information
- 23 act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 24 (11) Members of the Michigan new economy commission shall
- 25 serve without compensation. [

- 2 (12) The Michigan new economy commission shall do all of the
- 3 following:
- 4 (a) Develop a statewide strategy for the enhancement,
- 5 encouragement, and growth of the new economy in this state and to
- 6 promote through public and private means responsive public
- 7 policies, innovative private sector practices, and creative
- 8 nonprofit initiatives.
- 9 (b) Research and evaluate studies conducted within this state
- 10 and in other states to locate and identify best practices that
- 11 easily transfer to this state.
- 12 (c) Provide recommendations on restructuring economic programs
- 13 within state government to enhance new economy efforts.
- 14 (d) Provide strategies and propose legislation, if necessary,
- 15 to provide linkage between programs to enhance the new economy.
- 16 (e) Establish metrics to measure the effect of the new economy
- 17 on other sectors of the economy by developing and conducting
- 18 extensive statewide research and creating a database from the
- 19 results.
- 20 (f) Foster education and workforce development in the new
- 21 economy sector by stimulating efforts to develop career pathways
- 22 for new industries.
- 23 (g) Research the potential for an online resource directory,
- 24 including, but not limited to, the development and promotion of a
- 25 web-based resource highlighting the new economy and its member
- 26 companies and organizations.
- 27 (h) Research the potential for a comprehensive communications

- 1 program targeting member communities, organizations, stakeholders,
- 2 and interested parties, including, but not limited to, the
- 3 promotion of networking across the new economy sector.
- 4 (i) Research methods to brand Michigan as a new economy
- 5 leader.
- 6 (j) Develop a strategic vision for this state that includes,
- 7 but is not limited to, all of the following:
- 8 (i) Economic development.
- 9 (ii) International issues.
- 10 (iii) Outdoor recreation.
- 11 (iv) Land use.
- 12 (v) Transit.
- 13 (vi) Green initiatives.
- 14 (k) Research, inventory, and evaluate the effectiveness,
- 15 including a benefit/cost analysis, of the economic development
- 16 tools used in this state benchmarked against other states.
- 17 Sec. 3. The Michigan new economy commission shall report to
- 18 the governor, the house of representatives, and the senate the
- 19 results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations
- 20 together with drafts of legislation, if any, on or before January
- **21** 1, 2012.
- 22 Sec. 4. The Michigan new economy commission shall annually
- 23 submit on or before December 1 a written report of its activities
- 24 during the previous fiscal year to the clerk of the house of
- 25 representatives and the secretary of the senate. The report shall
- 26 include proposed changes to any statute or any rule promulgated
- 27 pursuant to state law, necessary to promote the new economy in this

- 1 state.
- 2 Sec. 5. This act is repealed on October 1, 2015.
