

SENATE BILL No. 812

September 15, 2009, Introduced by Senators GEORGE and McMANUS and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 2008 PA 398, entitled
"Michigan supply chain management development commission act,"
by amending section 3 (MCL 125.1893).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan supply chain management development
2 commission is created within the department of treasury.

3 (2) The commission shall create a road map for attracting,
4 supporting, marketing, and growing the international trade, supply
5 chain, and logistics industries by advising on the development and
6 coordination of state transportation and economic development
7 policies. Based upon an inventory of industry needs and state
8 strengths and an economic multiplier impact analysis, the
9 commission shall study and design programs to provide incentives

1 and otherwise support these growth industries through workforce
2 development, tax incentives, recruitment, marketing, and other
3 activities.

4 (3) The commission shall be made up of the following members:

5 (a) The president of the Michigan strategic fund.

6 (b) The director of the state transportation department.

7 (c) The director of the department of ~~environmental quality~~

8 **NATURAL RESOURCES.**

9 (d) The state treasurer.

10 (e) Two individuals who are residents of this state and who
11 live within 1 mile of an international border crossing, airport,
12 rail yard, intermodal facility, port, or other major transportation
13 infrastructure that has significant impacts on the local
14 residential community, appointed by the governor from a list of 4
15 or more individuals selected by the senate majority leader.

16 (f) Two individuals who are residents of this state and who
17 live within 1 mile of an international border crossing, airport,
18 rail yard, intermodal facility, port, or other major transportation
19 infrastructure that has significant impacts on the local
20 residential community, appointed by the governor from a list of 4
21 or more individuals selected by the speaker of the house of
22 representatives.

23 (g) Seven individuals appointed by the governor who have
24 education in, experience with, or knowledge of supply chain
25 management and logistics, including, but not limited to,
26 individuals representing commerce, transportation, border
27 operators, warehousing, local economic development agencies, and

1 institutions of higher learning.

2 (4) A member of the commission shall not receive compensation
3 for services as a member of the commission, but the commission may
4 reimburse each member of the commission for expenses necessarily
5 incurred in the performance of his or her duties.

6 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
7 unless Senate Bill No. 807

8 of the 95th Legislature is enacted into law.
