## **SENATE BILL No. 897**

January 19, 2012, Introduced by Senators BOOHER, JONES, ROBERTSON and GREEN and referred to the Committee on Outdoor Recreation and Tourism.

A bill to amend 1994 PA 451, entitled
"Natural resources and environmental protection act,"
by amending section 48703 (MCL 324.48703), as amended by 2008 PA
291.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 48703. (1) A person shall not take, catch, or kill or attempt to take, catch, or kill a fish in the waters of this state with a grab hook, snag hook, or gaff hook, by the use of a set or night line or a net or firearm or an explosive substance or combination of substances that have a tendency to kill or stupefy fish, or by any other means or device other than a single line or a single rod and line while held in the hand or under immediate control, and with a hook or hooks attached, baited with a natural or artificial bait while being used for still fishing, ice fishing,

- 1 casting, or trolling for fish, which is a means of the fish taking
- 2 the bait or hook in the mouth. A person shall not use more than 3
- 3 single lines or 3 single rods and lines, or a single line and a
- 4 single rod and line, and shall not attach more than 6 hooks on all
- 5 lines. The department shall have the authority to decrease the
- 6 number of rods per angler. However, the department shall not reduce
- 7 the number of rods per angler to less than 2. For the purposes of
- 8 this part, a hook is a single, double, or treble pointed hook. A
- 9 hook, single, double, or treble pointed, attached to a manufactured
- 10 artificial bait shall be counted as 1 hook. The department may
- 11 designate waters where a treble hook and an artificial bait or lure
- 12 having more than 1 single pointed hook shall not be used during the
- 13 periods the department designates. In the Great Lakes or recognized
- 14 smelt waters, any numbers of hooks, attached to a single line, may
- 15 be used for the taking of smelt, alewife, or other bait fish.
- 16 (2) A person shall not set or use a tip-up or other similar
- 17 device for the purpose of taking fish through the ice unless the
- 18 name and address of the person owning the tip-up or other similar
- 19 device is marked in legible English on the tip-up or other similar
- 20 device or securely fastened to it by a plate or tag.
- 21 (3) The department may issue an order to regulate the taking
- 22 of fish with a spear, or bow and arrow, OR CROSSBOW in the waters
- 23 of this state.
- 24 (4) A hand net may be used from March 1 to May 31 for taking
- 25 smelt, suckers, mullet, carp, dogfish, and garpike. The department
- 26 may designate the waters where the fish may be taken and the time
- 27 within the dates when the fish may be taken.

- 1 (5) A dip net without sides or walls and not exceeding 9 feet
- 2 square may be used in the nontrout rivers and streams and in other
- 3 rivers and streams or portions of the rivers and streams designated
- 4 by the department from April 1 to May 31 in the Lower Peninsula and
- 5 during the month of May in the Upper Peninsula for the purpose of
- 6 taking suckers, mullet, smelt, carp, dogfish, and garpike.
- 7 (6) A person desiring to fish with a dip net shall first
- 8 obtain a permit from the department. A dip net shall not be erected
- 9 or fished within 100 feet of a dam. The name and address of the
- 10 person setting, using, or having control over the dip net
- 11 equipment, including frame, boom, supporting members, and temporary
- 12 buildings, shall be plainly marked in legible English on the dip
- 13 net equipment or securely fastened to it by a plate or tag. Dip net
- 14 equipment and a temporary building erected and used pursuant to
- 15 UNDER this subsection that are located on public land or the land
- 16 of another person shall be removed prior to BEFORE June 10 of each
- 17 year unless maintained with proper permission of the landowner.
- 18 This subsection does not authorize the erection or fishing of a dip
- 19 net on the land or premises of another person without proper
- 20 permission from the landowner.
- 21 (7) A setover net not exceeding 5 feet in diameter may be used
- 22 from March 15 to May 15 for the purpose of taking suckers from an
- 23 inland lake designated by the department.
- 24 (8) A trammel net not exceeding 12 feet in length may be used
- 25 from April 1 to May 31 for taking carp, suckers, redhorse, mullet,
- 26 dogfish, and other nongame fish in the Tittabawassee river and its
- 27 tributaries down from the dam at Sanford, down from the dam at St.

- 1 Louis, and down from the dam at Mt. Pleasant, and in the Shiawassee
- 2 river and its tributaries down from the dam at Chesaning in Saginaw
- 3 county. A person shall not take more than 100 of these fish in 1
- 4 day.
- 5 (9) A hoop net may be used between the dates of December 15
- 6 and February 28 in the river or stream or portion of a river or
- 7 stream designated by the department for the taking of burbot
- 8 (lawyers).
