

SENATE BILL No. 1194

EXECUTIVE BUDGET BILL

March 3, 2010, Introduced by Senators BARCIA and SWITALSKI and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to make appropriations for the department of state police and certain other state purposes for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2011; to provide for the expenditure of those appropriations; to provide for certain reports and the consideration of those reports; to provide for the disposition of other income received by the various state agencies; to provide for certain emergency powers; to provide for the powers and duties of certain committees, certain state agencies, and certain employees; and to provide for the acquisition and disposition of certain real and personal property.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

4 PROVISIONS CONCERNING APPROPRIATIONS

5 GENERAL SECTIONS

6 Sec. 201. Pursuant to section 30 of article IX of the state
 7 constitution of 1963, total state spending from state resources
 8 under part 1 for fiscal year 2010-2011 is \$396,808,900.00 and state
 9 spending from state resources to be paid to local units of
 10 government for fiscal year 2010-2011 is \$17,266,900.00. The
 11 itemized statement below identifies appropriations from which
 12 spending to local units of government will occur:

2 Sec. 203. As used in this bill:

3 (a) "AFIS" means the automated fingerprint identification
4 system.

5 (b) "ARRA" means American recovery and reinvestment act.

6 (c) "Department" means the department of state police.

7 (d) "DHS" means the United States department of homeland
8 security.

9 (e) "DNA" means deoxyribonucleic acid.

10 (f) "DOJ" means the United States department of justice.

11 (g) "DOT" means the United States department of
12 transportation.

13 (h) "FEMA" means the federal emergency management agency.

14 (i) "FTE" means full-time equated.

15 (j) "IDG" means interdepartmental grant.

16 (k) "IDT" means intradepartmental transfer.

17 (l) "LEIN" means law enforcement information network.

18 (m) "MCOLES" means the Michigan commission on law enforcement
19 standards.

20 (n) "MDCH" means the Michigan department of community health.

21 (o) "MDOC" means the Michigan department of corrections.

22 (p) "MDOS" means the Michigan department of state.

23 (q) "MDOT" means the Michigan department of transportation.

24 (r) "MDTR" means the Michigan department of treasury.

25 (s) "MPSCS" means the Michigan public safety communications
26 system.

27 Sec. 204. The civil service commission shall bill departments

1 and agencies at the end of the first fiscal quarter for the charges
2 authorized by section 5 of article XI of the state constitution of
3 1963. Payments shall be made for the total amount of the billing by
4 the end of the second fiscal quarter.

5 Sec. 208. The department shall use the Internet to fulfill the
6 reporting requirements of this bill. This requirement may include
7 transmission of reports via electronic mail to the recipients
8 identified for each reporting requirement, or it may include
9 placement of reports on an Internet or Intranet site.

10 Sec. 209. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used for
11 the purchase of foreign goods or services, or both, if
12 competitively priced and of comparable quality American goods or
13 services, or both, are available. Preference shall be given to
14 goods or services, or both, manufactured or provided by Michigan
15 businesses, if they are competitively priced and of comparable
16 quality. In addition, preference should be given to goods or
17 services, or both, that are manufactured or provided by Michigan
18 businesses owned and operated by veterans, if they are
19 competitively priced and of comparable quality.

20 Sec. 210. The director shall take all reasonable steps to
21 ensure businesses in deprived and depressed communities compete for
22 and perform contracts to provide services or supplies, or both. The
23 director shall strongly encourage firms with which the department
24 contracts to subcontract with certified businesses in depressed and
25 deprived communities for services or supplies, or both.

26 Sec. 218. Funds appropriated in part 1 for at-post troopers
27 shall only be expended for trooper salaries, wages, benefits,

1 retirement, equipment, supplies, and other expenses directly
2 related to state troopers assigned to general law enforcement
3 duties at a department post, detachment, satellite office, or a
4 resident trooper function.

5 Sec. 223. (1) Due to the current budgetary problems in this
6 state, out-of-state travel shall be limited to situations in which
7 1 or more of the following conditions apply:

8 (a) The travel is required by legal mandate or court order or
9 for law enforcement purposes.

10 (b) The travel is necessary to protect the health or safety of
11 Michigan citizens or visitors or to assist other states in similar
12 circumstances.

13 (c) The travel is necessary to produce budgetary savings or to
14 increase state revenues, including protecting existing federal
15 funds or securing additional federal funds.

16 (d) The travel is necessary to comply with federal
17 requirements.

18 (e) The travel is necessary to secure specialized training for
19 staff that is not available within this state.

20 (f) The travel is financed entirely by federal or nonstate
21 funds.

22 (2) Not later than January 1 of each year, each department
23 shall prepare a travel report listing all travel by classified and
24 unclassified employees outside this state in the immediately
25 preceding fiscal year that was funded in whole or in part with
26 funds appropriated in the department's budget. The report shall be
27 submitted to the senate and house of representatives standing

1 committees on appropriations, the senate and house fiscal agencies,
2 and the state budget director. The report shall include the
3 following information:

4 (a) The name of each person receiving reimbursement for travel
5 outside this state or whose travel costs were paid by this state.

6 (b) The destination of each travel occurrence.

7 (c) The dates of each travel occurrence.

8 (d) A brief statement of the reason for each travel
9 occurrence.

10 (e) The transportation and related costs of each travel
11 occurrence, including the proportion funded with state general
12 fund/general purpose revenues, the proportion funded with state
13 restricted revenues, the proportion funded with federal revenues,
14 and the proportion funded with other revenues.

15 (f) A total of all out-of-state travel funded for the
16 immediately preceding fiscal year.

17 Sec. 234. Funds appropriated in part 1 shall not be used by a
18 principal executive department, state agency, or authority to hire
19 a person to provide legal services that are the responsibility of
20 the attorney general. This prohibition does not apply to legal
21 services for bonding activities and for those activities that the
22 attorney general authorizes.

23 Sec. 240. (1) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1,
24 there is appropriated an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.00 for
25 federal contingency funds. These funds are not available for
26 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
27 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,

1 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

2 (2) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
3 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.00 for state
4 restricted contingency funds. These funds are not available for
5 expenditure until they have been transferred to another line item
6 in this bill under section 393(2) of the management and budget act,
7 1984 PA 431, MCL 18.1393.

8 (3) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
9 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$1,000,000.00 for local
10 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
11 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
12 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
13 MCL 18.1393.

14 (4) In addition to the funds appropriated in part 1, there is
15 appropriated an amount not to exceed \$200,000.00 for private
16 contingency funds. These funds are not available for expenditure
17 until they have been transferred to another line item in this bill
18 under section 393(2) of the management and budget act, 1984 PA 431,
19 MCL 18.1393.

20 Sec. 241. The department shall provide \$1,800,000.00 in Byrne
21 justice assistance grant program funding to the judiciary by
22 interdepartmental grant.

23 **INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY**

24 Sec. 301. The money appropriated in part 1 for computer
25 services shall be funded by LEIN user fees sufficient to pay 1/3 of
26 the state's service and contract maintenance costs of the LEIN.

27 Sec. 302. From the funds appropriated in part 1 for

1 information technology, departments and agencies shall pay user
2 fees to the department of technology, management, and budget for
3 technology-related services and projects. Such user fees shall be
4 subject to provisions of an interagency agreement between the
5 department and agencies and the department of technology,
6 management, and budget.

7 **HIGHWAY SAFETY PLANNING**

8 Sec. 401. On a bi-annual basis, the department shall report to
9 the senate and house appropriations subcommittees on state police
10 and military and veterans affairs on the status of assessments
11 collected and authorized under section 629e of the Michigan vehicle
12 code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, for the purposes of supporting the
13 secondary road patrol grant program. Each bi-annual report shall
14 contain updated information on collection levels, revised projected
15 grant allotments to counties for the year, a comparison of
16 projected collections and grant distribution levels with the funds
17 appropriated in part 1 for the secondary road patrol program, and
18 the extent collection levels have exceeded or failed to meet
19 appropriated levels for the current fiscal year or expenditure
20 levels from the previous fiscal year.

21 **FORENSIC SCIENCES**

22 Sec. 501. When changes are made to the department's protocol
23 for retaining and purging DNA analysis samples and records, the
24 department shall distribute an updated copy to every police agency
25 in the state.

26 **MICHIGAN COMMISSION ON LAW ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS**

27 Sec. 601. The money appropriated to the MCOLES for maintenance

1 and delivery of training to locals is provided in accordance with a
2 state reimbursement policy in which 100% of the determined state
3 reimbursement rate shall be distributed upon certification by the
4 MCOLES.

5 Sec. 603. The appropriation in part 1 for mental health
6 awareness training and coordination shall be expended for training
7 law enforcement officers, mental health practitioners, and other
8 criminal justice personnel in effective and safe ways of assisting
9 people with mental illness and directing people with mental
10 disorders to treatment programs.

11 **EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT**

12 Sec. 801. (1) The state director of emergency management may
13 expend money appropriated under this bill to call upon any agency
14 or department of the state or any resource of the state to protect
15 life or property or to provide for the health or safety of the
16 population in any area of the state in which the governor proclaims
17 a state of emergency or state of disaster under 1945 PA 302, MCL
18 10.31 to 10.33, or under the emergency management act, 1976 PA 390,
19 MCL 30.401 to 30.421. The state director of emergency management
20 may expend the amounts the director considers necessary to
21 accomplish these purposes. The director shall submit to the state
22 budget director as soon as possible a complete report of all
23 actions taken under the authority of this section. The report shall
24 contain, as a separate item, a statement of all money expended that
25 is not reimbursable from federal money. The state budget director
26 shall review the expenditures and submit recommendations to the
27 legislature in regard to any possible need for a supplemental

1 appropriation.

2 (2) In addition to the money appropriated in this bill, the
3 department may receive and expend money from local, private,
4 federal, or state sources for the purpose of providing emergency
5 management training to local or private interests and for the
6 purpose of supporting emergency preparedness, response, recovery,
7 and mitigation activity. If additional expenditure authorization in
8 the Michigan administrative information network is approved by the
9 state budget office under this section, the department and the
10 state budget office shall notify the house and senate
11 appropriations subcommittees on state police and military and
12 veterans affairs and the house and senate fiscal agencies within 10
13 days after the approval. The notification shall include the amount
14 and source of the additional authorization, the date of its
15 approval, and the projected use of funds to be expended under the
16 authorization.

17 **POST UNIFORM SERVICES**

18 Sec. 901. State police enlisted personnel who are employed to
19 enforce traffic laws as provided in section 629e of the Michigan
20 vehicle code, 1949 PA 300, MCL 257.629e, shall not be prohibited
21 from responding to crimes in progress or other emergency
22 situations, and are responsible for protecting every citizen of
23 this state from harm.

24 **STATEWIDE FIELD OPERATIONS**

25 Sec. 1002. Money privately donated to the department is
26 appropriated under part 1 to be used for the purposes designated by
27 the donor of the money. Money privately donated to the department's

- 1 canine unit shall be used to purchase equipment and other items to
- 2 enhance the operation of the canine unit.
