HOUSE BILL No. 5653

December 8, 2009, Introduced by Rep. Genetski and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1990 PA 187, entitled
"The pupil transportation act,"
by amending sections 7, 39, 41, 43, and 70 (MCL 257.1807, 257.1839, 257.1841, 257.1843, and 257.1870), sections 7 and 39 as amended by 2006 PA 107 and sections 41, 43, and 70 as amended by 2006 PA 108.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 7. (1) "School bus" means a motor vehicle with a manufacturer's rated seating capacity of 11 or more passengers, including the driver, used for the transportation of preprimary, primary, or secondary school pupils to or from school or school-related events or a multifunction school activity bus manufactured after September 2, 2003 as defined in 49 CFR 571.3, 49 CFR 571.108,

- 1 and 49 CFR 571.131. SCHOOL BUS INCLUDES A MOTOR VEHICLE WITH A
- 2 MANUFACTURER'S RATED SEATING CAPACITY OF 11 OR MORE PASSENGERS
- 3 INCLUDING THE DRIVER, USED FOR ANY TRANSPORTATION OF ANY SCHOOL
- 4 PUPILS IN THIS STATE IF THE EVENT TO WHICH THE PUPILS ARE BEING
- 5 TRANSPORTED IS APPROVED BY THE ADMINISTRATION OR SCHOOL BOARD OF A
- 6 DISTRICT. School bus does not include a vehicle operated by a
- 7 public transit agency or authority. A vehicle that is not a school
- 8 bus is not subject to this act. For the purposes of this act, a
- 9 parent, or legal guardian transporting his or her child or another
- 10 child with written permission of the other child's parent or legal
- 11 guardian on a school-related event is not subject to this act.
- 12 (2) "Type I school bus" means a school bus with a gross
- vehicle weight rating of more than 10,000 pounds.
- 14 (3) "Type II school bus" means a school bus with a gross
- vehicle rating of 10,000 pounds or less.
- 16 Sec. 39. (1) The department of state police shall inspect each
- 17 AT LEAST 25% OF school bus BUSES annually, and as the department of
- 18 state police determines necessary where school bus defects have
- 19 been found, to determine if the school bus meets the requirements
- 20 of this act and the rules promulgated pursuant to this act. THE
- 21 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PUBLISH THE RESULTS OF THE
- 22 INSPECTIONS ANNUALLY. The department of state police may delegate
- 23 the inspection of school buses to publicly employed CERTIFIED
- 24 SCHOOL BUS inspectors EMPLOYED OR CONTRACTED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT
- 25 if the inspection complies with this section. THE DEPARTMENT OF
- 26 STATE POLICE SHALL DEVELOP TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR INSPECTORS
- 27 EMPLOYED OR CONTRACTED BY THE DISTRICT AND PROVIDE CERTIFICATION

- 1 UPON SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE PROGRAM. THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE
- 2 POLICE SHALL PUBLISH A UNIFORM INSPECTOR MANUAL AND AN INSPECTION
- 3 FORM TO BE USED BY ALL CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTORS.
- 4 (2) Inspection of a school bus may be accomplished at any
- 5 time, at any location, on or off a school site, and as frequently
- 6 as the department of state police OR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, WHICHEVER
- 7 IS APPLICABLE, considers necessary to secure passenger safety. A
- 8 school bus may be rejected by the inspecting state police official
- 9 CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR for further use in transportation of
- 10 passengers if it does not meet the requirements of this act and the
- 11 rules promulgated pursuant to UNDER this act. However, if a school
- 12 bus is determined to be safe for operation even though in
- 13 unsatisfactory condition, the official CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS
- 14 INSPECTOR may determine that not more than 60 days shall be allowed
- 15 to effect a specific repair.
- 16 (3) A person, school, or school bus owner shall not operate or
- 17 permit to be operated a school bus which has not been inspected
- 18 under this section.
- 19 (4) Any public or private entity that owns or uses a school
- 20 bus for pupil transportation shall identify itself to the
- 21 department of state police OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS
- 22 INSPECTOR so an inspection can be scheduled. If an entity has had
- 23 school buses inspected in the previous year, it is considered to
- 24 have identified itself. If an entity stops pupil transportation in
- 25 1 year and restarts pupil transportation in a later year, it must
- 26 identify itself to the department of state police OR THE APPLICABLE
- 27 CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR as requiring inspection before

- 1 restarting pupil transportation. An entity is considered to have
- 2 identified itself by notifying a person of the department of state
- 3 police OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR responsible
- 4 for conducting inspections under this act.
- **5** (5) When an inspection is scheduled by the department of state
- 6 police OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR, an entity
- 7 shall identify to the state police OR THE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS
- 8 inspector all of the school buses that it intends to use for pupil
- 9 transportation in that school year. Any school bus that is not
- 10 submitted for inspection shall be rejected and have a red sticker
- 11 affixed pursuant to section 41.
- 12 (6) The department of state police OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED
- 13 SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR may prohibit the placement and use of any
- 14 device or equipment on a school bus that presents a safety hazard
- 15 to the pupils, driver, or motorists during the loading, unloading,
- 16 or transportation of pupils.
- 17 (7) A school, before establishing a contract with a company
- 18 for school bus services, shall require the company to verify in
- 19 writing that the buses used by the contractor have been inspected
- 20 by the department of state police UNDER THIS SECTION and have
- 21 passed that inspection. The school shall specify in a written
- 22 contract that the contractor will not use any school buses that
- 23 have not been inspected or have failed inspection, and that a
- 24 violation of this provision of the contract will result in
- 25 revocation of the contract. The contract shall specify that the
- 26 contractor shall submit, in writing, the inspection results of its
- 27 entire fleet of buses to the school within 30 days of the

- 1 completion of the department of state police inspection. A school
- 2 shall identify to the department of state police OR THE APPLICABLE
- 3 CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR all of the contractors the school is
- 4 using upon request.
- 5 (8) A CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR EMPLOYED OR CONTRACTED BY
- 6 THE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL ATTEND A TRAINING PROGRAM AT LEAST EVERY
- 7 2 YEARS. A SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR EMPLOYED OR CONTRACTED BY THE
- 8 SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL HOLD AN ASE MEDIUM/HEAVY TRUCK PREVENTATIVE
- 9 MAINTENANCE CERTIFICATION. THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL
- 10 MAINTAIN A LIST OF ALL CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTORS EMPLOYED BY
- 11 THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE POLICE SHALL AUDIT
- 12 ANNUALLY ALL INSPECTION FORMS COMPLETED BY CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS
- 13 INSPECTORS EMPLOYED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT.
- 14 (9) ALL SCHOOLS SHALL INSPECT ALL SCHOOL BUSES IN THIS STATE
- 15 AT LEAST 2 TIMES EACH YEAR. ONE INSPECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED
- 16 BETWEEN JANUARY 1 AND JUNE 30 OF EACH CALENDAR YEAR, AND THE OTHER
- 17 INSPECTION SHALL BE CONDUCTED BETWEEN JULY 1 AND DECEMBER 31 EACH
- 18 CALENDAR YEAR. ALL SCHOOLS SHALL REGISTER EACH SCHOOL BUS WITH THE
- 19 DEPARTMENT. SCHOOLS SHALL ALSO REGISTER SCHOOL BUSES THAT ARE NOT
- 20 CURRENTLY USED AND THAT ARE EXTRACURRICULAR.
- 21 (10) AS USED IN THIS ACT, "CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR"
- 22 MEANS AN INSPECTOR WHO HAS ATTENDED AND SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED OR
- 23 CONTINUED THE TRAINING PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS LISTED IN SUBSECTION
- 24 (8).
- 25 Sec. 41. (1) A school bus may be rejected by the inspecting
- 26 state official CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR for use in
- 27 transporting passengers if it does not meet the requirements of

- 1 this act and the rules promulgated pursuant to UNDER this act.
- 2 (2) A vehicle that is determined by a state police official OR
- 3 THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR to be unsafe for
- 4 further operation as a school bus shall not be used. An unsafe
- 5 vehicle shall have affixed to its windshield, by the state police
- 6 official OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR, a red
- 7 sticker which shall read as follows: "This vehicle may not be
- 8 driven. Utilization of this vehicle is in violation of law.
- 9 {reverse side} Do not remove without State Police authorization."
- 10 The sticker shall remain until the condition is corrected. A school
- 11 bus may be transported to a maintenance facility for repair if the
- 12 school bus driver provides written proof of destination to a state
- 13 police official OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR
- 14 upon request.
- 15 (3) A school bus that is considered to be in unsatisfactory
- 16 condition, but that is safe for operation, shall have affixed to
- 17 its windshield by the state police official OR THE APPLICABLE
- 18 CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR a yellow sticker which shall read as
- 19 follows: "This vehicle has equipment defects. {reverse side}
- 20 Repairs and reinspection shall be obtained on or before . Do
- 21 not remove without State Police authorization." If, upon
- 22 reinspection, the vehicle defect has not been repaired, replaced,
- 23 or corrected, the state police official OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED
- 24 SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR shall remove the yellow sticker and affix a
- 25 red sticker to the vehicle. Exceptions may be made when the
- 26 necessary parts or equipment has been ordered but not received at
- 27 the time of reinspection. Reinspection may take place within 60

- 1 days after the original inspection.
- 2 (4) A school bus that is considered to be in satisfactory
- 3 condition after inspection by a state police official OR THE
- 4 APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR shall have a Michigan
- 5 vehicle inspection passing sticker affixed to its windshield. The
- 6 owner of a school bus shall remove or destroy the pass sticker
- 7 before selling the school bus. The display of a pass sticker on a
- 8 vehicle other than a school bus is a state civil infraction. All
- 9 stickers are the property of the department of state police OR THE
- 10 APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR.
- 11 Sec. 43. The department of state police OR THE APPLICABLE
- 12 CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR shall inspect a new school bus
- 13 before a school accepts delivery. The department of state police OR
- 14 THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR shall determine
- 15 whether the new vehicle is acceptable for delivery. The department
- 16 of state police may delegate the inspection of new school buses to
- 17 publicly employed inspectors EMPLOYED OR CONTRACTED BY THE SCHOOL
- 18 DISTRICT if the inspection complies with this subsection. A school
- 19 shall not accept delivery of a new school bus unless the new
- 20 vehicle has been inspected and passed by the department of state
- 21 police OR THE APPLICABLE CERTIFIED SCHOOL BUS INSPECTOR under this
- 22 subsection and title to the school bus has been obtained by the
- 23 school in compliance with this act.
- Sec. 70. (1) The department of education shall establish an
- 25 advisory committee to advise the department on issues and topics
- 26 concerning school buses and school bus safety. The advisory
- 27 committee shall consist of a member from each of the following

- 1 departments or organizations:
- 2 (a) The department.
- 3 (b) The department of state police.
- 4 (c) The state transportation department.
- 5 (d) The department of state.
- 6 (e) The Michigan association for pupil transportation.
- 7 (f) The Michigan association of school business officials.
- **8** (g) The Michigan association of school administrators.
- 9 (h) The training agency association of Michigan.
- 10 (i) A member representing nonpublic schools.
- 11 (j) The Michigan education association.
- 12 (k) The Michigan association of school boards.
- 13 (l) Other organizations representing school bus drivers as the
- 14 department considers appropriate.
- 15 (m) Any other organizations or groups the department considers
- 16 necessary.
- 17 (2) The advisory committee shall include members representing
- 18 bus drivers and supervisors in rural areas, suburban areas, and
- 19 cities in the Lower and Upper Peninsula PENINSULAS.
- 20 (3) The advisory committee shall assist the department in the
- 21 development of continuing education courses for school bus drivers
- 22 and supervisors, any modifications to the introductory school bus
- 23 safety course, the program to evaluate driving skills and on-road
- 24 procedural performance skills of each school bus driver, and the
- 25 minimum threshold for a required safety evaluation, which may
- 26 include, but is not limited to, number of points on a driving
- 27 record, operating impaired or under the influence of alcohol, at-

- 1 fault accidents, or violations of safety procedures, for requiring
- 2 drivers to take the on-road driver skills test.
- 3 (4) The advisory committee shall assist the department in
- 4 updating physical examination requirements as necessary to comply
- 5 with changes in federal and state law or rules.
- 6 (5) THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE SHALL SELECT MEMBERS FOR A SCHOOL
- 7 BUS INSPECTION STANDARD TASK FORCE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL SET AND
- 8 REVIEW STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL BUS INSPECTIONS.
