HOUSE BILL No. 6372

August 18, 2010, Introduced by Rep. Ball and referred to the Committee on Intergovernmental and Regional Affairs.

A bill to amend 1970 PA 169, entitled

"Local historic districts act,"

by amending section 4 (MCL 399.204), as amended by 1992 PA 96.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. The legislative body of a local unit may establish by
- 2 ordinance a commission to be called the historic district
- 3 commission. The commission may be established at any time, but not
- 4 later than the time the first historic district is established by
- 5 the legislative body of the local unit. Each member of the
- 6 commission shall reside OR OWN OR LEASE REAL PROPERTY within the
- local unit. The membership of the historic district commission in a
- B local unit having a population of 5,000 or more individuals shall
- consist of not less than 7 or more than 9 members. The membership

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- 1 of the historic district commission in a local unit having a
- 2 population of less than 5,000 individuals shall consist of not less
- 3 than 5 or more than 7 members. A majority of the members shall have
- 4 a clearly demonstrated interest in or knowledge of historic
- 5 preservation. The members shall be appointed by the township
- 6 supervisor, village president, mayor, or chairperson of the board
- 7 of commissioners, unless another method of appointment is provided
- 8 in the ordinance creating the commission. Initial members shall be
- 9 appointed within 6 months after the ordinance establishing the
- 10 commission is enacted. Members shall be appointed for 3-year terms
- 11 except the initial appointments of some of the members shall be for
- 12 less than 3 years so that the initial appointments are staggered
- 13 and that subsequent appointments do not recur at the same time.
- 14 Members shall be eligible for reappointment. A vacancy on the
- 15 commission shall be filled within 60 calendar days by an
- 16 appointment made by the appointing authority. The ordinance
- 17 creating the commission may provide procedures for terminating an
- 18 appointment due to the acts or omissions of the member. The
- 19 appointing authority of a local unit having a population of 25,000
- 20 or more individuals shall appoint at least 2 members from a list of
- 21 citizens—INDIVIDUALS submitted by 1 or more duly organized local
- 22 historic preservation organizations. A local unit having a
- 23 population of more than 5,000 individuals but less than 25,000
- 24 individuals shall appoint at least 1 member from a list of citizens
- 25 INDIVIDUALS submitted by 1 or more duly organized local historic
- 26 preservation organizations. The A commission of all local units
- 27 shall include as a member, if available, a graduate of an

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- 1 accredited school of architecture who has 2 years of architectural
- 2 experience or who is an architect registered in this state. This
- 3 section does not apply to historic district commissions established
- 4 by charter or to historic district commissions established by
- 5 ordinance before August 3, 1970.
