

SENATE BILL No. 812

November 10, 2011, Introduced by Senator HUNTER and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled
"Revised judicature act of 1961,"
by amending sections 4706 and 8733 (MCL 600.4706 and 600.8733),
section 4706 as added by 1988 PA 104 and section 8733 as amended by
2003 PA 95, and by adding section 2977.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 SEC. 2977. A MOTOR VEHICLE SEIZED BY THIS STATE OR A LOCAL
2 UNIT OF GOVERNMENT THAT IS SUBJECT TO FORFEITURE UNDER A LAW OF
3 THIS STATE OR AN ORDINANCE OF A LOCAL UNIT OF GOVERNMENT SHALL BE
4 RETURNED TO THE OWNER WITHIN 7 DAYS AND ANY FORFEITURE FEES OR FEES
5 FOR IMPOUNDING THE VEHICLE SHALL BE WAIVED, IF 1 OF THE FOLLOWING
6 OCCURS:

7 (A) THE OWNER IS ARRESTED OR DETAINED BECAUSE OF CIRCUMSTANCES
8 RELATED TO THE SEIZURE OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE AND IS RELEASED WITHOUT
9 BEING CHARGED WITH A CRIME, CIVIL INFRACTION, OR CIVIL VIOLATION.

10 (B) IF THE OWNER IS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING A CRIME BECAUSE OF

1 CIRCUMSTANCES RELATED TO THE SEIZURE OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE, THE
2 OWNER IS ACQUITTED OF THE CRIME.

3 (C) IF THE OWNER IS CHARGED WITH COMMITTING A CIVIL INFRACTION
4 OR CIVIL VIOLATION BECAUSE OF CIRCUMSTANCES RELATED TO THE SEIZURE
5 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLE, THE OWNER IS FOUND TO BE NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR
6 THE CIVIL INFRACTION OR CIVIL VIOLATION.

7 Sec. 4706. (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, personal
8 property seized ~~pursuant to~~ **UNDER** section 4703 shall be returned to
9 the owner, or a lien filed against real property under section 4703
10 or against a motor vehicle under section 4705, shall be discharged
11 ~~—~~within 7 days after the occurrence of any of **THE** following:

12 (a) A warrant is not issued against a person for the
13 commission of a crime within 7 days after the property is seized
14 or, if the property is real property, within 7 days after the lien
15 is filed.

16 (b) All charges against the consenting legal owner relating to
17 the commission of a crime are dismissed.

18 (c) The consenting legal owner charged with committing a crime
19 is acquitted of the crime.

20 (d) In the case of multiple defendants, all persons charged
21 with committing a crime are acquitted of the crime.

22 (e) Entry of a court order ~~pursuant to~~ **UNDER** this chapter for
23 the return of the property or the discharge of the lien.

24 (2) **SECTION 2977 ALSO APPLIES TO A MOTOR VEHICLE THAT HAS BEEN**
25 **SEIZED UNDER THIS CHAPTER.**

26 Sec. 8733. (1) An authorized local official may seize and
27 impound a vehicle operated in the commission of a trailway

1 municipal civil infraction. Upon impoundment, the vehicle is
2 subject to a lien, subordinate to a prior lien of record, in the
3 amount of any fine, costs, or assessment that the defendant may be
4 ordered to pay under section 8727 and any expenses described in
5 subsection (2) that the defendant may be ordered to pay under
6 section 8727. The defendant or a person with an ownership interest
7 in the vehicle may post with the court a cash or surety bond in the
8 amount of \$750.00. If such a bond is posted, the vehicle shall be
9 released from impoundment. The vehicle shall also be released, and
10 the lien shall be discharged, ~~upon a judicial determination that~~
11 ~~the defendant is not responsible for the trailway municipal civil~~
12 ~~infraction~~ **IF REQUIRED BY SECTION 2977** or upon payment of the fine,
13 costs, assessment, and damages and expenses.

14 (2) In a trailway municipal civil infraction action, an order
15 under section 8727 may require the defendant to pay 1 or both of
16 the following:

17 (a) The amount of damages to any land, water, wildlife,
18 vegetation, or other natural resource or to any facility damaged by
19 the violation of the ordinance. Money collected under this
20 subdivision shall be distributed to the governmental entity that
21 has jurisdiction over the recreational trailway.

22 (b) The reasonable expense of impoundment under subsection
23 (1). Money collected under this subdivision shall be distributed to
24 the governmental entity employing the authorized local official who
25 impounded the vehicle involved in the trailway municipal civil
26 infraction.

27 (3) If the court determines that the defendant is responsible

1 for the trailway municipal civil infraction and the defendant
2 defaults in the payment of the fine, costs, assessment, or damages
3 or expenses, or in any installment, as ordered pursuant to section
4 8727, any bond posted under subsection (1) shall be forfeited and
5 applied to the fine, costs, assessment, damages, expenses, or
6 installment. The court shall certify any remaining unpaid amount to
7 the attorney for the governmental entity whose ordinance was
8 violated. The attorney for the governmental entity may enforce the
9 lien by a foreclosure sale. The foreclosure sale shall be conducted
10 in the manner provided and subject to the same rights as apply in
11 the case of execution sales under sections 6031, 6032, 6041, 6042,
12 and 6044 to 6047.

13 (4) Not less than 21 days before the foreclosure sale, the
14 attorney for the governmental entity whose ordinance was violated
15 shall by certified mail send written notice of the time and place
16 of the foreclosure sale to each person with a known ownership
17 interest in or lien of record on the vehicle. In addition, not less
18 than 10 days before the foreclosure sale, the attorney shall twice
19 publish notice of the time and place of the foreclosure sale in a
20 newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the vehicle
21 was seized. The proceeds of the foreclosure sale shall be
22 distributed in the following order of priority:

23 (a) To discharge any lien on the vehicle that was recorded
24 prior to the creation of the lien under subsection (1).

25 (b) To the clerk of the court for the payment of the fine,
26 costs, assessment, damages, and expenses that the defendant was
27 ordered to pay under section 8727.

1 (c) To discharge any lien on the vehicle that was recorded
2 after the creation of the lien under subsection (1).

3 (d) To the owner of the vehicle.

4 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
5 unless all of the following bills of the 96th Legislature are
