HOUSE BILL No. 5119

October 25, 2011, Introduced by Reps. Outman and McBroom and referred to the Committee on Redistricting and Elections.

A bill to amend 1954 PA 116, entitled "Michigan election law,"

by amending section 677 (MCL 168.677), as amended by 1997 PA 158.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 677. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (4),

2 a precinct election inspector shall be a qualified and registered 3 elector of the county in which he or she serves or, in the case of 4 a local unit of government that lies in more than 1 county, is a 5 qualified and registered elector of the local unit of government in 6 which the election is being held, THIS STATE, shall have a good 7 reputation, and shall have sufficient education and clerical ability to perform the duties of the office. A person shall not be appointed to a board of election inspectors unless the person has 10 filed an application with a city, township, or village clerk in 11 that county where the individual wishes to serve as election

- 2 (2) The application shall be in his or her own handwriting and
- 3 shall contain the applicant's name, home address, ward and precinct
- 4 registration if any, date of birth, length of residence in the
- 5 county, political party affiliation, education, employment, and
- 6 other experience qualifications. The application shall provide a
- 7 certification that the applicant is not a member or a known active
- 8 advocate, as THAT TERM IS defined in section 674, of a political
- 9 party other than the one entered on the application. The form of
- 10 the application under this section shall be approved by the state
- 11 director of elections. The clerk shall maintain a file of
- 12 applications filed under this section and make the applications
- 13 available for public inspection at the clerk's office during normal
- 14 business hours.
- 15 (3) A person shall not be knowingly appointed or permitted to
- 16 act as a precinct election inspector if the person or any member of
- 17 his or her immediate family is a candidate for nomination or
- 18 election to any office at the election or who has been convicted of
- 19 a felony or election crime. A person shall not be permitted to act
- 20 as an election inspector if he or she has failed to attend a school
- 21 of instruction or failed to take an examination as provided in
- 22 section 683. This section does not prohibit the candidate for or
- 23 delegate to a political party convention from acting as an election
- 24 inspector in a precinct other than the precinct in which he or she
- 25 resides. An election shall not be invalidated merely because of the
- 26 violation of the provisions of this section.
- 27 (4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection and

- 1 subject to subsection (5), a person who is 16 or 17 years of age
- 2 and who is a resident of the county in which he or she serves or,
- 3 in the case of a local unit of government that lies in more than 1
- 4 county, is a resident of the local unit of government in which the
- 5 election is being held may be appointed to a board of election
- 6 inspectors. Before a person may be appointed under this subsection,
- 7 the first 3 members of the board required to be appointed under
- 8 section 672 must meet the requirements of subsections (1) to (3). A
- 9 person who is appointed under this subsection must meet the
- 10 requirements of subsections (1) to (3) other than being a qualified
- 11 and registered elector of the county in which he or she serves.
- 12 THIS STATE. A person who is appointed under this subsection is not
- 13 eligible to be designated as chairperson of the board under section
- **14** 674.
- 15 (5) If a person seeking appointment to a board of election
- 16 inspectors under subsection (4) is attending a K-12 school and if
- 17 an election falls on a school day, the person shall provide to the
- 18 clerk, along with the application filed under subsections (1) and
- 19 (2), a written document from his or her school specifically
- 20 acknowledging that person's application for appointment to the
- 21 board of election inspectors and specifically excusing that person
- 22 from school on the date of service, if such THE appointment is
- 23 made.
