SENATE BILL No. 1468

August 24, 2010, Introduced by Senators GARCIA, KAHN, BARCIA, PRUSI, JANSEN and CROPSEY and referred to the Committee on Economic Development and Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1966 PA 291, entitled "Firefighters training council act," by amending section 9 (MCL 29.369), as amended by 2006 PA 213.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 9. (1) The state fire marshal, with the approval of the council, shall prepare and publish standards with due consideration to varying factors and special requirements of organized fire departments in the following areas:
 - (a) Advisory standards of physical, educational, mental and moral fitness, which shall govern the recruitment, selection, and appointment of firefighters.
 - (b) The approval by the council of firefighter training schools. The standards shall address, at least, the following

- 1 issues:
- 2 (i) The qualification and certification of instructors.
- 3 (ii) The courses of study, attendance, record-keeping
- 4 requirements, equipment, and facilities.
- 5 (iii) The visitation and evaluation of instructors and schools.
- 6 (c) The establishment of subordinate regional training centers
- 7 in strategic geographic locations in order to serve the greatest
- 8 number of organized fire departments that are unable to support
- 9 their own training programs.
- 10 (2) Each organized fire department shall file a statement with
- 11 the council designating at least 1 training officer or training
- 12 coordinator for the fire department. If a training officer or
- 13 training coordinator is changed, the organized fire department,
- 14 within 7 days of the change, shall file a statement notifying the
- 15 council of the change.
- 16 (3) The council shall develop and provide to each organized
- 17 fire department, upon request of the organized fire department and
- 18 at no charge, a videotape, digital video disc, or other electronic
- 19 form of video display to be used in training firefighters. The
- 20 videotape, digital video disc, or other electronic form of video
- 21 display shall not include training that requires a practical
- 22 demonstration. The videotape, digital video disc, or other
- 23 electronic form of video display shall be based on the standards
- 24 for fire fighter I and fire fighter II set forth in "standard for
- 25 fire fighter professional qualifications", national fire protection
- 26 association standard no. 1001, 2002 edition. The council may impose
- 27 a reasonable fee for loss, damage, or late return of a videotape,

- 1 digital video disc, or other electronic form of video display
- 2 provided to an organized fire department under this subsection.
- 3 (4) The state fire marshal, with the approval of the council,
- 4 shall develop and administer an examination, which shall include a
- 5 practical demonstration, a written or oral test, or a combination
- 6 thereof, to determine a person's competency in regard to the
- 7 knowledge and skill requirements set forth in standards for fire
- 8 fighter I and fire fighter II set forth in "standard for fire
- 9 fighter professional qualifications", national fire protection
- 10 association standard no. 1001, 2002 edition. The council, upon the
- 11 request of an organized fire department, shall administer the
- 12 examination in each county at least once every year. The
- 13 examination shall be administered in 2 parts. Part 1 shall test the
- 14 knowledge and skill requirements set forth in fire fighter I, and
- 15 part 2 shall test the knowledge and skill requirements set forth in
- 16 fire fighter II. The examination may be retaken, as necessary, upon
- 17 request from an organized fire department.
- 18 (5) THE COUNCIL MAY CHARGE TO EACH PERSON TAKING THE
- 19 EXAMINATION A REASONABLE FEE IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THE ACTUAL
- 20 COST OF ADMINISTERING THE EXAMINATION. AN EXAMINATION FEE COLLECTED
- 21 UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE RETAINED BY THE COUNCIL TO DEFRAY
- 22 THE EXPENSES OF THE OFFICE IN CARRYING OUT ITS DUTIES UNDER
- 23 SUBSECTIONS (3) AND (4).
- 24 (6) (5) Within 12 months after a person's hiring date as a
- 25 full-time firefighter, the person must pass both part 1 and part 2
- 26 of the examination to be eligible for continued or permanent full-
- 27 time employment as a firefighter.

- 1 (7) A PERSON WHO SUCCESSFULLY COMPLIED WITH SUBSECTION (6) AND
- 2 WAS EMPLOYED FULL-TIME AS A FIREFIGHTER, BUT SUBSEQUENTLY
- 3 DISCONTINUED HIS OR HER EMPLOYMENT AS A FULL-TIME FIREFIGHTER FOR A
- 4 PERIOD OF NOT LESS THAN 5 YEARS, IS NOT ELIGIBLE TO RESUME
- 5 EMPLOYMENT FULL-TIME AS A FIREFIGHTER UNTIL HE OR SHE AGAIN PASSES
- 6 BOTH PART 1 AND PART 2 OF THE EXAMINATION.
- 7 (8) (6) Within 24 months after a person's appointment date as
- 8 a volunteer or paid on-call firefighter, a person must pass part 1
- 9 of the examination to be eligible for continued volunteer or paid
- 10 on-call service as a firefighter.
- 11 (9) (7)—The examination described in this section shall DOES
- 12 not apply to a EITHER OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 13 (A) A person who is employed or under appointment as a
- 14 firefighter on October 1, 1988, unless the person subsequently
- 15 changes his or her status from a volunteer or paid on-call
- 16 firefighter to a full-time firefighter.
- 17 (B) A PERSON WHO HAS BEEN CERTIFIED AS A TRAINED FIREFIGHTER
- 18 BY THE NATIONAL BOARD ON FIRE SERVICE PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS
- 19 OR THE INTERNATIONAL FIRE SERVICES ACCREDITATION CONGRESS AND WHO,
- 20 WITHIN THE 2-YEAR PERIOD IMMEDIATELY PRECEDING THE PERSON'S HIRING
- 21 DATE AS A PAID ON-CALL FIREFIGHTER OR FULL-TIME FIREFIGHTER IN THIS
- 22 STATE, WAS EMPLOYED AS A FIREFIGHTER IN ANOTHER STATE OR WAS
- 23 ASSIGNED DUTIES AS A FIREFIGHTER, FIREFIGHTER INSTRUCTOR, OR FIRE
- 24 OFFICER IN THE MILITARY FORCES.
- 25 (10) (8)—The state fire marshal, with the approval of the
- 26 council, shall review and monitor the state and federal standards
- 27 relating to live fire training exercises in structures and make

- 1 recommendations to the general industry safety standards commission
- 2 for any new or modified standard s necessary for the protection of
- 3 firefighter trainees.
