A bill to amend 1995 PA 29, entitled "Uniform unclaimed property act," by amending sections 30 and 32 (MCL 567.250 and 567.252), section 30 as amended by 2008 PA 208.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 30. (1) The expiration, before or after the effective
- 2 date of this act, of any period of time specified by contract,
- 3 statute, or court order, during which a claim for money or property
- 4 can be made or during which an action or proceeding may be
- 5 commenced or enforced to obtain payment of a claim for money or to
- 6 recover property, does not prevent the money or property from being
- 7 presumed abandoned or affect any duty to file a report or to pay or
- 8 deliver abandoned property to the administrator as required by this
