## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 462

A bill to provide for the licensing of mortgage loan originators; to regulate the business practices of mortgage loan originators; to establish certain obligations of employees and principals of mortgage loan originators; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state agencies and officials; and to provide remedies and prescribe penalties.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "mortgage loan originator licensing act".
- 3 Sec. 3. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of the office of
- 5 financial and insurance regulation in the department of energy,
- 6 labor, and economic growth.
- 7 (b) "Depository institution" means that term as defined in

- 1 section 3 of the federal deposit insurance act, 12 USC 1813, or a
- 2 credit union.
- 3 (c) "Dwelling" means that term as defined in section 103(v) of
- 4 the truth in lending act, 15 USC 1602.
- 5 (d) "Employee" means an individual who meets both of the
- 6 following:
- 7 (i) Has an employment relationship acknowledged by that
- 8 individual and the person that engages that individual to originate
- 9 mortgage loans.
- (ii) Is treated as an employee by the person that engages that
- 11 individual to originate mortgage loans for compliance with federal
- 12 income tax laws.
- 13 (e) "Federal banking agencies" means the board of governors of
- 14 the federal reserve system, the comptroller of the currency, the
- 15 director of the office of thrift supervision, the national credit
- 16 union administration, and the federal deposit insurance
- 17 corporation.
- 18 (f) "Financial licensing acts" means that term as defined in
- 19 section 2 of the consumer financial services act, 1988 PA 161, MCL
- **20** 487.2052.
- 21 (g) "Immediate family member" means a spouse, child, sibling,
- 22 parent, grandparent, or grandchild. The term includes stepparents,
- 23 stepchildren, stepsiblings, and adoptive relationships.
- 24 (h) "Individual" means a natural person.
- 25 (i) "Licensed mortgage loan originator" means a mortgage loan
- 26 originator who holds a valid license issued by the commissioner
- 27 under this act.

- 1 (j) "Loan modification activities" means any of the following:
- 2 (i) Collecting or receiving payments, including payments of
- 3 principal, interest, escrow amounts, and other amounts due, on
- 4 existing residential mortgage loans due and owing to a mortgagor or
- 5 mortgage servicer, when the borrower is in default or in reasonably
- 6 foreseeable likelihood of default.
- 7 (ii) Working with a borrower described in subparagraph (i) to
- 8 collect data concerning the borrower's residential mortgage loan or
- 9 loans.
- 10 (iii) Making any decisions necessary to modify, either
- 11 temporarily or permanently, certain terms of the residential
- 12 mortgage loan or loans of a borrower described in subparagraph (i)
- 13 or to otherwise finalize collection through the foreclosure
- 14 process. These decisions may include changing the principal amount,
- 15 the rate of annual interest charged, or the term of a residential
- 16 mortgage loan; waiving any fees or charges, including late charges,
- 17 a borrower is obligated to pay; deferring residential mortgage loan
- 18 payments; or making similar adjustments to a borrower's residential
- 19 mortgage loan or the borrower's obligations under the loan.
- 20 (k) "Loan processor or underwriter" means an individual who
- 21 performs clerical or support duties as an employee at the direction
- 22 of and subject to the supervision and instruction of a person
- 23 licensed or designated as exempt from licensing under the mortgage
- 24 brokers, lenders, and servicers licensing act, 1987 PA 173, MCL
- 25 445.1651 to 445.1684; the secondary mortgage loan act, 1981 PA 125,
- 26 MCL 493.51 to 493.81; or the consumer financial services act, 1988
- 27 PA 161, MCL 487.2051 to 487.2072. For purposes of this subdivision,

- 1 "clerical or support duties" may include any of the following after
- 2 an application is received:
- 3 (i) The receipt, collection, distribution, and analysis of
- 4 information common for the processing or underwriting of a
- 5 residential mortgage loan.
- 6 (ii) Communicating with a consumer to obtain the information
- 7 necessary for the processing or underwriting of a loan, to the
- 8 extent that the communication does not include offering or
- 9 negotiating loan rates or terms, or counseling consumers about
- 10 residential mortgage loan rates or terms.
- 11 (l) "Mortgage loan originator" means an individual who meets
- 12 all of the following:
- 13 (i) For compensation or gain or in the expectation of
- 14 compensation or gain, does any of the following:
- 15 (A) Takes a residential mortgage loan application.
- 16 (B) Offers or negotiates terms of a residential mortgage loan.
- 17 (ii) Is not an individual engaged solely as a loan processor or
- 18 underwriter except as otherwise provided in section 5(3).
- 19 (iii) Is not a person who only performs real estate brokerage
- 20 activities and is licensed or registered under the laws of this
- 21 state, unless the person is compensated by a lender, a mortgage
- 22 broker, or other mortgage loan originator or by any agent of a
- 23 lender, mortgage broker, or other mortgage loan originator.
- (iv) Is not a person solely involved in extensions of credit
- 25 relating to timeshare plans, as that term is defined in 11 USC
- 26 101(53D).
- 27 (m) "Mortgage servicer" means a person who directly or

- 1 indirectly services or offers to service residential mortgage
- 2 loans.
- 3 (n) "Nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry" means

- 4 a mortgage licensing system developed and maintained by the
- 5 conference of state bank supervisors and the American association
- 6 of residential mortgage regulators for the licensing and
- 7 registration of licensed mortgage loan originators.
- 8 (o) "Nontraditional mortgage product" means any mortgage
- 9 product other than a 30-year fixed rate mortgage.
- 10 (p) "Person" means an individual, corporation, limited
- 11 liability company, partnership, association, or other legal entity.
- 12 (q) "Real estate brokerage activity" means any activity that
- involves offering or providing real estate brokerage services to
- 14 the public, including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- (i) Acting as a real estate agent or real estate broker for a
- 16 buyer, seller, lessor, or lessee of real property.
- 17 (ii) Bringing together parties interested in the sale,
- 18 purchase, lease, rental, or exchange of real property.
- 19 (iii) On behalf of any party, negotiating any portion of a
- 20 contract relating to the sale, purchase, lease, rental, or exchange
- 21 of real property, other than in connection with providing financing
- 22 with respect to that contract.
- (iv) Engaging in any activity for which a person engaged in the
- 24 activity is required to be registered or licensed as a real estate
- 25 agent or real estate broker under any applicable law.
- 26 (v) Offering to engage in any activity, or act in any
- 27 capacity, described in subparagraphs (i), (ii), (iii), or (iv).

- 1 (r) "Registered mortgage loan originator" means an individual
- 2 who meets all of the following:
- 3 (i) Is a mortgage loan originator and is an employee of any of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (A) A depository institution.
- 6 (B) A subsidiary of a depository institution that is owned and
- 7 controlled by that depository institution and is regulated by a
- 8 federal banking agency.
- 9 (C) An institution regulated by the farm credit
- 10 administration.
- 11 (ii) Is registered with, and maintains a unique identifier
- 12 through, the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry.
- 13 (s) "Residential mortgage loan" means any loan primarily for
- 14 personal, family, or household use that is secured by a mortgage,
- 15 deed of trust, or other equivalent consensual security interest on
- 16 a dwelling or residential real estate on which a person has
- 17 constructed or intends to construct a dwelling.
- 18 (t) "Residential real estate" means any real property located
- 19 in this state on which a person has constructed or intends to
- 20 construct a dwelling.
- 21 (u) "SAFE act" means the secure and fair enforcement for
- 22 mortgage licensing act of 2008, title V of the housing and economic
- 23 recovery act of 2008, Public Law 110-289, 12 USC 5101 to 5116.
- (v) "Service" means the collection or remittance for a lender,
- 25 noteowner, or noteholder or a person's own account of 4 or more
- 26 installment payments of the principal of, interest of, or an amount
- 27 placed in escrow under a residential mortgage loan, mortgage

- 1 servicing agreement, or an agreement with a mortgagor.
- 2 (w) "Unique identifier" means a number or other identifier
- 3 assigned by protocols established by the nationwide mortgage
- 4 licensing system and registry.
- 5 Sec. 5. (1) Subject to subsection (5), unless specifically
- 6 exempted under subsection (2), beginning July 31, 2010, an
- 7 individual shall not engage in the business of a mortgage loan
- 8 originator with respect to any dwelling located in this state
- 9 without first obtaining and maintaining annually a license under
- 10 this act. Each licensed mortgage loan originator must register with
- 11 and maintain a valid unique identifier issued by the nationwide
- 12 mortgage licensing system and registry.
- 13 (2) Each of the following is exempt from this act:
- 14 (a) A registered mortgage loan originator, when acting for an
- entity described section 3(p)(i)(A), (B), or (C).
- 16 (b) An individual who offers or negotiates terms of a
- 17 residential mortgage loan with or on behalf of an immediate family
- 18 member of that individual.
- 19 (c) An individual who offers or negotiates terms of a
- 20 residential mortgage loan secured by a dwelling that served as his
- 21 or her residence.
- 22 (d) A licensed attorney who negotiates the terms of a
- 23 residential mortgage loan on behalf of a client as an ancillary
- 24 matter to the attorney's representation of the client, unless the
- 25 attorney is compensated by a lender, mortgage broker, or other
- 26 mortgage loan originator or by any agent of a lender, mortgage
- 27 broker, or other mortgage loan originator.

- 1 (3) A loan processor or underwriter who is an independent
- 2 contractor may not engage in the activities of a loan processor or
- 3 underwriter unless that independent contractor loan processor or
- 4 underwriter obtains and maintains a license under subsection (1).
- 5 Each independent contractor loan processor or underwriter licensed
- 6 as a mortgage loan originator must have and maintain a valid unique
- 7 identifier issued by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 8 registry.
- 9 (4) The commissioner may establish licensing rules and interim
- 10 procedures for licensing and acceptance of applications. For
- 11 previously registered or licensed individuals, the commissioner may
- 12 establish expedited review and licensing procedures.
- 13 (5) An individual engaged in the business of a mortgage loan
- 14 originator is not required to obtain and maintain a license under
- 15 this act until July 31, 2011 if that individual is employed
- 16 exclusively by a mortgage servicer; if that individual is
- 17 authorized to perform loan modification activities concerning
- 18 existing residential mortgage loans, and not to originate new
- 19 residential mortgage loans or perform any other activities of a
- 20 mortgage loan originator, on behalf of that mortgage servicer; and
- 21 if this extension of time is not inconsistent with any quideline,
- 22 rule, regulation, or interpretative letter of the United States
- 23 department of housing and urban development concerning the
- 24 interpretation of the SAFE act and its applicability to loan
- 25 modification activities.
- Sec. 7. (1) An applicant for a license under this act shall
- 27 apply in a form as prescribed by the commissioner. The applicant

- 1 shall include with the application the fee required under section
- 2 19 and the criminal history check required under subsection (2).
- 3 Each application form shall contain the content established by
- 4 rule, instruction, or procedure of the commissioner. The
- 5 commissioner may change or update the application form and its
- 6 contents as necessary by the commissioner in order to carry out the
- 7 purposes of this act.
- 8 (2) A person that employs or offers to employ, or engages or
- 9 offers to engage as an agent, an individual as a mortgage loan
- 10 originator, to originate mortgage loans on or after July 31, 2010,
- 11 shall conduct a criminal history check of that individual and the
- 12 applicant shall submit the results of that criminal history check
- 13 with his or her application for license. All of the following apply
- 14 to the criminal history check of an individual required under this
- 15 subsection:
- 16 (a) The federal bureau of investigation shall perform the
- 17 criminal history check.
- 18 (b) The individual who is the subject of the criminal history
- 19 check shall have his or her fingerprints taken by a law enforcement
- 20 agency or by another person that the commissioner determines is
- 21 qualified to take fingerprints; shall pay the agency or person the
- 22 fees as required by the federal bureau of investigation for
- 23 processing fingerprints and completing a criminal history check;
- 24 and shall request that the agency or person forward the
- 25 fingerprints and appropriate fee to the federal bureau of
- 26 investigation for a national criminal history check.
- 27 (c) After receiving a proper request and the required fees

- 1 under this subsection, the federal bureau of investigation shall
- 2 conduct the criminal history check and provide the commissioner and
- 3 the applicant with the results of the criminal history check. The
- 4 results shall contain any criminal history record information
- 5 concerning the individual maintained by the federal bureau of
- 6 investigation's criminal history check.
- 7 (d) A criminal history check required under this subsection
- 8 may be conducted, requested of and performed by the federal bureau
- 9 of investigation, and submitted to the commissioner at any time on
- 10 or after July 31, 2009.
- 11 (3) The commissioner is authorized to establish relationships
- 12 or contracts with the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 13 registry or other entities designated by the nationwide mortgage
- 14 licensing system and registry to collect and maintain records and
- 15 process transaction fees or other fees related to licensed mortgage
- 16 loan originators or other persons subject to this act.
- 17 (4) In connection with an application for licensing as a
- 18 mortgage loan originator, an applicant shall at a minimum furnish
- 19 to the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry
- 20 information concerning the applicant's identity, including, but not
- 21 limited to, all of the following:
- 22 (a) The results of the criminal history check conducted under
- 23 subsection (2).
- (b) The applicant's personal history and experience in a form
- 25 prescribed by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 26 registry, including the submission of authorization for the
- 27 nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry and the

- 1 commissioner to obtain all of the following concerning the
- 2 applicant:
- 3 (i) An independent credit report obtained from a consumer
- 4 reporting agency, as defined in 603 of the fair credit reporting
- 5 act, 15 USC 1681a.
- 6 (ii) Information related to any administrative, civil, or
- 7 criminal findings by any governmental jurisdiction.
- 8 (5) For the purposes of this section, the commissioner may use
- 9 the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry for any of
- 10 the following:
- 11 (a) Requesting information from and distributing information
- 12 to the department of justice or any governmental agency.
- 13 (b) Requesting and distributing information to and from any
- 14 source as directed by the commissioner.
- 15 Sec. 9. (1) The commissioner shall not issue a mortgage loan
- 16 originator license unless the commissioner makes at a minimum the
- 17 following findings:
- 18 (a) The applicant is not subject to a prohibition order issued
- 19 by the commissioner under section 27 or under any of the financial
- 20 licensing acts.
- 21 (b) The applicant has never had a mortgage loan originator
- 22 license revoked in any governmental jurisdiction, except that the
- 23 commissioner shall not consider a revocation that is formally
- 24 vacated as a revocation for purposes of this subdivision.
- (c) Subject to subsection (2), the applicant has not been
- 26 convicted of, or pled guilty or no contest to, any of the following
- 27 in a domestic, foreign, or military court:

- 1 (i) Within the 10-year period preceding the date of the license
- 2 application, a felony other than a felony described in subparagraph
- 3 (*ii*).
- 4 (ii) At any time preceding the date of the license application,
- 5 any felony or misdemeanor involving fraud, dishonesty, or a breach
- 6 of trust, money laundering, embezzlement, forgery, a financial
- 7 transaction, or securities.
- 8 (d) The applicant has demonstrated financial responsibility,
- 9 character, and general fitness that commands the confidence of the
- 10 community and warrants a determination that the mortgage loan
- 11 originator will operate honestly, fairly, and efficiently within
- 12 the purposes of this act.
- 13 (e) The applicant has completed the prelicensing education
- 14 requirement described in section 11.
- 15 (f) The applicant has passed a written test that meets the
- 16 test requirement described in section 13.
- 17 (g) The applicant has met the surety bond requirement
- 18 described in section 29.
- 19 (2) The commissioner shall not consider a conviction for which
- 20 a pardon was granted a conviction for purposes of subsection
- **21** (1)(c).
- Sec. 11. (1) To meet the prelicensing education requirement
- 23 under section 9(1)(e), except as provided in subsection (6), the
- 24 applicant shall complete at least 20 hours of education approved
- 25 under subsection (2), including at least all of the following:
- (a) Three hours of federal law and regulations.
- 27 (b) Three hours of ethics, including instruction on fraud,

- 1 consumer protection, and fair lending issues.
- 2 (c) Two hours of training related to lending standards for the

- 3 nontraditional mortgage product marketplace.
- 4 (2) Only prelicensing education courses reviewed and approved
- 5 by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry may be
- 6 used to satisfy the requirements of subsection (1). Review and
- 7 approval of a prelicensing education course shall include review
- 8 and approval of the course provider.
- 9 (3) If approved by the nationwide mortgage licensing system
- 10 and registry, a prelicensing education course may be provided by
- 11 the employer of the applicant, an entity that is affiliated with
- 12 the applicant by an agency contract, or a subsidiary or affiliate
- 13 of that employer or entity.
- 14 (4) Prelicensing education may be offered in a classroom,
- 15 online, or by any other means approved by the nationwide mortgage
- 16 licensing system and registry.
- 17 (5) If a person completes any prelicensing education
- 18 requirements described in subsection (1)(a), (b), or (c) that are
- 19 approved by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry
- 20 for any state, the commissioner shall accept those hours of
- 21 education as credit toward completion of the prelicensing education
- 22 requirements under this section.
- 23 (6) For an application for a mortgage loan originator license
- 24 submitted before July 31, 2010, completion of the classroom
- 25 instruction requirement described in section 2a(4)(d) of the
- 26 mortgage brokers, lenders, and servicers licensing act, 1987 PA
- 27 173, MCL 445.1652a, or section 2a(4)(d) of the secondary mortgage

- 1 loan act, 1981 PA 125, MCL 493.52a, satisfies the prelicensing
- 2 education requirement described in subsection (1). An applicant
- 3 described in this subsection shall provide proof in the form of a
- 4 certificate of completion or other evidence acceptable to the
- 5 commissioner.
- 6 (7) If an unlicensed individual who formerly held a license
- 7 issued under this act applies for a new license under this act, he
- 8 or she must prove that he or she completed all of the continuing
- 9 education requirements of section 17 for the year in which the
- 10 previous license was last held to be eligible for a new or renewed
- 11 license.
- Sec. 13. (1) To meet the written test requirement under
- 13 section 9(1)(f), except as provided in subsection (5), an
- 14 individual shall pass a qualified written test developed by the
- 15 nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry and administered
- 16 by a test provider approved by the nationwide mortgage licensing
- 17 system and registry based on reasonable standards.
- 18 (2) A written test is not considered a qualified written test
- 19 for purposes of subsection (1) unless the test adequately measures
- 20 the applicant's knowledge and comprehension in appropriate subject
- 21 areas, including all of the following:
- 22 (a) Ethics.
- (b) Federal law and regulation pertaining to mortgage
- 24 origination and to mortgage lending, including, but not limited to,
- 25 fraud, consumer protection, and fair lending issues and the
- 26 nontraditional mortgage marketplace.
- (c) State law and regulation pertaining to mortgage

- 1 origination and to mortgage lending, including, but not limited to,
- 2 fraud, consumer protection, and fair lending issues and the
- 3 nontraditional mortgage marketplace.
- 4 (3) If the test provider is approved by the nationwide
- 5 mortgage licensing system and registry, the test provider may
- 6 provide a test at the location of the employer of the applicant,
- 7 the location of any subsidiary or affiliate of the employer of the
- 8 applicant, or the location of any entity with which the applicant
- 9 holds an exclusive arrangement to conduct the business of a
- 10 mortgage loan originator.
- 11 (4) All of the following apply to a test under this section:
- 12 (a) An individual is not considered to have passed a qualified
- 13 written test unless the individual achieves a test score of 75% or
- 14 more correct answers to questions.
- 15 (b) An individual may retake a test 3 consecutive times, if
- 16 each consecutive retaking occurs at least 30 days after the
- 17 preceding test.
- 18 (c) If an individual fails 3 consecutive tests, the individual
- 19 must wait at least 6 months before taking the test again.
- 20 (d) If an unlicensed individual who formerly held a license
- 21 issued under this act applies for a new license under this act, he
- 22 or she must retake the test if it has been at least 5 years since
- 23 he or she last held a valid license under this act.
- 24 (5) If an applicant for a mortgage loan originator license has
- 25 met the testing requirement described in section 2a(4)(e) of the
- 26 mortgage brokers, lenders, and servicers licensing act, 1987 PA
- 27 173, MCL 445.1652a, or section 2a(4)(e) of the secondary mortgage

- 1 loan act, 1981 PA 125, MCL 493.52a, in the 5-year period preceding
- 2 the date of the application, and provides evidence acceptable to
- 3 the commissioner that he or she met that testing requirement, the
- 4 applicant is considered to have met that part of the written test
- 5 requirement under section 9(1)(f) applicable to the state law and
- 6 regulation described in subsection (2)(c).
- 7 Sec. 15. (1) The commissioner shall annually renew the license
- 8 of a licensed mortgage loan originator if all of the following are
- 9 met before his or her current license expires:
- 10 (a) The mortgage loan originator continues to meet the minimum
- 11 standards for license issuance under section 9.
- 12 (b) The mortgage loan originator has satisfied the annual
- 13 continuing education requirements described in section 17.
- 14 (c) The mortgage loan originator has paid the fee required
- 15 under section 19.
- 16 (2) If a mortgage loan originator fails to satisfy the
- 17 requirements of subsection (1) for renewal of his or her license,
- 18 the license shall expire. The commissioner may adopt procedures for
- 19 the reinstatement of expired licenses consistent with the standards
- 20 established by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 21 registry.
- 22 Sec. 17. (1) To meet the annual continuing education
- 23 requirements described in section 15(1)(b), a licensed mortgage
- 24 loan originator shall complete at least 8 hours of education
- 25 approved under subsection (2), including at least all of the
- 26 following:
- (a) Three hours of federal law and regulations.

- 1 (b) Two hours of ethics, including instruction on fraud,
- 2 consumer protection, and fair lending issues.
- 3 (c) Two hours of training related to lending standards for the
- 4 nontraditional mortgage product marketplace.
- 5 (2) Only continuing education courses reviewed and approved by
- 6 the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry, based on
- 7 reasonable standards, may be used to satisfy the requirements of
- 8 subsection (1). Review and approval of a continuing education
- 9 course shall include review and approval of the course provider.
- 10 (3) If approved by the nationwide mortgage licensing system
- 11 and registry, a continuing education course may be provided by the
- 12 employer of the mortgage loan originator, an entity that is
- 13 affiliated with the mortgage loan originator by an agency contract,
- 14 or a subsidiary or affiliate of that employer or entity.
- 15 (4) Continuing education may be offered in a classroom,
- 16 online, or by any other means approved by the nationwide mortgage
- 17 licensing system and registry.
- 18 (5) Both of the following apply to the continuing education
- 19 requirements of a licensed mortgage loan originator:
- 20 (a) Except for section 15(2) and subsection (9), he or she may
- 21 only receive credit for a continuing education course in the year
- 22 in which the course is taken.
- 23 (b) He or she may not take the same approved course in the
- 24 same or successive years to meet the annual requirements for
- 25 continuing education.
- 26 (6) A licensed mortgage loan originator who is an approved
- 27 instructor of an approved continuing education course may receive

- 1 credit for the licensed mortgage loan originator's own annual
- 2 continuing education requirement at the rate of 2 hours credit for

- 3 every 1 hour taught.
- 4 (7) If a person successfully completes any continuing
- 5 education requirements described in subsection (1)(a), (b), or (c)
- 6 that are approved by the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 7 registry for any state, the commissioner shall accept those hours
- 8 of education as credit toward completion of the continuing
- 9 education requirements under this section.
- 10 (8) If an unlicensed individual who formerly held a license
- 11 issued under this act applies for a new license under this act, he
- 12 or she must complete the continuing education requirements for the
- 13 last year in which the license was held to be eligible for a new or
- 14 renewed license.
- 15 (9) The commissioner by rule may establish a procedure by
- 16 which an individual who meets the requirements of section 15(1)(a)
- 17 and (c) may make up any deficiency in continuing education.
- 18 Sec. 19. (1) At the time of making an initial application for
- 19 a mortgage loan originator license under this act, the applicant
- 20 shall pay to the commissioner the annual operating fee established
- 21 by the commissioner under subsection (2).
- 22 (2) The commissioner shall annually establish a schedule of
- 23 fees that are sufficient to pay, but not to exceed, the reasonably
- 24 anticipated costs of the office of financial and insurance
- 25 regulation for administering and enforcing this act. The fee

1 in an amount established by the commissioner. For purposes of this

- 13 (3) Fees received under this act are not refundable.
- 14 (4) If any fees or penalties provided for in this act are not
- 15 paid when required, the attorney general may maintain an action
- 16 against the delinquent licensed mortgage loan originator for the
- 17 recovery of the fees and penalties together with interest and
- 18 costs.
- 19 (5) A licensed mortgage loan originator who fails to submit to
- 20 the commissioner the reports required under section 33(3) is
- 21 subject to a penalty of \$25.00 for each day a required report is
- 22 delinquent or \$1,000.00, whichever is less.
- 23 (6) A mortgage loan originator license renewal fee that is not
- 24 received on or before December 31 is subject to a penalty of \$25.00
- 25 for each day the fee is delinquent or \$1,000.00, whichever is less.
- 26 (7) Money received from the fees described in this section
- 27 shall be deposited in the MBLSLA fund. As used in this subsection,

- 1 "MBLSLA fund" means the restricted account created under section
- 2 8(8) of the mortgage brokers, lenders, and servicers licensing act,
- 3 1987 PA 173, MCL 445.1658.
- 4 (8) The annual operating fees set by the commissioner shall
- 5 not exceed the levels needed to cover the estimated cost of
- 6 enforcement of this act.
- 7 Sec. 21. In addition to any other duties imposed on the
- 8 commissioner under this act, the commissioner shall require
- 9 mortgage loan originators to be licensed and registered through the
- 10 nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry. To carry out
- 11 this requirement, the commissioner is authorized to participate in
- 12 the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry and may by
- 13 rule establish other requirements that he or she considers
- 14 necessary, including, but not limited to, any of the following:
- 15 (a) Background checks for any of the following:

- 25 (b) The payment of fees to apply for or renew licenses through
- 26 the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry.
- 27 (c) The setting or resetting as necessary of renewal or

- 1 reporting dates.
- 2 (d) Requirements for amending or surrendering a license or any
- 3 other activities that the commissioner considers necessary for
- 4 participation in the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 5 registry.
- 6 Sec. 23. The commissioner shall establish a process through
- 7 which mortgage loan originators may challenge information entered
- 8 into the nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry by the
- 9 commissioner.
- 10 Sec. 25. (1) To ensure the effective supervision and
- 11 enforcement of this act, the commissioner may do any of the
- 12 following, in a manner consistent with the requirements of the
- 13 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- **14** 24.328:
- 15 (a) Deny, suspend, revoke, condition, or decline to renew a
- 16 license for a violation of this act, rules issued under this act,
- 17 or an order or directive entered under this act.
- 18 (b) Deny, suspend, revoke, condition or decline to renew a
- 19 license if a licensed mortgage loan originator or license applicant
- 20 fails at any time to meet the requirements of section 9 or 15 or
- 21 withholds information or makes a material misstatement in an
- 22 application for a license or renewal of a license.
- 23 (c) Order restitution against a person that is subject to this
- 24 act for a violation of this act.
- 25 (d) Subject to subsections (2), (3), and (4), impose a civil
- 26 fine on a person that is subject to this act.
- 27 (e) Issue any of the following orders or directives under this

- 1 act:
- 2 (i) Order or direct a person that is subject to this act to
- 3 cease and desist from conducting business, including an immediate
- 4 temporary order to cease and desist.
- 5 (ii) Order or direct a person that is subject to this act to
- 6 cease any harmful activities or violations of this act, including
- 7 an immediate temporary order to cease and desist.
- 8 (iii) Enter an immediate temporary order to cease business under
- 9 a license or interim license issued pursuant to the authority
- 10 granted under section 5(4), if the commissioner determines that the
- 11 license or interim license was erroneously granted or the licensed
- 12 mortgage loan originator is currently in violation of this act.
- 13 (iv) Issue an order under section 27.
- 14 (v) Order or direct any other affirmative action that the
- 15 commissioner considers necessary.
- 16 (2) The commissioner may impose a civil fine on a mortgage
- 17 loan originator or other person subject to this act, if the
- 18 commissioner finds, on the record after notice and opportunity for
- 19 hearing, that the mortgage loan originator or other person has
- 20 violated or failed to comply with a requirement of this act, a rule
- 21 promulgated by the commissioner under this act, or an order issued
- 22 under the authority of this act.
- 23 (3) The maximum fine for each violation or failure to comply
- 24 described in subsection (2) is \$25,000.00.
- 25 (4) Each violation or failure to comply described in
- 26 subsection (2) is a separate and distinct violation or failure.
- Sec. 27. (1) If in the opinion of the commissioner an

1 individual has engaged in fraud, the commissioner may serve on that

- 2 person a written notice of intention to prohibit that individual
- 3 from being licensed under this act, licensed or registered under
- 4 any of the financial licensing acts, or employed by, an agent of,
- 5 or a control person of a licensee or registrant under any of the
- 6 financial licensing acts.
- 7 (2) A notice issued under subsection (1) shall contain a
- 8 statement of the facts supporting the prohibition and, except as
- 9 provided under subsection (7), shall set a hearing on a date within
- 10 60 days after the date of the notice. If the individual does not
- 11 appear at the hearing, he or she is considered to have consented to
- 12 the issuance of an order in accordance with the notice.
- 13 (3) If after a hearing held under subsection (2) the

- 23 employee or agent. The order remains in effect until it is stayed,
- 24 modified, terminated, or set aside by the commissioner or a
- 25 reviewing court.

- 7 financial licensing acts. The suspension is effective on the date
- 8 the order is issued and, unless stayed by a court, remains in
- 9 effect until the commissioner completes the review required under
- 10 this section and the commissioner has dismissed the charges
- 11 specified in the order.
- 12 (7) Unless otherwise agreed to by the commissioner and the
- individual served with an order issued under subsection (6), the
- 14 commissioner shall hold the hearing required under subsection (2)
- 15 to review the suspension not earlier than 5 days or later than 20
- 16 days after the date of the notice.
- 17 (8) If an individual is convicted of a felony involving fraud,
- 18 dishonesty, or breach of trust, the commissioner may issue an order
- 19 suspending or prohibiting him or her from being licensed under this
- 20 act, licensed or registered under any of the financial licensing
- 21 acts, or employed by, an agent of, or a control person of a
- 22 licensee or registrant under any of the financial licensing acts.
- 23 After 5 years from the date of the order, the individual subject to
- 24 the order may apply to the commissioner to terminate the order.
- 25 (9) The commissioner shall mail a copy of any notice or order
- 26 issued under this section to the employer or principal of the
- 27 individual subject to the notice or order.

- 1 (10) Within 30 days after the commissioner has notified the
- 2 parties that the case has been submitted to him or her for final
- 3 decision, the commissioner shall render a decision that includes
- 4 findings of fact supporting the decision and serve on each party to
- 5 the proceeding a copy of the decision and an order consistent with
- 6 the decision.
- 7 (11) Except for a consent order, a party to the proceeding or
- 8 a person affected by an order issued under this section may obtain
- 9 a judicial review of the order. A consent order may be reviewed as
- 10 provided under the administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA
- 11 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328. Except for an order under judicial
- 12 review, the commissioner may terminate or set aside any order. The
- 13 commissioner may terminate or set aside an order under judicial
- 14 review with the permission of the court.
- 15 (12) Unless ordered by the court, the commencement of
- 16 proceedings for judicial review under subsection (11) does not stay
- 17 the commissioner's order.
- 18 (13) The commissioner may apply to the circuit court of Ingham
- 19 county for the enforcement of any outstanding order issued under
- 20 this section.
- 21 (14) Any individual who violates a final order issued under
- 22 this section is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not
- 23 more than \$5,000.00 or imprisonment for not more than 1 year, or
- 24 both.
- 25 (15) As used in this section, "fraud" includes actionable
- 26 fraud, actual or constructive fraud, criminal fraud, extrinsic or
- 27 intrinsic fraud, fraud in the execution, in the inducement, in

- 1 fact, or in law, or any other form of fraud.
- 2 Sec. 29. (1) Each mortgage loan originator must provide to the

- 3 commissioner or be covered by a surety bond that meets the
- 4 requirements of this section.
- 5 (2) If the mortgage loan originator is an employee or
- 6 exclusive agent of a person subject to this act and that person has
- 7 provided the commissioner with a surety bond that satisfies the
- 8 requirements of this section, the commissioner may accept that
- 9 surety bond in lieu of the mortgage loan originator's surety bond
- 10 obligation under subsection (1).
- 11 (3) All of the following apply to a surety bond described in
- **12** subsection (1) or (2):
- 13 (a) A surety bond described in subsection (2) must provide
- 14 coverage for each mortgage loan originator covered by that bond in
- 15 1 of the following amounts:
- 16 (i) If the mortgage loan originator did not close any mortgage
- 17 loans in the preceding calendar year, or the sum of the principal
- 18 amounts of mortgage loans closed by the mortgage loan originator in
- 19 the preceding calendar year is less than \$12,000,000.00, as
- determined by the commissioner, \$10,000.00.
- 21 (ii) If the sum of the principal amounts of mortgage loans
- 22 closed by the mortgage loan originator in the preceding calendar
- 23 year is \$12,000,000.00 or more and less than \$24,000,000.00, as
- 24 determined by the commissioner, \$25,000.00.
- 25 (iii) If the sum of the principal amounts of mortgage loans
- 26 closed by the mortgage loan originator in the preceding calendar
- 27 year is \$24,000,000.00 or more, as determined by the commissioner,

- **1** \$50,000.00.
- 2 (b) The surety bond shall be in a form as prescribed by the

- 3 commissioner.
- 4 (c) The commissioner may promulgate rules with respect to the
- 5 requirements for surety bonds under this section that are necessary
- 6 to accomplish the purposes of this act.
- 7 (4) If an action is commenced on a bond described in this
- 8 section, the commissioner may require the filing of a new bond. If
- 9 there is a recovery in that action, the mortgage loan originator
- 10 shall immediately provide to the commissioner a new surety bond
- 11 that meets the requirements of this section.
- Sec. 31. (1) Except as otherwise provided in section 1512 of
- 13 the SAFE act, 12 USC 1511, the requirements of the freedom of
- 14 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246, or any federal
- 15 law concerning the privacy or confidentiality of any information or
- 16 material provided to the nationwide mortgage licensing system and
- 17 registry, and any privilege arising under federal or state law or
- 18 the rules of any federal or state court concerning that information
- 19 or material shall continue to apply to that information or material
- 20 after the information or material is disclosed to the nationwide
- 21 mortgage licensing system and registry. Any information or material
- 22 described in this section may be shared with any state and federal
- 23 regulatory official with mortgage industry oversight authority
- 24 without the loss of privilege or the loss of confidentiality
- 25 protections provided by federal law or the freedom of information
- 26 act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 27 (2) For purposes of this section, the commissioner may enter

1 into agreements or sharing arrangements with other governmental

- 2 agencies, the conference of state bank supervisors, the American
- 3 association of residential mortgage regulators, or other
- 4 associations representing governmental agencies, as established by
- 5 rule or order of the commissioner.
- 6 (3) Any information or material that is subject to a privilege
- 7 or confidentiality under subsection (1) shall not be subject to any
- 8 of the following:
- 9 (a) Disclosure under any federal or state law governing the
- 10 disclosure to the public of information held by an officer or an
- 11 agency of the federal government or the respective state.
- 12 (b) Subpoena or discovery, or admission into evidence, in any
- 13 private civil action or administrative process, unless with respect
- 14 to any privilege held by the nationwide mortgage licensing system
- 15 and registry with respect to the information or material, the
- 16 person to which the information or material pertains waives, in
- 17 whole or in part, in that person's discretion, that privilege.
- 18 (4) This section does not apply to any information or material
- 19 relating to the employment history of, and publicly adjudicated
- 20 disciplinary and enforcement actions against, a mortgage loan
- 21 originator that is included in the nationwide mortgage licensing
- 22 system and registry for access by the public.
- 23 Sec. 33. (1) In addition to any authority provided under this
- 24 act, the commissioner may conduct any of the following
- 25 investigations and examinations:
- (a) For purposes of initial licensing, license renewal,
- 27 license suspension, license conditioning, license revocation or

1 termination, or general or specific inquiry or investigation to

- 2 determine compliance with this act, the commissioner may access,

- 15 (b) Enter into agreements or relationships with other
- 16 government officials or regulatory associations in order to improve
- 17 efficiencies and reduce regulatory burden by sharing resources,
- 18 standardized or uniform methods or procedures, and documents,
- 19 records, information, or evidence obtained under this section.
- 20 (c) Use, hire, contract, or employ public or privately
- 21 available analytical systems, methods, or software to examine or
- 22 investigate a licensed mortgage loan originator or other person
- 23 subject to this act.
- 24 (d) Accept and rely on examination or investigation reports
- 25 made by other state or federal government officials.
- 26 (e) Accept audit reports prepared by an independent certified
- 27 public accountant for the licensed mortgage loan originator or

- 1 other person subject to this act in the course of that part of the
- 2 examination covering the same general subject matter as the audit
- 3 and incorporate the audit report in the report of the examination,
- 4 report of investigation, or other writing of the commissioner.
- 5 (7) The commissioner's authority under this section remains in
- 6 effect whether a licensed mortgage loan originator or other person
- 7 subject to this act acts or claims to act under any licensing or
- 8 registration law of this state or claims to act without that
- 9 authority.
- 10 (8) A licensed mortgage loan originator or other person
- 11 subject to investigation or examination under this section shall
- 12 not knowingly withhold, abstract, remove, mutilate, destroy, or
- 13 secrete any books, records, computer records, or other information
- 14 from the commissioner.
- 15 Sec. 35. A licensed mortgage loan originator shall not do any
- 16 of the following:
- 17 (a) Engage in fraud, deceit, or material misrepresentation in
- 18 connection with any transaction governed by this act.
- 19 (b) Intentionally, or due to gross or wanton negligence,
- 20 repeatedly fail to provide borrowers with any material disclosures
- 21 of information required by law.
- (c) Directly or indirectly make a false, misleading, or
- 23 deceptive advertisement regarding mortgage loans or the
- 24 availability of mortgage loans.
- 25 (d) Suppress or withhold from the commissioner any information
- 26 that he or she possesses and that, if submitted, would have made
- 27 him or her ineligible for licensure or license renewal under this

- 1 act at the time of application and would have allowed the
- 2 commissioner to refuse to license him or her.
- 3 (e) Be convicted of, or plead no contest to, any of the
- 4 following:
- 5 (i) A misdemeanor involving fraud, dishonesty, or a breach of

- 6 trust, money laundering, embezzlement, forgery, a financial
- 7 transaction, or securities.
- 8 (ii) A felony.
- 9 (f) Refuse or fail to furnish any information or make any
- 10 report required by the commissioner to issue or renew a license
- 11 under this act, or otherwise required by the commissioner, within a
- 12 reasonable period of time, as determined by the commissioner, after
- 13 requested by the commissioner.
- 14 Sec. 37. A licensed mortgage loan originator, or employer or
- 15 principal of a licensed mortgage loan originator on his or her
- 16 behalf, shall submit to the nationwide mortgage licensing system
- 17 and registry reports of condition. The reports of condition shall
- 18 be in the form and shall contain the information required by the
- 19 nationwide mortgage licensing system and registry.
- Sec. 39. (1) Subject to section 31, the commissioner shall
- 21 regularly report violations of this act, and enforcement actions
- 22 and other relevant information, to the nationwide mortgage
- 23 licensing system and registry.
- 24 (2) The commissioner shall comply with the administrative
- 25 procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to 24.328, in
- 26 promulgating any rules under this act.
- 27 Sec. 41. The unique identifier of any person originating a

- 1 residential mortgage loan in this state shall be clearly shown on
- 2 all residential mortgage loan application forms, solicitations, or
- 3 advertisements, including business cards or websites, and any other
- 4 documents, as established by rule or order of the commissioner.
- 5 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect July 31, 2009.
- 6 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless all
