## SUBSTITUTE FOR

## SENATE BILL NO. 621

A bill to amend 1979 PA 94, entitled
"The state school aid act of 1979,"
by amending section 166b (MCL 388.1766b), as amended by 2010 PA
204.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 166b. (1) This act does not prohibit a parent or legal
- 2 guardian of a minor who is enrolled in any of grades 1 to 12 in a
- 3 nonpublic school or who is being home-schooled from also enrolling
- 4 the minor in a district, public school academy, or intermediate
- 5 district in any curricular offering that is provided by the
- 6 district, public school academy, or intermediate district at a
- 7 public school site and is available to pupils in the minor's grade
- 8 level or age group, subject to compliance with the same
- 9 requirements that apply to a full-time pupil's participation in the

- 1 offering. However, state school aid shall be provided under this
- 2 act for a minor enrolled as described in this subsection only for
- 3 curricular offerings that are offered to full-time pupils in the
- 4 minor's grade level or age group during regularly scheduled school
- 5 hours.
- 6 (2) This act does not prohibit a parent or legal guardian of a
- 7 minor who is enrolled in any of grades 1 to 12 in a nonpublic
- 8 school <del>located within the district</del> or who resides within the
- 9 district and is being home-schooled from also enrolling the minor
- 10 in the district in a curricular offering being provided by the
- 11 district at the nonpublic school site. However, state school aid
- 12 shall be provided under this act for a minor enrolled as described
- in this subsection only if all of the following apply:
- 14 (a) Either of the following:
- 15 (i) The nonpublic school site is located, or the nonpublic
- 16 students are educated, within the geographic boundaries of the
- 17 district.
- 18 (ii) If the nonpublic school has submitted a written request
- 19 for a specific fiscal year to the district in which the nonpublic
- 20 school is located for the district to provide certain instruction
- 21 under this subsection for a school year and the district does not
- 22 agree WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE REQUEST WAS SUBMITTED to provide
- 23 some or all of that instruction, by May 1 immediately preceding
- 24 that school year or, if the request is submitted after March 1
- 25 immediately preceding that school year, within 60 days after the
- 26 nonpublic school submits the request, the portion of the
- 27 instruction that the district has not agreed to provide is instead

- 1 provided by a district that is contiguous to LOCATED IN THE SAME
- 2 INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT AS the district in which the nonpublic school
- 3 is located OR IS LOCATED IN AN INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT IS
- 4 CONTIGUOUS TO THAT INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT. This subparagraph applies
- 5 only to instruction, or a portion of instruction, that is
- 6 specifically included in the written request that was made to the
- 7 district in which the nonpublic school is located and that was
- 8 denied by that district. A public school academy that is located in
- 9 THE SAME INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT AS the district in which the
- 10 nonpublic school is located or in a AN INTERMEDIATE district that
- 11 is contiguous to the district in which the nonpublic school is
- 12 located THAT INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT also may provide instruction
- 13 under this subparagraph under the same conditions as a district
- 14 that is contiguous to LOCATED IN THE SAME INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT AS
- 15 the district in which the nonpublic school is located OR IS LOCATED
- 16 IN AN INTERMEDIATE DISTRICT THAT IS CONTIGUOUS TO THAT INTERMEDIATE
- 17 DISTRICT.
- 18 (b) The nonpublic school is registered with the department as
- 19 a nonpublic school and meets all state reporting requirements for
- 20 nonpublic schools.
- 21 (c) The instruction is scheduled to occur during the regular
- 22 school day.
- 23 (d) The instruction is provided directly by an employee of A
- 24 CERTIFIED TEACHER AT the district or public school academy or of AT
- 25 an intermediate district.
- 26 (e) The curricular offering is also available to full-time
- 27 pupils in the minor's grade level or age group in the district or

- 1 public school academy during the regular school day at a public
- 2 school site.
- 3 (f) The curricular offering is restricted to nonessential
- 4 elective courses for pupils in grades 1 to 12.
- 5 (3) A minor enrolled as described in this section is a part-
- 6 time pupil for purposes of state school aid under this act.
- 7 (4) A district that receives a written request to provide
- 8 instruction under subsection (2) shall reply to the request in
- 9 writing by May 1 immediately preceding the applicable school year
- 10 or, if the request is made after March 1 immediately preceding that
- 11 school year, within 60 days after the nonpublic school submits the
- 12 request. The written reply shall specify whether the district
- 13 agrees to provide or does not agree to provide the instruction for
- 14 each portion of instruction included in the request.
- 15 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 16 unless Senate Bill No. 619 of the 96th Legislature is enacted into
- **17** law.
