SENATE BILL No. 553

May 7, 2009, Introduced by Senator PAPPAGEORGE and referred to the Committee on Energy Policy and Public Utilities.

A bill to amend 1984 PA 34, entitled

"Michigan low income heating assistance and shut-off protection act,"

by amending section 7 (MCL 400.1207).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 7. (1) There is created a low income heating assistance and shut-off protection program. The program shall be administered by the department to prevent utility service shut-offs, promote awareness of and changes in energy use habits, promote conservation techniques, provide incentives for energy conservation, help reduce energy use by improving the housing stock, and provide relocation assistance.

- 1 (2) The department shall do all of the following:
- 2 (a) Coordinate weatherization efforts for assisted households.
- 3 (b) Authorize use of weatherization resources among the
- 4 dwellings of all assisted households in the state. The department
- 5 shall give first priority to households which THAT exceed the
- 6 annual consumption cap.
- 7 (c) Not later than the beginning of the third program year,
- 8 promulgate rules to create an energy conservation incentive which
- 9 THAT shall provide direct financial benefits to assisted households

- 21 public utility regulated by the Michigan public service commission

- 27 dwellings which THAT cannot be made energy-efficient and help

- 1 relocate those assisted households to more energy efficient
- 2 dwellings if reasonable alternative housing is available. The
- 3 department shall determine whether a dwelling cannot be made energy
- 4 efficient.
- 5 (g) Not later than the beginning of the second program year,
- 6 develop and implement a uniform record keeping and reporting system
- 7 for the program.
- 8 (h) Establish monitoring criteria for program evaluation which
- 9 THAT shall include, but not be limited to, all of the following:
- 10 (i) The number of assisted households which THAT exceed the
- 11 annual consumption cap.
- 12 (ii) The average consumption both before and after
- 13 weatherization for each assisted household.
- 14 (iii) The number of shut-offs of heating service to assisted
- 15 households.
- (iv) The number of dwellings of assisted households
- 17 weatherized.
