SENATE BILL No. 948

October 28, 2009, Introduced by Senator BROWN and referred to the Committee on Campaign and Election Oversight.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 759a (MCL 168.759a), as amended by 2006 PA 605.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 759a. (1) A member of the armed services AN ABSENT
- 2 UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER or an overseas voter who is not
- 3 registered, but possessed the qualifications of an elector under
- 4 section 492, may apply for registration by using the federal
- 5 postcard application. The department of state, bureau of elections,
- 6 is responsible for disseminating information on the procedures for
- 7 registering and voting to AN absent armed UNIFORMED services VOTER
- 8 and AN overseas voters VOTER.
- (2) Each of the following persons who is a qualified elector

- 1 of a city, village, or township in this state and who is not a
- 2 registered voter may apply for an absent voter ballot:
- 3 (a) A civilian employee of the armed services outside of the
- 4 United States.
- 5 (b) A member of the armed services outside of the United
- 6 States.
- 7 (c) A citizen of the United States temporarily residing
- 8 outside the territorial limits of the United States.
- 9 (d) A citizen of the United States residing in the District of
- 10 Columbia.
- 11 (2) (e) UPON THE REQUEST OF AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER
- 12 OR AN OVERSEAS VOTER, THE CLERK OF A COUNTY, CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR
- 13 VILLAGE SHALL ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMIT A BLANK VOTER REGISTRATION
- 14 APPLICATION OR BLANK ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION TO THE VOTER.
- 15 THE CLERK OF A COUNTY, CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE SHALL ACCEPT A
- 16 COMPLETED VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION OR COMPLETED ABSENT VOTER
- 17 BALLOT APPLICATION ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMITTED BY AN ABSENT
- 18 UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER. A VOTER REGISTRATION
- 19 APPLICATION OR ABSENT VOTER BALLOT APPLICATION SUBMITTED BY AN
- 20 ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER SHALL CONTAIN THE
- 21 SIGNATURE OF THE VOTER.
- 22 (3) AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR AN OVERSEAS VOTER,
- 23 WHETHER OR NOT REGISTERED TO VOTE, MAY APPLY FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
- 24 BALLOT. A spouse or dependent of a person described in subdivisions
- 25 (a) through (d) THIS SUBSECTION who is a citizen of the United
- 26 States and who is accompanying that person, even though the spouse
- 27 or dependent is not a qualified elector of a city, village, or

- 1 township of this state, if that spouse or dependent is not a
- 2 qualified and registered elector anywhere else in the United
- 3 States, MAY APPLY FOR AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT.
- 4 (4) (3) Upon receipt of an application FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
- 5 BALLOT under this section that complies with this act, a COUNTY,
- 6 city, village, or township clerk shall forward to the applicant the
- 7 absent voter ballots requested, the forms necessary for
- 8 registration, and instructions for completing the forms. If the
- 9 ballots are not yet available at the time of receipt of the
- 10 application, the clerk shall immediately forward to the applicant
- 11 the registration forms and instructions, and forward the ballots as
- 12 soon as they are available. IF A FEDERAL POSTCARD APPLICATION IS
- 13 FILED, THE CLERK SHALL ACCEPT THE FEDERAL POSTCARD APPLICATION AS
- 14 THE REGISTRATION APPLICATION AND SHALL NOT SEND ANY ADDITIONAL
- 15 REGISTRATION FORMS TO THE APPLICANT. If the ballots and
- 16 registration forms are received before the close of the polls on
- 17 election day and if the registration complies with the requirements
- 18 of this act, the absent voter ballots shall be delivered to the
- 19 proper election board to be voted TABULATED. If the registration
- 20 does not comply with the requirements of this act, the clerk shall
- 21 retain the absent voter ballots until the expiration of the time
- 22 that the voted ballots must be kept and shall then destroy the
- 23 ballots without opening the envelope. The clerk may retain
- 24 registration forms completed under this section in a separate file.
- 25 The address in this state shown on a registration form is the
- 26 residence of the registrant.
- 27 (5) NOT LATER THAN 45 DAYS BEFORE AN ELECTION, A COUNTY, CITY,

- 1 TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK SHALL ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMIT OR MAIL AS
- 2 APPROPRIATE AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT TO EACH ABSENT UNIFORMED
- 3 SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER WHO APPLIED FOR AN ABSENT VOTER
- 4 BALLOT 45 DAYS OR MORE BEFORE THE ELECTION.
- 5 (6) UPON THE REQUEST OF AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR
- 6 OVERSEAS VOTER, THE CLERK OF A COUNTY, CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE
- 7 SHALL ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMIT A BLANK ABSENT VOTER BALLOT TO THE
- 8 VOTER. THE VOTER SHALL PRINT THE BLANK ABSENT VOTER BALLOT, MARK
- 9 THE BALLOT, AND RETURN THE BALLOT BY MAIL TO THE APPROPRIATE CLERK.
- 10 (7) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL PRESCRIBE ELECTRONIC ABSENT
- 11 VOTER BALLOT FORMATS AND ELECTRONIC ABSENT VOTER BALLOT
- 12 TRANSMISSION METHODS. EACH COUNTY, CITY, TOWNSHIP, OR VILLAGE CLERK
- 13 SHALL EMPLOY THE PRESCRIBED ELECTRONIC BALLOT FORMATS TO FULFILL AN
- 14 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT REQUEST RECEIVED FROM AN ABSENT UNIFORMED
- 15 SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER WHO WISHES TO RECEIVE HIS OR HER
- 16 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION. THE
- 17 SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL ESTABLISH PROCEDURES TO IMPLEMENT THE
- 18 REQUIREMENTS IN THIS SECTION AND FOR THE PROCESSING OF A MARKED
- 19 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT RETURNED BY AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER
- 20 OR OVERSEAS VOTER WHO OBTAINED HIS OR HER ABSENT VOTER BALLOT
- 21 THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION.
- 22 (8) THE SECRETARY OF STATE SHALL MODIFY THE PRINTED STATEMENT
- 23 PROVIDED UNDER SECTION 761(4) AND THE ABSENT VOTER BALLOT
- 24 INSTRUCTIONS PROVIDED UNDER SECTION 764A AS APPROPRIATE TO
- 25 ACCOMMODATE THE PROCEDURES DEVELOPED FOR ELECTRONICALLY
- 26 TRANSMITTING AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT TO AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES
- 27 VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER. A STATEMENT SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE

- 1 CERTIFICATE SIGNED BY THE ABSENT VOTER WHO OBTAINED HIS OR HER
- 2 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT THROUGH AN ELECTRONIC TRANSMISSION THAT THE
- 3 SECRECY OF THE ABSENT VOTER BALLOT MAY BE COMPROMISED DURING THE
- 4 DUPLICATION PROCESS. THE ABSENT VOTER BALLOT INSTRUCTIONS PROVIDED
- 5 TO AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER SHALL
- 6 INCLUDE THE PROPER PROCEDURES FOR RETURNING THE ABSENT VOTER BALLOT
- 7 TO THE APPROPRIATE CLERK.
- 8 (9) (4) The size of a precinct shall not be determined by
- 9 registration forms completed under this section.
- 10 (10) (5) A member of the armed services AN ABSENT UNIFORMED
- 11 SERVICES VOTER or an overseas voter , as described in subsection
- 12 (2), who registers to vote by federal postcard application under
- 13 subsection (1), and who applies to vote as an absent voter by
- 14 federal postcard WHO SUBMITS AN ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application is
- 15 eligible to vote as an absent voter in any local or state election
- 16 , including any school election, occurring in the calendar year in
- 17 which the federal postcard ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application is
- 18 received by the COUNTY, city, village, or township clerk, but not
- 19 in an election for which the application is received by the clerk
- 20 after 2 p.m. of the Saturday before the election. A COUNTY, city,
- 21 or township clerk receiving a federal postcard AN ABSENT VOTER
- 22 BALLOT application FROM AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR
- 23 OVERSEAS VOTER shall transmit to a village clerk and THE school
- 24 district election coordinator COORDINATORS, where applicable, the
- 25 necessary information to enable the village clerk and school
- 26 district election coordinator COORDINATORS to forward an absent
- 27 voter ballot for each applicable election in that calendar year to

- 1 the qualified elector submitting the federal postcard application
- 2 ABSENT VOTER. A village clerk receiving a federal postcard AN
- 3 ABSENT VOTER BALLOT application FROM AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES
- 4 VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER shall transmit to a THE city or township
- 5 clerk AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION COORDINATORS, where
- 6 applicable, the necessary information to enable the city or
- 7 township clerk AND SCHOOL DISTRICT ELECTION COORDINATORS to forward
- 8 an absent voter ballot for each applicable election in that
- 9 calendar year to the qualified elector submitting the federal
- 10 postcard application ABSENT VOTER. If the local elections official
- 11 rejects a VOTER registration APPLICATION or absent voter ballot
- 12 application submitted on a federal postcard application by an
- 13 absent armed UNIFORMED services VOTER or overseas voter, the
- 14 election official shall notify the armed services or overseas voter
- 15 of the rejection.
- 16 (11) AN ELECTRONIC MAIL ADDRESS PROVIDED BY AN ABSENT
- 17 UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER OR OVERSEAS VOTER FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS
- 18 SECTION IS CONFIDENTIAL AND EXEMPT FROM DISCLOSURE UNDER THE
- 19 FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 TO 15.246.
- 20 (12) (6) Under the uniformed and overseas citizens absentee
- 21 voting act, 42 USC 1973ff to 1973ff-6, the state director of
- 22 elections shall approve a ballot form and registration procedures
- 23 for electors in the armed services and electors outside the United
- 24 States, including the spouses and dependents accompanying those
- 25 electors—ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTERS AND OVERSEAS VOTERS.
- 26 (7) As used in this section, "armed services" means any of the
- 27 following:

- 1 (a) The United States army, navy, air force, marine corps, or
- 2 coast guard.
- 3 (b) The United States merchant marine.
- 4 (c) A reserve component of an armed service listed in
- 5 subdivision (a) or (b).
- 6 (d) The Michigan national guard as defined in section 105 of
- 7 the Michigan military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.
- 8 (13) AS USED IN THIS SECTION:
- 9 (A) "ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER" MEANS ANY OF THE
- 10 FOLLOWING:
- 11 (i) A MEMBER OF A UNIFORMED SERVICE ON ACTIVE DUTY WHO, BY
- 12 REASON OF BEING ON ACTIVE DUTY, IS ABSENT FROM THE PLACE OF
- 13 RESIDENCE WHERE THE MEMBER IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO VOTE.
- 14 (ii) A MEMBER OF THE MERCHANT MARINE WHO, BY REASON OF SERVICE
- 15 IN THE MERCHANT MARINE, IS ABSENT FROM THE PLACE OF RESIDENCE WHERE
- 16 THE MEMBER IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO VOTE.
- 17 (iii) A SPOUSE OR DEPENDENT OF A MEMBER REFERRED TO IN
- 18 SUBPARAGRAPH (i) OR (ii) WHO, BY REASON OF THE ACTIVE DUTY OR SERVICE
- 19 OF THE MEMBER, IS ABSENT FROM THE PLACE OF RESIDENCE WHERE THE
- 20 SPOUSE OR DEPENDENT IS OTHERWISE QUALIFIED TO VOTE.
- 21 (B) "MEMBER OF THE MERCHANT MARINE" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL, OTHER
- 22 THAN A MEMBER OF A UNIFORMED SERVICE OR AN INDIVIDUAL EMPLOYED,
- 23 ENROLLED, OR MAINTAINED ON THE GREAT LAKES OR THE INLAND WATERWAYS,
- 24 WHO IS EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 25 (i) EMPLOYED AS AN OFFICER OR CREW MEMBER OF A VESSEL
- 26 DOCUMENTED UNDER THE LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES, A VESSEL OWNED BY
- 27 THE UNITED STATES, OR A VESSEL OF FOREIGN-FLAG REGISTRY UNDER

- 1 CHARTER TO OR CONTROL OF THE UNITED STATES.
- 2 (ii) ENROLLED WITH THE UNITED STATES FOR EMPLOYMENT OR TRAINING
- 3 FOR EMPLOYMENT, OR MAINTAINED BY THE UNITED STATES FOR EMERGENCY
- 4 RELIEF SERVICE, AS AN OFFICER OR CREW MEMBER OF A VESSEL DOCUMENTED
- 5 UNDER THE LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES, A VESSEL OWNED BY THE UNITED
- 6 STATES, OR A VESSEL OF FOREIGN-FLAG REGISTRY UNDER CHARTER TO OR
- 7 CONTROL OF THE UNITED STATES.
- 8 (C) "OVERSEAS VOTER" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 9 (i) AN ABSENT UNIFORMED SERVICES VOTER WHO, BY REASON OF ACTIVE
- 10 DUTY OR SERVICE, IS ABSENT FROM THE UNITED STATES ON THE DATE OF AN
- 11 ELECTION.
- 12 (ii) A PERSON WHO RESIDES OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES AND IS
- 13 OUALIFIED TO VOTE IN THE LAST PLACE IN WHICH THE PERSON WAS
- 14 DOMICILED BEFORE LEAVING THE UNITED STATES.
- 15 (iii) A PERSON WHO RESIDES OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES AND WHO,
- 16 BUT FOR SUCH RESIDENCE OUTSIDE OF THE UNITED STATES, WOULD BE
- 17 OUALIFIED TO VOTE IN THE LAST PLACE IN WHICH HE OR SHE WAS
- 18 DOMICILED BEFORE LEAVING THE UNITED STATES.
- 19 (D) "UNIFORMED SERVICES" MEANS THE ARMY, NAVY, AIR FORCE,
- 20 MARINE CORPS, COAST GUARD, THE COMMISSIONED CORPS OF THE PUBLIC
- 21 HEALTH SERVICE, THE COMMISSIONED CORPS OF THE NATIONAL OCEANIC AND
- 22 ATMOSPHERIC ADMINISTRATION, A RESERVE COMPONENT OF A UNIFORMED
- 23 SERVICE, OR THE MICHIGAN NATIONAL GUARD AS DEFINED IN SECTION 105
- 24 OF THE MICHIGAN MILITARY ACT, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.
- 25 (14) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO THE AUGUST 3, 2010 ELECTION AND
- 26 TO EACH SUCCEEDING ELECTION CONDUCTED IN THIS STATE.
- 27 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act takes effect June 1,
