# **HOUSE BILL No. 4448**

#### EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

February 24, 2009, Introduced by Rep. LeBlanc and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for certain emergency powers; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees.

- 14 Sec. 204. The civil service commission shall bill departments
- 15 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the charges

- 17 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by
- 18 the end of the second fiscal quarter.
- 19 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the
- 20 reporting requirements of this bill. This requirement may include
- 21 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
- 22 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include
- 23 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.
- Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
- 25 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
- 26 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
- 27 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to

- 1 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 2 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
- 3 quality. In addition, preference should be given to goods or
- 4 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
- 5 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are
- 6 competitively priced and of comparable quality.
- 7 Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to
- 8 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
- 9 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
- 10 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department
- 11 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and
- 12 deprived communities for services or supplies, or both.
- Sec. 218. Funds appropriated in part 1 for at-post troopers
- 14 shall only be expended for trooper salaries, wages, benefits,
- 15 retirement, equipment, supplies, and other expenses directly
- 16 related to state troopers assigned to general law enforcement
- 17 duties at a department post, detachment, satellite office, or a
- 18 resident trooper function.
- 19 Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this
- 20 state, out-of-state travel for the fiscal year ending September 30,
- 21 2010 shall be limited to situations in which 1 or more of the
- 22 following conditions apply:
- 23 (a) The travel is required by legal mandate or court order or
- 24 for law enforcement purposes.
- 25 (b) The travel is necessary to protect the health or safety of

- 2 increase state revenues, including protecting existing federal

- 6 (e) The travel is necessary to secure specialized training for
- 7 staff that is not available within this state.
- 8 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate
- 9 funds.
- 10 (2) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department
- 11 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and
- 12 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
- 13 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
- 14 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
- 15 submitted to the senate and house of representatives standing

- 5 Sec. 234. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by a
- 6 principal executive department, state agency, or authority to hire
- 7 a person to provide legal services that are the responsibility of
- 8 the attorney general. This prohibition does not apply to legal
- 9 services for bonding activities and for those activities that the
- 10 attorney general authorizes.
- 11 Sec. 240. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
- 12 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for
- 13 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 14 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 16 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 17 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 18 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state
- 19 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
- 20 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
- 21 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
- 22 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.
- 23 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
- 24 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local

## INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY

- 9 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer
- 10 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of
- 11 the state's service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN.
- 12 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for
- 13 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user
- 14 fees to the department of information technology for technology-
- 15 related services and projects. Such user fees shall be subject to
- 16 provisions of an interagency agreement between the departments and
- 17 agencies and the department of information technology.

## 18 HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING

- 19 Sec. 401. On a bi-annual basis, the department shall report to
- 20 the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police
- 21 and military affairs on the status of assessments collected and
- 22 authorized under section 629e of the Michigan vehicle code, 1949 PA
- 23 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes of supporting the secondary
- 24 road patrol grant program. Each bi-annual report shall contain
- 25 updated information on collection levels, revised projected grant

- 1 allotments to counties for the year, a comparison of projected
- 2 collections and grant distribution levels with the funds
- 3 appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol program, and
- 4 the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed to meet
- 5 appropriated levels for the current fiscal year or expenditure
- 6 levels from the previous fiscal year.

## FORENSIC SCIENCES

- 8 Sec. 501. When changes are made to the department's protocol
- 9 for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and records, the
- 10 department shall distribute an updated copy to every police agency
- 11 in the state.

## 12 MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS

- Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance
- 14 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a
- 15 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state
- 16 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the
- 17 MCOLES.
- 18 Sec. 603. The appropriation in part 1 for mental health
- 19 awareness training and coordination shall be expended for training
- 20 law enforcement officers, mental health practitioners, and other
- 21 criminal justice personnel in effective and safe ways of assisting
- 22 people with mental disorders and directing people with mental
- 23 disorders to treatment programs.
- 24 Sec. 604. From the funds appropriated in part 1 to the
- 25 Michigan commission on law enforcement standards funds may be used

- 1 to provide training for motor carrier officers and capitol security
- 2 officers for the purpose of qualifying them for MCOLES
- 3 certification.

## 4 EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

- 5 Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may
- 6 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency
- 7 or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect
- 8 life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the
- 9 population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims
- 10 a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL
- 11 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390,
- 12 MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management
- 13 may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to
- 14 accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state
- 15 budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all
- 16 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
- 17 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that
- 18 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director
- 19 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the
- 20 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental
- 21 appropriation.
- 22 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the
- 23 department may receive and expend money from local, private,
- 24 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency
- 25 management training to local or private interests and for the
- 26 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,

- 1 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in
- 2 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
- 3 state budget office under this section, the department and the
- 4 state budget office shall notify the house and senate
- 5 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
- 6 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
- 7 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
- 8 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
- 9 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
- 10 authorization.

### POST UNIFORM SERVICES

- 12 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
- 13 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan
- 14 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited
- 15 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency
- 16 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of
- 17 this state from harm.

## 18 STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS

- 19 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is
- 20 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by
- 21 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's
- 22 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to
- 23 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
