## **HOUSE BILL No. 4875**

May 5, 2009, Introduced by Rep. Haines and referred to the Committee on Tourism, Outdoor Recreation and Natural Resources.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending sections 2030, 2035, 74101, 74116, 74117, 74118, 74122,
74123, and 78105 (MCL 324.2030, 324.2035, 324.74101, 324.74116,
324.74117, 324.74118, 324.74122, 324.74123, and 324.78105),
sections 2030 and 2035 as added and sections 74101, 74122, and
78105 as amended by 2004 PA 587, sections 74116, 74118, and 74123
as added by 1995 PA 58, and section 74117 as amended by 2006 PA
477.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 2030. (1) The state park improvement account is established as an account within the legacy fund.

(2) The state park improvement account shall consist of both

- 1 of the following:
- 2 (a) All money in the state park improvement fund, formerly
- 3 created in section 74108, immediately prior to the effective date
- 4 of the amendatory act that added this section, which money is
- 5 hereby transferred to the state park improvement account.
- 6 (b) Revenue from the following sources:
- 7 (i) Revenue derived from concessions, leases, contracts, fees,
- 8 and, SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (ii), permits from activities in state
- 9 parks and recreation areas.
- 10 (ii) A PORTION OF REVENUE DERIVED FROM THE SALE OF COMBINED
- 11 STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMITS ISSUED UNDER
- 12 SECTION 74117 EQUAL TO THE RATIO OF THE REVENUE DERIVED FROM STATE
- 13 PARK PERMITS UNDER SECTION 74117 IN 2009 TO THE SUM OF THE REVENUE
- 14 DERIVED FROM STATE PARK PERMITS UNDER SECTION 74117 IN 2009 AND
- 15 PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMITS UNDER SECTION 78105 IN 2009.
- 16 (iii) (iii)—Unless otherwise provided by law, damages paid for
- 17 illegal activities in state parks and recreation areas.
- 18 (iv) (iii)—Other revenues as authorized by law.
- 19 (3) Money in the state park improvement account shall be
- 20 expended, upon appropriation, only as provided in part 741 and for
- 21 the administration of the state park improvement account.
- 22 (4) Money in the state park improvement account may be
- 23 expended pursuant to subsection (3) for grants to state colleges
- 24 and universities to implement programs funded by the state park
- 25 improvement account.
- 26 Sec. 2035. (1) The waterways account is established as an
- 27 account within the legacy fund.

- 1 (2) The waterways account shall consist of both of the
- 2 following:
- 3 (a) All money in the Michigan state waterways fund, formerly
- 4 created in section 78110, the Michigan harbor development fund,
- 5 formerly created in section 78110, and the marine safety fund,
- 6 formerly created in section 80115, immediately prior to the
- 7 effective date of the amendatory act that added this section BEFORE
- 8 DECEMBER 23, 2006, which money is hereby transferred to the
- 9 waterways account.
- 10 (b) Revenue from the following sources:
- 11 (i) All revenue generated from watercraft registration fees
- 12 assessed on the ownership or operation of watercraft in the state,
- 13 of which not less than 49% shall be provided for law enforcement
- 14 and education.
- 15 (ii) All revenues derived from fees charged for the moorage of
- 16 watercraft at state-operated mooring facilities.
- 17 (iii) All revenues derived from fees charged for the use of
- 18 state-operated public access sites A PORTION OF REVENUE DERIVED
- 19 FROM THE SALE OF COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 20 PERMITS ISSUED UNDER SECTION 74117 EQUAL TO THE RATIO OF THE
- 21 REVENUE DERIVED FROM PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMITS UNDER
- 22 SECTION 78105 IN 2009 TO THE SUM OF THE REVENUE DERIVED FROM PUBLIC
- 23 BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMITS UNDER SECTION 78105 IN 2009 AND STATE
- 24 PARK PERMITS UNDER SECTION 74117 IN 2009.
- (iv) Transfers from the recreation improvement account.
- 26 (v) All tax revenue derived from the sale of diesel fuel in
- 27 this state that is used to generate power for the operation or

- 1 propulsion of vessels on the waterways of this state.
- 2 (vi) Other revenues as authorized by law.
- 3 (3) Money in the waterways account shall be expended, upon
- 4 appropriation, only as provided in parts 781, 791, and 801 and for
- 5 the administration of the waterways account, which may include
- 6 payments in lieu of taxes on state owned lands purchased through
- 7 the waterways account or through the former Michigan state
- 8 waterways fund.
- 9 Sec. 74101. As used in this part:
- 10 (a) "Committee" means the citizens committee for Michigan
- 11 state parks created in section 74102a.
- 12 (b) "Improvement program" means the construction,
- 13 reconstruction, development, improvement, bettering, operating,
- 14 maintaining, and extending a facility at a state park, including a
- 15 site improvement, impoundment, road and parking lot, toilet
- 16 building, concession building, shelter building, bathhouse,
- 17 utility, outdoor center, visitor service facility, ski area, ski
- 18 tow, ski shelter, and administration unit.
- 19 (c) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle that is self-propelled.
- 20 (d) "State park" means a state park or state recreation area
- 21 designated by the director.
- (e) "State park improvement account" means the state park
- 23 improvement account of the Michigan conservation and recreation
- 24 legacy fund provided for in section 2030.
- 25 (f) "State park revenues" means all revenues collected for
- 26 state parks, including but not limited to , motor vehicle permits,
- 27 concession fees, nonmotorized trail permits, fees, leases, camping

- 1 fees, THE FOLLOWING:
- 2 (i) A PORTION OF REVENUE DESCRIBED IN SECTION 2030 DERIVED FROM
- 3 THE SALE OF COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 4 PERMITS ISSUED UNDER SECTION 74117.
- 5 (ii) CONCESSION, CAMPING, NONMOTORIZED TRAIL PERMIT, AND OTHER
- 6 FEES.
- 7 (iii) RENT.
- 8 (iv) REVENUE FROM sale of farm animals from Maybury state park.
- 9 , donations,
- 10 (v) DONATIONS and gifts.
- 11 Sec. 74116. The department shall designate the state parks in
- 12 which a park combined state park and public boating access site
- 13 permit is required for lawful entry by motor vehicle. The
- 14 department shall designate only those parks in which state
- 15 facilities and services are provided for the public. The department
- 16 may designate portions of state parks where a park-COMBINED STATE
- 17 PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit is not necessary. The
- 18 department shall post signs at designated parks or designated
- 19 portions of parks that state that a motor vehicle park COMBINED
- 20 STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit is required. A
- 21 person shall not enter any state park or portion of a state park in
- 22 which a motor vehicle park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING
- 23 ACCESS SITE permit is required without a valid motor vehicle
- 24 COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit affixed
- 25 to the vehicle. A valid park permit procured pursuant to COMBINED
- 26 STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMIT ISSUED UNDER
- 27 section 74117 shall be permanently affixed to the lower right-hand

- 1 corner of the windshield of any motor vehicle entering a state park
- 2 or portion of a state park in which a motor vehicle park THE permit
- 3 is required, except that a park THE permit is not required to be
- 4 affixed to a motor vehicle while the motor vehicle is being driven
- 5 or parked within an established federal, state, or county highway
- 6 within a state park. The requirement to obtain a motor vehicle park
- 7 COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit does not
- 8 apply to motor vehicles used in the operation or maintenance of
- 9 state parks, to emergency vehicles, or to state-owned or law
- 10 enforcement motor vehicles or private motor vehicles being operated
- 11 on official state business.
- Sec. 74117. (1) The department may require park permits and
- 13 collect park permit fees for entry into a state park or portion of
- 14 a state park posted in the manner prescribed by this part. The
- 15 department may waive the COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING
- 16 ACCESS SITE permit requirement UNDER SECTION 74116 for department-
- 17 sponsored events or other circumstances as determined by the
- 18 director or the director's designee. The department shall prepare
- 19 and distribute park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS
- 20 SITE permits to implement this part.
- 21 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this section, an annual
- 22 park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit
- 23 shall be issued and shall authorize the entry of the motor vehicle
- 24 to which it is originally attached within the confines of any state
- 25 park or recreation area during the calendar year for which it is
- 26 issued. The fee for the annual park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 27 BOATING ACCESS SITE permit is as follows:

- 1 (a) Until January 1, 2010—2012, for the owner of a resident
- 2 motor vehicle, \$24.00, except as follows:
- 3 (i) The fee for the owner of a resident motor vehicle who is 65
- 4 years of age or older is \$6.00.
- 5 (ii) The fee for the owner of a resident motor vehicle who, at
- 6 the time of purchase, is in possession of a food stamp card and
- 7 personal identification is \$18.00.
- 8 (b) Until January 1, <del>2010</del> **2012**, for the owner of a nonresident
- **9** motor vehicle, \$29.00.
- 10 (3) A daily COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 11 permit, valid for 1 day only, shall authorize the entry of the
- 12 motor vehicle to which it is originally attached within the
- 13 confines of a state park during the day for which it is issued. The
- 14 fee for a daily COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 15 permit is as follows:
- 16 (a) Until January 1, <del>2010</del> **2012**, for the owner of a resident
- **17** motor vehicle, \$6.00.
- 18 (b) Until January 1, 2010—2012, for the owner of a nonresident
- **19** motor vehicle, \$8.00.
- 20 (4) A person who has obtained an annual motor vehicle COMBINED
- 21 STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit under this section
- 22 for a recreational vehicle to be used as a stationary primary
- 23 camping shelter camped legally in and not moved from a state park
- 24 campground during the period of the camping stay may obtain a
- 25 duplicate motor vehicle—COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING
- 26 ACCESS SITE permit for a towed second motor vehicle present at the
- 27 time of entry for a fee of \$6.00 effective for the duration of THE

- 1 camping stay.
- 2 (5) The department shall provide to the standing committees in
- 3 the senate and house of representatives along with the appropriate
- 4 budget subcommittees that primarily consider issues pertaining to
- 5 natural resources an annual report that details the revenue stream
- 6 generated by the fee structure under this section. This report
- 7 shall be presented not later than December 31 each year and shall
- 8 include information on the impact of the revenue stream on the
- 9 Michigan state parks endowment fund created in section 35a of
- 10 article IX of the state constitution of 1963 and provided for in
- 11 section 74119, the use of the general fund for funding the state
- 12 park system, and other relevant issues that impact AFFECT funding
- 13 needs for the state park system.
- 14 (6) This part applies only to the entry of motor vehicles into
- 15 the state parks and to the park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 16 BOATING ACCESS SITE permits authorized in this part and does not
- 17 obviate the necessity of obtaining additional permits for special
- 18 services or park privileges as previously or subsequently may be
- 19 required by law or by rules promulgated by the department. The
- 20 department shall designate each person in the state authorized to
- 21 sell park—COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 22 permits and shall require as a condition of the designation that a
- 23 surety bond be furnished in an amount and in a form and with the A
- 24 surety as is acceptable to the department. After being designated
- 25 by the department, a person may issue park COMBINED STATE PARK AND
- 26 PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permits in accordance with UNDER this
- **27** part.

- 1 (7) Commercial motor coaches or vans with a capacity of more
- 2 than 12 passengers are not eligible to enter a state park with an
- 3 annual park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 4 permit. Until January 1, 2010-2012, the daily fee to allow
- 5 commercial motor coaches or vans with a capacity of over 12
- 6 passengers daily entry into a state park is \$15.00.
- 7 (8) The department may add to the cost of a reservation, or a
- 8 motor vehicle entrance or TO A COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 9 BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMIT FEE, OR TO A camping fee the charges
- 10 that the state incurs because of the use of a credit card.
- 11 (9) If a person's annual park—COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 12 BOATING ACCESS SITE permit is lost or destroyed, the department
- 13 shall provide that person with a replacement park permit free of
- 14 charge. The department may require a person requesting a
- 15 replacement park permit to supply sufficient evidence of the loss
- 16 or destruction of the original park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 17 BOATING ACCESS SITE permit.
- 18 (10) It is the intent of the legislature that if, on September
- 19 30 of any state fiscal year, the amount of money in the
- 20 countercyclical budget and economic stabilization fund created in
- 21 section 351 of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431, MCL
- 22 18.1351, exceeds \$250,000,000.00, then general fund/general purpose
- 23 support for state parks operations for the following state fiscal
- 24 year shall be equal to or exceed 50% of the revenues generated by
- 25 motor vehicle entrance COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING
- 26 ACCESS SITE PERMIT fees under this section during the previous
- 27 state fiscal year.

- 1 (11) As used in this section, "resident motor vehicle" means a
- 2 vehicle that is registered as a motor vehicle in this state.
- 3 Sec. 74118. On or before the tenth day of every month, all
- 4 persons authorized to sell park—COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 5 BOATING ACCESS SITE permits shall pay to the department all money
- 6 received from the sale of park THE COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 7 BOATING ACCESS SITE permits for the preceding month. Any person who
- 8 refuses or neglects to pay the money as provided in this section,
- 9 in addition to other penalties provided by law, forfeits the right
- 10 to sell park—COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 11 permits. All persons authorized to sell park COMBINED STATE PARK
- 12 AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permits, except employees of the
- 13 department who receive a regular salary from the state, may charge
- 14 the purchaser as compensation 15 cents additional for each annual
- 15 park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit and
- 16 10 cents additional for each daily park COMBINED STATE PARK AND
- 17 PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit issued. On or before February 15
- 18 of each year, a complete report of all COMBINED STATE PARK AND
- 19 PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permits sold during the previous
- 20 calendar year shall be filed with the department by each person
- 21 authorized to sell park—THE permits, and all unsold park—COMBINED
- 22 STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permits for the previous
- 23 year shall be returned to the department.
- 24 Sec. 74122. (1) A person who violates this part or a rule
- 25 promulgated under this part is guilty of a misdemeanor. In any
- 26 proceeding for the violation of this part or a rule promulgated
- 27 under this part, where IF a motor vehicle without the required park

- 1 COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit affixed
- 2 is found parked in any state park, the registration plate displayed
- 3 on the motor vehicle constitutes prima facie evidence that the
- 4 owner of the motor vehicle was the person who parked or placed it
- 5 at the location where it was found.
- 6 (2) In addition to the penalties provided for in subsection
- 7 (1), a person convicted of an act of vandalism shall reimburse the
- 8 department up to 3 times the amount of the damage as determined by
- 9 the court. All money collected pursuant to this subsection shall be
- 10 credited to the state park improvement account.
- 11 Sec. 74123. The department may establish a fine for failure to
- 12 purchase a park COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE
- 13 permit which REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 74116. THE FINE shall be twice
- 14 the cost of a motor vehicle entrance AN ANNUAL COMBINED STATE PARK
- 15 AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE permit or daily permit as
- 16 established by this part or by the department.
- 17 Sec. 78105. (1) The department shall have HAS the following
- 18 powers and duties:
- 19 (a) To acquire, construct, and maintain harbors, channels, and
- 20 facilities for vessels in the navigable waters lying within the
- 21 boundaries of the THIS state. of Michigan.
- (b) To acquire, by purchase, lease, gift, or condemnation the
- 23 lands, rights of way, and easements necessary for harbors and
- 24 channels. The FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE department
- 25 shall be considered a state agency under 1911 PA 149, MCL 213.21 to
- 26 213.25. , relative to condemnation by state agencies.
- (c) To acquire, by purchase, lease, gift, or condemnation

- 1 suitable areas on shore for disposal of the material from dredging.
- 2 (d) To enter into any contracts or agreements that may be
- 3 necessary in carrying out this part, including agreements to hold
- 4 and save the United States free from damages due to BECAUSE OF the
- 5 construction and maintenance by the United States of those works
- 6 that the United States undertakes.
- 7 (e) To provide for the granting of concessions within the
- 8 boundaries of harbors, so as to furnish the public gas, oil, food,
- 9 and other facilities.
- 10 (f) To represent the THIS state of Michigan and the governor
- 11 of Michigan in dealings with the chief of engineers of the United
- 12 States army and his or her authorized agents for the purposes set
- 13 forth in this part.
- 14 (g) To charge fees for both seasonal and daily moorage at
- 15 state-operated small craft mooring facilities. All revenues derived
- 16 from this source shall be deposited in the waterways account.
- 17 (h) To charge fees for both daily and seasonal use of state-
- 18 operated public access sites, if the cost of collecting the fees
- 19 will not exceed the revenue derived from the fees for daily and
- 20 seasonal passes. All revenues derived from this source shall be
- 21 deposited in the waterways account. A seasonal pass shall grant the
- 22 permittee the right to enter any state-operated public access site
- 23 without payment of an additional fee.
- 24 (H) (i)—To collect the proceeds from the sale of marine fuel
- 25 at harbors operated by the department. The proceeds from the sales
- 26 shall be credited to the waterways account and used for the
- 27 purchase of marine fuel supplies as may be needed. Any remaining

- 1 revenue from this source not needed for the purchase of marine fuel
- 2 supplies may be expended in the same manner as other funds within
- 3 the waterways account.
- 4 (2) A DAILY OR ANNUAL COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING
- 5 ACCESS SITE PERMIT ISSUED UNDER SECTION 74117 IS REQUIRED FOR USE
- 6 OF STATE-OPERATED PUBLIC ACCESS SITES. A PORTION OF REVENUE
- 7 DESCRIBED IN SECTION 2035 DERIVED FROM THE SALE OF COMBINED STATE
- 8 PARK AND PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMITS SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN
- 9 THE WATERWAYS ACCOUNT. AN ANNUAL COMBINED STATE PARK AND PUBLIC
- 10 BOATING ACCESS SITE PERMIT AUTHORIZES THE PERMITTEE TO ENTER ANY
- 11 STATE-OPERATED PUBLIC BOATING ACCESS SITE WITHOUT PAYMENT OF AN
- 12 ADDITIONAL FEE.
- 13 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect January
- **14** 1, 2010.
