September 15, 2010, Introduced by Senator PRUSI and referred to the Committee on Finance.

A bill to amend 2007 PA 36, entitled "Michigan business tax act," by amending section 439 (MCL 208.1439).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 439. (1) A taxpayer may claim a credit against the tax
- 2 imposed by this act equal to \$1.00 per long ton of qualified low-
- 3 grade hematite consumed in an industrial or manufacturing process
- 4 that is the business activity of the taxpayer. AN UNUSED
 - CARRYFORWARD OF A CREDIT UNDER SECTION 39D OF FORMER 1975 PA 228
 - THAT WAS UNUSED AT THE END OF THE LAST TAX YEAR FOR WHICH FORMER
- 1975 PA 228 WAS IN EFFECT MAY BE CLAIMED AGAINST THE TAX IMPOSED
- UNDER THIS ACT FOR THE YEARS THE CARRYFORWARD WOULD HAVE BEEN
- AVAILABLE UNDER SECTION 39D OF FORMER 1975 PA 228.
 - (2) If the credit allowed under this section for the tax year

- 27 beneficiation and agglomeration are required to produce a product

- 5 AUTHORITY ACT, 1995 PA 24, MCL 207.801 TO 207.810.
- 6 (D) (c) "Qualified low-grade hematite" means pellets produced
- 7 from low-grade hematitic iron ore mined in the United States.
