## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 515. (1) In fiscal year 2007-2008, \$341,000,000.00 of the
- 2 revenue collected under this act shall be distributed to the school
- 3 aid fund and the balance shall be deposited into the general fund.
- 4 Except as otherwise provided in subsection (2), in fiscal year
- 5 2008-2009, \$729,000,000.00 of the revenue collected under this act
- 6 shall be distributed to the school aid fund and the balance shall
- 7 be deposited into the general fund. Except as otherwise provided in
- 8 subsection (2), for each fiscal year after the 2008-2009 fiscal
