OVERVIEW

Senate Bill 364 would appropriate \$58.0 million from the new Vulnerable Household Warmth Fund proposed in Senate Bill 864. The restricted fee revenue would be allocated to supplement the federally funded Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) within the Department of Human Services (DHS) and would allocate \$23.0 million to community agencies to also provide heating/energy assistance.

These new funds would be used to replace the Low Income Home Energy Efficiency Fund (LIEEF). The Michigan Court of Appeals has questioned the Public Services Commission's authority to approve the collection of those funds, so LIEEF collections are currently in escrow.
