## **Overview**

The School Aid budget makes appropriations to the state's 550 local school districts, 261 public school academies, and 57 intermediate school districts (ISDs) for operations and certain categorical programs. It also appropriates funds to the Center for Education Performance and Information, the Workforce Development Agency, and other entities to implement certain grants and other programs related to K-12 education.

- \$3,250,000 GF/GP for a kindergarten entry status assessment.
   Funds would be used for training, purchasing an assessment tool and integrating into the P-20 data system, parent education and outreach, and project administration.
- \$9,250,000 GF/GP to provide services to early childhood providers
  to assist them in attaining higher quality ratings under the Tiered
  Quality Rating and Improvement System. Funds would be used
  for training, aligning current state licensing, early learning
  standards, and the state professional registry, assessment of early
  learning settings across multiple quality indicators, purchase of
  educational rating tools, creation of a data tracking system to
  connect high need children with high quality early learning
  settings, family and parent education, evaluation, and quality
  improvement.

Also, the bill would include a contingency fund appropriation of up to \$70,000,000 in federal Race to the Top - Early Learning Challenge Grant funding, upon official notification to the Department of Education that the state has received a federal grant, to expand funding for both purposes described above to the extent allowed under the federal grant requirements.

## Major Boilerplate Changes From FY 2010-11

## Sec.32g. Office of Great Start - NEW

Senate adds new language related to the Office of Great Start appropriation described above to do the following:

- Requires the Office of Great Start to report to the House and Senate Appropriations Committees whether the state receives a federal Race to the Top - Early Learning Challenge Grant.
- Requires the Office of Great Start to report by April 1, 2012, to the House and Senate Appropriations Subcommittees on School Aid, the status of implementing the kindergarten assessment tool and the efforts to improve quality ratings of early childhood providers as well as planned activities for statewide implementation and quality improvement for the following fiscal year.
- Designates that the funds appropriated under this section are a work project appropriation and that the funding may be carried forward into the following future year. The estimated completion date of the work project would be September 30, 2015.
