## **SENATE BILL No. 989**

December 1, 2009, Introduced by Senator SWITALSKI and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled "Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 320a (MCL 257.320a), as amended by 2008 PA 463, and by adding section 602b.

- 16 DEPARTMENT, OR OPERATOR OF AN EMERGENCY VEHICLE.
- 17 (E) CARRY OUT DUTIES OR REPORT AN INCIDENT AS A SCHOOL BUS
- 18 DRIVER AS NECESSARY TO MAINTAIN STUDENT SAFETY AND TO RESPOND TO
