## SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 726

A bill to amend 1927 PA 175, entitled
"The code of criminal procedure,"
by amending section 24 of chapter VII (MCL 767.24), as amended by
2005 PA 35.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 CHAPTER VII
- 2 Sec. 24. (1) An indictment for murder, conspiracy to commit
- 3 murder, solicitation to commit murder, criminal sexual conduct in
- 4 the first degree, or a violation of the Michigan anti-terrorism
- 5 act, chapter LXXXIII-A of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL
- 6 750.543a to 750.543z, or a violation of chapter XXXIII of the
- 7 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.200 to 750.212a, that is
- 8 punishable by life imprisonment may be found and filed at any time.

- 1 (2) An indictment for a violation or attempted violation of
- 2 section 145c, 520c, 520d, 520e, or 520g of the Michigan penal code,
- 3 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145c, 750.520c, 750.520d, 750.520e, and
- 4 750.520q, may be found and filed as follows:
- 5 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (b), an
- 6 indictment may be found and filed within 10 years after the offense
- 7 is committed or by the alleged victim's twenty-first birthday,
- 8 whichever is later.
- 9 (b) If evidence of the violation is obtained and that evidence
- 10 contains DNA that is determined to be from an unidentified
- 11 individual, an indictment against that individual for the violation
- 12 may be found and filed at any time after the offense is committed.
- 13 However, after the individual is identified, the indictment may be
- 14 found and filed within 10 years after the individual is identified
- 15 or by the alleged victim's twenty-first birthday, whichever is
- 16 later.
- 17 (c) As used in this subsection:
- 18 (i) "DNA" means human deoxyribonucleic acid.
- 19 (ii) "Identified" means the individual's legal name is known
- 20 and he or she has been determined to be the source of the DNA.
- 21 (3) An indictment for kidnapping, extortion, assault with
- 22 intent to commit murder, attempted murder, manslaughter, or first-
- 23 degree home invasion may be found and filed within 10 years after
- 24 the offense is committed.
- 25 (4) AN INDICTMENT FOR KIDNAPPING, ATTEMPTED MURDER, OR
- 26 MANSLAUGHTER MAY BE FOUND AND FILED WITHIN 20 YEARS AFTER THE
- 27 OFFENSE IS COMMITTED. THIS SUBSECTION SHALL BE KNOWN AND MAY BE

- 2 (5) (4)—An indictment for identity theft or attempted identity
- 3 theft may be found and filed as follows:
- 4 (a) Except as otherwise provided in subdivision (b), an
- 5 indictment may be found and filed within 6 years after the offense
- 6 is committed.
- 7 (b) If evidence of the violation is obtained and the
- 8 individual who committed the offense has not been identified, an
- 9 indictment may be found and filed at any time after the offense is
- 10 committed, but not more than 6 years after the individual is
- 11 identified.
- 12 (c) As used in this subsection:
- 13 (i) "Identified" means the individual's legal name is known.
- 14 (ii) "Identity theft" means 1 or more of the following:
- 15 (A) Conduct prohibited in section 5 or 7 of the identity theft
- 16 protection act, 2004 PA 452, MCL 445.65 and 445.67.
- 17 (B) Conduct prohibited under former section 285 of the
- 18 Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328.
- 19 (6) (5) All other indictments may be found and filed within 6
- 20 years after the offense is committed.
- 21 (7) (6)—Any period during which the party charged did not
- 22 usually and publicly reside within this state is not part of the
- 23 time within which the respective indictments may be found and
- 24 filed.
- 25 (8)  $\frac{(7)}{(7)}$  The extension or tolling, as applicable, of the
- 26 limitations period provided in this section applies to any of those
- 27 violations for which the limitations period has not expired at the

 ${f 1}$  time the extension or tolling takes effect.
