SENATE BILL No. 466

June 15, 2011, Introduced by Senators SCHUITMAKER, JONES, HANSEN, EMMONS, PROOS, KAHN and MARLEAU and referred to the Committee on Families, Seniors and Human Services.

A bill to prescribe the senior or vulnerable adult medical alert as the official response to reports of certain missing persons; to provide for the broadcast of information regarding those incidents; and to provide for certain civil immunity.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "Mozelle senior or vulnerable adult medical alert act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
 - (a) "Missing senior or vulnerable adult" means a resident of this state who is 1 of the following:
 - (i) At least 60 years of age and is believed to be incapable of returning to his or her residence without assistance and is reported missing by a person familiar with that individual.
 - (ii) A vulnerable adult, as that term is defined in section

- 1 145m of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328, MCL 750.145m, who is
- 2 reported missing by a person familiar with that individual.
- 3 (b) "Person familiar with the missing senior or vulnerable
- 4 adult" means a missing senior's or vulnerable adult's guardian,
- 5 custodian, or guardian ad litem or an individual who provides the
- 6 missing senior or vulnerable adult with home health aid services,
- 7 possesses a health care power of attorney for the missing senior or
- 8 vulnerable adult, has proof that the missing senior or vulnerable
- 9 adult has a medical condition, or otherwise has information
- 10 regarding the missing senior or vulnerable adult.
- 11 Sec. 3. A law enforcement agency that receives notice of a
- 12 missing senior or vulnerable adult from a person familiar with the
- 13 missing senior or vulnerable adult shall prepare a report on the
- 14 missing senior or vulnerable adult. The report shall include the
- 15 following:
- 16 (a) Relevant information obtained from the notification
- 17 concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult, including the
- 18 following:
- 19 (i) A physical description of the missing senior or vulnerable
- 20 adult.
- (ii) The date, time, and place that the missing senior or
- 22 vulnerable adult was last seen.
- 23 (iii) The missing senior's or vulnerable adult's address.
- 24 (b) Information gathered by a preliminary investigation, if
- 25 one was made.
- (c) A statement by the law enforcement officer in charge
- 27 setting forth that officer's assessment of the case based upon the

- 1 evidence and information received.
- 2 Sec. 4. The law enforcement agency shall prepare the report
- 3 required by section 3 as soon as practicable after the law
- 4 enforcement agency receives notification of a missing senior or
- 5 vulnerable adult.
- 6 Sec. 5. (1) After obtaining the information identified in
- 7 section 3, the law enforcement agency shall immediately forward
- 8 that information to all of the following:
- 9 (a) All law enforcement agencies that have jurisdiction in the
- 10 location where the missing senior or vulnerable adult resides and
- 11 all law enforcement agencies that have jurisdiction in the location
- 12 where the missing senior or vulnerable adult was last seen.
- 13 (b) All law enforcement agencies to which the person who made
- 14 the notification concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult
- 15 requests the report be sent, if the law enforcement agency
- 16 determines that the request is reasonable in light of the
- 17 information received.
- 18 (c) All law enforcement agencies that request a copy of the
- 19 report.
- 20 (d) One or more broadcasters that broadcast in an area where
- 21 the missing senior or vulnerable adult may be located.
- 22 (2) Upon completion of the report required by section 3, a law
- 23 enforcement agency may forward a copy of the contents of the report
- 24 to 1 or more newspapers distributed in an area where the missing
- 25 senior or vulnerable adult may be located.
- 26 (3) After forwarding the contents of the report to a
- 27 broadcaster or newspaper under this section, the law enforcement

- 1 agency shall request that the broadcaster or newspaper do the
- 2 following:
- 3 (a) Notify the public that there is a senior or vulnerable
- 4 adult medical alert.
- **5** (b) Broadcast or publish a description of the missing senior
- 6 or vulnerable adult and any other relevant information that would
- 7 assist in locating the missing senior or vulnerable adult.
- 8 Sec. 6. A law enforcement agency shall begin an investigation
- 9 concerning the missing senior or vulnerable adult as soon as
- 10 possible after receiving notification of a missing senior or
- vulnerable adult.
- 12 Sec. 7. A person familiar with the missing senior or
- 13 vulnerable adult who notifies a law enforcement agency concerning a
- 14 missing senior or vulnerable adult shall notify the law enforcement
- 15 agency when he or she becomes aware that the missing senior or
- 16 vulnerable adult has been found.
- Sec. 8. (1) A broadcaster or newspaper that notifies the
- 18 public that there is a senior or vulnerable adult medical alert and
- 19 broadcasts or publishes to the public information contained in the
- 20 report forwarded to the broadcaster or newspaper by a law
- 21 enforcement agency, including a description of the missing senior
- 22 or vulnerable adult and any other relevant information that would
- 23 assist in locating the missing senior or vulnerable adult, is
- 24 immune from civil liability for an act or omission related to the
- 25 broadcast or the publication of the newspaper.
- 26 (2) The civil immunity described in subsection (1) does not
- 27 apply to an act or omission that constitutes gross negligence or

1 willful, wanton, or intentional misconduct.
