HOUSE BILL No. 4096

January 22, 2009, Introduced by Rep. LeBlanc and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1966 PA 189, entitled

"An act to provide procedures for making complaints for, obtaining, executing and returning search warrants; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending sections 1, 2, and 4 (MCL 780.651, 780.652, and 780.654), section 1 as amended by 2003 PA 185 and section 4 as amended by 2002 PA 112.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. (1) When an affidavit is made on oath to a magistrate
- 2 authorized to issue warrants in criminal cases, and the affidavit
- 3 establishes grounds for issuing a warrant under this act, the
- 4 magistrate, if he or she is satisfied that there is probable cause
- 5 for the search, shall issue a warrant to search the house,
- 6 building, or other location or place where the PERSON, property, or
 - thing to be searched for and seized is situated.

- 1 (2) An affidavit for a search warrant may be made by any
- 2 electronic or electromagnetic means of communication, including by
- 3 facsimile or over a computer network, if both of the following
- 4 occur:
- 5 (a) The judge or district court magistrate orally administers
- 6 the oath or affirmation to an applicant for a search warrant who
- 7 submits an affidavit under this subsection.
- 8 (b) The affiant signs the affidavit. Proof that the affiant
- 9 has signed the affidavit may consist of an electronically or
- 10 electromagnetically transmitted facsimile of the signed affidavit
- 11 or an electronic signature on an affidavit transmitted over a
- 12 computer network.
- 13 (3) A judge or district court magistrate may issue a written
- 14 search warrant in person or by any electronic or electromagnetic
- 15 means of communication, including by facsimile or over a computer
- 16 network.
- 17 (4) The peace officer or department receiving an
- 18 electronically or electromagnetically issued search warrant shall
- 19 receive proof that the issuing judge or district court magistrate
- 20 has signed the warrant before the warrant is executed. Proof that
- 21 the issuing judge or district court magistrate has signed the
- warrant may consist of an electronically or electromagnetically
- 23 transmitted facsimile of the signed warrant or an electronic
- 24 signature on a warrant transmitted over a computer network.
- 25 (5) If an oath or affirmation is orally administered by
- 26 electronic or electromagnetic means of communication under this
- 27 section, the oath or affirmation is considered to be administered

- 1 before the judge or district court magistrate.
- 2 (6) If an affidavit for a search warrant is submitted by
- 3 electronic or electromagnetic means of communication, or a search
- 4 warrant is issued by electronic or electromagnetic means of
- 5 communication, the transmitted copies of the affidavit or search
- 6 warrant are duplicate originals of the affidavit or search warrant
- 7 and are not required to contain an impression made by an impression
- 8 seal.
- 9 (7) Except as provided in subsection (8), an affidavit for a
- 10 search warrant contained in any court file or court record
- 11 retention system is nonpublic information.
- 12 (8) On the fifty-sixth day following the issuance of a search
- 13 warrant, the search warrant affidavit contained in any court file
- 14 or court record retention system is public information unless,
- 15 before the fifty-sixth day after the search warrant is issued, a
- 16 peace officer or prosecuting attorney obtains a suppression order
- 17 from a magistrate upon a showing under oath that suppression of the
- 18 affidavit is necessary to protect an ongoing investigation or the
- 19 privacy or safety of a victim or witness. The suppression order may
- 20 be obtained ex parte in the same manner that the search warrant was
- 21 issued. An initial suppression order issued under this subsection
- 22 expires on the fifty-sixth day after the order is issued. A second
- 23 or subsequent suppression order may be obtained in the same manner
- 24 as the initial suppression order and shall expire on a date
- 25 specified in the order. This subsection and subsection (7) do not
- 26 affect a person's right to obtain a copy of a search warrant
- 27 affidavit from the prosecuting attorney or law enforcement agency

- 3 Sec. 2. (1) A warrant may be issued to search for and seize
- 4 any property or other thing which THAT is either 1 OR MORE OF THE
- 5 FOLLOWING:
- 6 (a) Stolen or embezzled in violation of any A law of this
- 7 state.
- 8 (b) Designed and intended for use, or which THAT is or has
- 9 been used, as the means of committing a criminal offense CRIME.
- 10 (c) Possessed, controlled, or used wholly or partially in
- 11 violation of any A law of this state.
- 12 (d) Evidence of crime or criminal conduct. on the part of any
- 13 person.
- 14 (e) Contraband.
- 15 (f) The bodies BODY or persons PERSON of human beings A HUMAN
- 16 BEING or of animals, who AN ANIMAL THAT may be the victims VICTIM
- 17 of a criminal offense CRIME.
- 18 (g) The object of a search warrant under any other ANOTHER law
- 19 of this state providing for the same SEARCH WARRANT. If THERE IS a
- 20 conflict exists between this act and any other ANOTHER search
- 21 warrant law, this act shall be deemed controlling CONTROLS.
- 22 (2) A WARRANT MAY BE ISSUED TO SEARCH FOR AND SEIZE A PERSON
- 23 WHO IS THE SUBJECT OF EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 24 (A) AN ARREST WARRANT FOR THE APPREHENSION OF A PERSON CHARGED
- 25 WITH A CRIME.
- 26 (B) A BENCH WARRANT ISSUED IN A CRIMINAL CASE.
- 27 Sec. 4. (1) A search warrant shall be directed to the sheriff

- 1 or any peace officer, commanding the sheriff or peace officer to
- 2 search the house, building, or other location or place, where any
- 3 THE PERSON, property, or other thing for which the sheriff or peace
- 4 officer is required to search is believed to be concealed. Each
- 5 warrant shall designate and describe the house or building or other
- 6 location or place to be searched and the property or thing to be
- 7 seized.
- 8 (2) The warrant shall either state the grounds or the probable
- 9 or reasonable cause for its issuance or shall have attached to it a
- 10 copy of the affidavit.
- 11 (3) Upon a showing that it is necessary to protect an ongoing
- 12 investigation or the privacy or safety of a victim or witness, the
- 13 magistrate may order that the affidavit be suppressed and not be
- 14 given to the person whose property was seized or whose premises
- 15 were searched until that person is charged with a crime or named as
- 16 a claimant in a civil forfeiture proceeding involving evidence
- 17 seized as a result of the search.
