SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 1284

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," (MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1280d.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1280D. (1) IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY
- OPERATES A SCHOOL THAT IS IDENTIFIED UNDER SECTION 1280C AS BEING
- 3 AMONG THE LOWEST ACHIEVING 5% OF ALL PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN THIS STATE,
- 4 IF A COMPREHENSIVE NEEDS ASSESSMENT CONDUCTED UNDER SECTION 1280C
- 5 IDENTIFIES A LACK OF AN EFFECTIVE EARLY INTERVENTION PROGRAM AS 1
- 6 OF THE PRIMARY REASONS FOR LOW PUPIL ACHIEVEMENT, AND IF THE SCHOOL
- 7 IS OPERATING UNDER THE TRANSFORMATIONAL MODEL, TURNAROUND MODEL, OR
- 8 RESTART MODEL UNDER SECTION 1280C, THEN THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR
- 9 PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY IS STRONGLY ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP AND
- 10 IMPLEMENT A PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSES OF PROVIDING ENHANCED

- 1 INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES, PERIODIC SCREENINGS, AND EARLY INTERVENTION
- 2 AND SUPPORTS AS DESCRIBED IN THIS SECTION; IMPROVING THE LITERACY
- 3 AND NUMERACY SKILLS OF STUDENTS IN GRADES K TO 3 SO THAT THEY ARE
- 4 READING AT GRADE LEVEL AS SOON AS POSSIBLE; AND PREVENTING
- 5 INAPPROPRIATE OR UNNECESSARY REFERRALS TO SPECIAL EDUCATION
- 6 SERVICES. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL
- 7 IMPLEMENT THIS PROGRAM NOT LATER THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2010-
- 8 2011 SCHOOL YEAR.
- 9 (2) A PROGRAM PROVIDED UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL MEET ALL OF
- 10 THE FOLLOWING:
- 11 (A) SHALL PROVIDE IN EACH ELEMENTARY SCHOOL A COMPREHENSIVE
- 12 LITERACY AND NUMERACY CURRICULUM THAT IS DESIGNED TO MEET GRADE
- 13 LEVEL BENCHMARKS, AS MEASURED BY A SCIENTIFICALLY RESEARCH-BASED
- 14 UNIVERSAL SCREENING TOOL THAT IS PROVEN RELIABLE AND VALID.
- 15 (B) SHALL BE DESIGNED TO INCLUDE ACTIVE AND CONTINUOUS
- 16 INVOLVEMENT OF THE PARENTS OR GUARDIANS OF THE PUPILS PARTICIPATING
- 17 IN THE PROGRAM.
- 18 (C) SHALL PROVIDE ALL PUPILS IN GRADES K TO 3 IN THE
- 19 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL WITH LITERACY AND NUMERACY INSTRUCTION EVERY
- 20 SCHOOL DAY IN WHICH IT IS PRACTICABLE TO DO SO USING A CORE
- 21 COMPREHENSIVE LITERACY OR NUMERACY PROGRAM THAT IS SCIENTIFICALLY
- 22 RESEARCH-BASED. THE LITERACY INSTRUCTION MUST INCLUDE LEARNER-
- 23 APPROPRIATE TOOLS SUCH AS PHONEMIC AWARENESS, PHONICS, FLUENCY,
- 24 VOCABULARY, AND COMPREHENSION, AND ORAL LANGUAGE AND WRITING.
- 25 (D) SHALL REGULARLY MEASURE PUPILS' SPECIFIC AND ESSENTIAL
- 26 LITERACY AND NUMERACY SKILLS IN ALL OF GRADES K TO 3 IN THE
- 27 ELEMENTARY SCHOOL. SCREENINGS SHALL BE CONDUCTED SCHOOLWIDE ON AN

- 1 ONGOING BASIS EACH SCHOOL YEAR IN EACH OF GRADES K TO 3, USING A
- 2 SCIENTIFICALLY RESEARCH-BASED UNIVERSAL SCREENING TOOL THAT IS
- 3 PROVEN RELIABLE AND VALID AND THAT PROVIDES TEACHERS WITH STUDENT-
- 4 SPECIFIC DATA TO PLAN INSTRUCTION.
- 5 (E) IF A PUPIL IS DETERMINED BY THE SCREENING UNDER
- 6 SUBDIVISION (D) TO NEED INTERVENTION, THEN THE PROGRAM SHALL
- 7 PROVIDE THE PUPIL WITH LITERACY OR NUMERACY INSTRUCTION EACH SCHOOL
- 8 DAY IN ADDITION TO THE INSTRUCTION REQUIRED UNDER SUBDIVISION (C).
- 9 IF A PUPIL IS DETERMINED TO NEED ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTION, THE
- 10 PUPIL'S PROGRESS SHALL BE MONITORED AT LEAST EVERY 6 WEEKS. DATA
- 11 FROM THIS PROGRESS MONITORING SHALL BE USED TO ADJUST INSTRUCTION
- 12 FOR THE PUPIL.
- 13 (F) IF A PUPIL IN GRADES K TO 3 HAS BEEN DETERMINED TO NOT
- 14 MEET APPLICABLE ESSENTIAL LITERACY OR NUMERACY GRADE LEVEL
- 15 BENCHMARKS FOR HIS OR HER GRADE LEVEL, THEN BY THE END OF THE FIRST
- 16 SEMESTER OR TRIMESTER, OR AS EARLY AS IS PRACTICABLE FOR PARENTS TO
- 17 ASSIST IN THE PUPIL'S ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT, WHICHEVER IS EARLIER,
- 18 THE PROGRAM SHALL PROVIDE FOR A WRITTEN NOTICE TO THE PUPIL'S
- 19 PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN. BEGINNING IN THE 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR,
- 20 THIS SUBDIVISION APPLIES TO PUPILS IN GRADES K TO 4. BEGINNING IN
- 21 THE 2014-2015 SCHOOL YEAR, THIS SUBDIVISION ALSO APPLIES TO PUPILS
- 22 IN GRADE 7. THE NOTICE SHALL INCLUDE ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 23 (i) NOTIFICATION THAT THE PUPIL'S SCHOOL HAS DETERMINED THAT
- 24 THE CHILD HAS FAILED TO MEET SPECIFIC AND ESSENTIAL GRADE LEVEL
- 25 BENCHMARKS IN ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS OR MATHEMATICS APPROVED BY THE
- 26 DEPARTMENT FOR THE PUPIL'S GRADE LEVEL.
- 27 (ii) NOTIFICATION AS TO THE ROLE THE PARENT OR GUARDIAN CAN

- 1 PLAY AT HOME TO IMPROVE THE PUPIL'S LITERACY AND NUMERACY SKILLS,
- 2 INCLUDING AT LEAST ADDITIONAL ASSISTANCE THAT THE PARENT OR
- 3 GUARDIAN CAN GIVE TO THE PUPIL AND A DESCRIPTION OF VARIED
- 4 APPROACHES TO COMPLETING HOMEWORK OR EXTRA PRACTICE IN ORDER TO
- 5 HELP RAISE THE READING OR NUMERACY SKILL LEVEL OF THE PUPIL.
- 6 (G) THE PROGRAM SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 7 (i) BEGINNING IN THE 2011-2012 SCHOOL YEAR, ADMINISTER A
- 8 SCIENTIFICALLY RESEARCH-BASED UNIVERSAL SCREENING TOOL THAT IS
- 9 PROVEN RELIABLE AND VALID AT THE END OF GRADE 4 TO IDENTIFY PUPILS
- 10 WHO REQUIRE ADDITIONAL LITERACY OR NUMERACY INTERVENTION. AN
- 11 EVALUATOR SHALL ALSO CONSIDER THE PUPIL'S ASSESSMENT SCORES ON THE
- 12 MICHIGAN EDUCATION ASSESSMENT PROGRAM ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AND
- 13 MATHEMATICS ASSESSMENTS, THE PUPIL'S GRADE POINT AVERAGE IF
- 14 APPLICABLE, AND THE PUPIL'S ATTENDANCE AND WORK HABITS INCLUDING
- 15 BEGINNING AND COMPLETING WORK ON TIME AND FOLLOWING DIRECTIONS.
- 16 (ii) BEGINNING IN THE 2014-2015 SCHOOL YEAR, ADMINISTER A
- 17 SCIENTIFICALLY RESEARCH-BASED UNIVERSAL SCREENING TOOL THAT IS
- 18 PROVEN RELIABLE AND VALID AT THE END OF GRADE 7 TO IDENTIFY PUPILS
- 19 WHO REQUIRE ADDITIONAL LITERACY OR NUMERACY INTERVENTION. AN
- 20 EVALUATOR SHALL ALSO CONSIDER THE PUPIL'S ASSESSMENT SCORES ON THE
- 21 MICHIGAN EDUCATION ASSESSMENT PROGRAM ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS AND
- 22 MATHEMATICS ASSESSMENTS, THE PUPIL'S GRADE POINT AVERAGE IF
- 23 APPLICABLE, AND THE PUPIL'S ATTENDANCE AND WORK HABITS INCLUDING
- 24 BEGINNING AND COMPLETING WORK ON TIME AND FOLLOWING DIRECTIONS.
- 25 (iii) IF A PUPIL IS DETERMINED BY THE SCREENING UNDER
- 26 SUBPARAGRAPH (i) OR (ii) TO NEED INTERVENTION, THEN THE PROGRAM SHALL
- 27 PROVIDE THE PUPIL WITH LITERACY OR NUMERACY INTERVENTION AND

- 1 SUPPORTS IN GRADE 5 OR 8, AS APPLICABLE, IN ADDITION TO THE PUPIL'S
- 2 REGULAR LITERACY AND NUMERACY INSTRUCTION. THE ADDITIONAL LITERACY
- 3 INSTRUCTION SHALL TEACH VOCABULARY, COMPREHENSION, AND WRITING
- 4 SKILLS THAT MAY BE USED FOR ALL CONTENT AREAS BASED ON GRADE LEVEL
- 5 BENCHMARKS. THE ADDITIONAL LITERACY OR NUMERACY INSTRUCTION SHALL
- 6 BE PROVIDED EITHER AS AN ADDITIONAL SEPARATE CLASS OR SUBJECT OR
- 7 OUTSIDE REGULAR SCHOOL HOURS. IF A PUPIL IS DETERMINED TO NEED
- 8 ADDITIONAL INSTRUCTION, THE PUPIL'S PROGRESS SHALL BE MONITORED AT
- 9 LEAST EVERY 6 WEEKS. DATA FROM THIS PROGRESS MONITORING SHALL BE
- 10 USED TO ADJUST INSTRUCTION FOR THE PUPIL. IN ADDITION, A SCHOOL
- 11 DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL INCLUDE IN ITS INTERVENTION
- 12 PROGRAMS FOR GRADES 5 AND 8 INITIATIVES TO IMPROVE PUPILS'
- 13 CLASSROOM BEHAVIOR AND SOCIAL SKILLS, INCLUDING AT LEAST ALL OF THE
- 14 FOLLOWING INITIATIVES:
- 15 (A) USE OF ADULT ADVOCATES OR OTHER ENGAGED ADULTS TO HELP
- 16 PUPILS ESTABLISH ATTAINABLE ACADEMIC AND BEHAVIORAL GOALS WITH
- 17 SPECIFIC BENCHMARKS.
- 18 (B) RECOGNITION OF PUPIL ACCOMPLISHMENTS.
- 19 (C) TEACHING OF STRATEGIES TO STRENGTHEN PROBLEM-SOLVING AND
- 20 DECISION-MAKING SKILLS.
- 21 (D) ESTABLISHMENT OF PARTNERSHIPS AS NECESSARY WITH COMMUNITY-
- 22 BASED PROGRAM PROVIDERS AND OTHER AGENCIES SUCH AS SOCIAL SERVICES,
- 23 FAMILY ASSISTANCE, MENTAL HEALTH, AND LAW ENFORCEMENT.
- 24 (3) IN ADDITION TO THE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS UNDER SUBSECTION
- 25 (2), A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY THAT CHOOSES TO
- 26 COMPLY WITH THIS SECTION SHALL IMPLEMENT THE FOLLOWING INITIATIVES
- 27 NOT LATER THAN THE BEGINNING OF THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR TO

- 1 COMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM UNDER SUBSECTION (2):
- 2 (A) IN THE MIDDLE SCHOOL GRADES, BOTH OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 3 (i) PROVIDING TEACHERS WITH ONGOING WAYS TO EXPAND THEIR
- 4 KNOWLEDGE AND IMPROVE THEIR SKILLS.
- 5 (ii) INTEGRATION OF ACADEMIC CONTENT WITH CAREER- AND SKILL-
- 6 BASED THEMES THROUGH CAREER ACADEMIES OR MULTIPLE PATHWAYS MODELS.
- 7 (B) IN THE HIGH SCHOOL GRADES, ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 8 (i) HOSTING CAREER DAYS AND OFFERING OPPORTUNITIES FOR WORK-
- 9 RELATED EXPERIENCES AND VISITS TO POSTSECONDARY CAMPUSES.
- 10 (ii) PROVIDING PUPILS WITH EXTRA ASSISTANCE AND INFORMATION
- 11 ABOUT THE DEMANDS OF COLLEGE.
- 12 (iii) PARTNERING WITH LOCAL BUSINESSES TO PROVIDE OPPORTUNITIES
- 13 FOR WORK-RELATED EXPERIENCE SUCH AS INTERNSHIPS, SIMULATED JOB
- 14 INTERVIEWS, OR LONG-TERM EMPLOYMENT.
- 15 (iv) ASSIGNING ADULT ADVOCATES TO PUPILS AT RISK OF DROPPING
- 16 OUT. ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO THIS INITIATIVE:
- 17 (A) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL CHOOSE
- 18 ADULTS WHO ARE COMMITTED TO INVESTING IN THE PUPIL'S PERSONAL AND
- 19 ACADEMIC SUCCESS, SHALL KEEP CASELOADS FOR THE ADULTS LOW, AND
- 20 SHALL PURPOSEFULLY MATCH SPECIFIC PUPILS WITH A SPECIFIC ADULT
- 21 ADVOCATE.
- 22 (B) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL
- 23 ESTABLISH A REGULAR TIME IN THE SCHOOL DAY OR SCHOOL WEEK FOR A
- 24 PUPIL TO MEET WITH THE ADULT ADVOCATE.
- 25 (C) THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL
- 26 COMMUNICATE WITH THE ADULT ADVOCATES ABOUT THE VARIOUS OBSTACLES
- 27 PUPILS MAY ENCOUNTER AND PROVIDE THE ADULT ADVOCATES WITH GUIDANCE

- 12 LEVELS ARE ACHIEVING AT LEAST A LEVEL 2 PROFICIENCY ON THE ENGLISH
- 13 LANGUAGE ARTS AND MATHEMATICS ASSESSMENTS ADMINISTERED UNDER THE
- 14 MICHIGAN EDUCATION ASSESSMENT PROGRAM.
