 - necessity of obtaining parental HIS OR HER PARENT'S or LEGAL
 - guardian's permission or authorization.
 - (3) AN INDIVIDUAL WHO IS 16 YEARS OF AGE MAY DONATE BLOOD IN A

VOLUNTARY AND NONCOMPENSATORY BLOOD PROGRAM WITH HIS OR HER PARENT'S OR LEGAL GUARDIAN'S PERMISSION OR AUTHORIZATION.
