OVERVIEW

FY 2014-15 Appropriation Items:

SB 761 (S-1) contains \$2,900 GF/GP in planning authorization for university and community college capital outlay projects. Planning authorization is included for 12 of 15 universities and 17 of 28 community colleges. Traditionally, universities finance 25% of a project's costs and the state finances 75%; community colleges finance 50% of a project's costs and the state finances 50%. In recent years, the state share has been capped at \$30.0 million. SB 761 (S-1) continues to cap the state share at \$30.0 million.

The total cost of the projects contained within SB 761 (S-1) is \$841.8 million, with a state share of \$370.4 million (See Attachment 1). The current available capacity below the statutory bond cap is approximately \$1.17 billion. Rental rates are usually between 7% and 9% per year. With the total state share being \$370.3 million, the annual debt service payments for these projects would be between \$25.9 million and \$33.3 million GF/GP over 15 to 17 years.

In addition, the bill contains an increase in total cost and an adjustment in financing sources between the state and college for the Kalamazoo Valley Community College (KVCC) – Healthy Living Campus project that was authorized for planning in 2013 PA 102 and authorized for construction in 2014 PA 34. The total cost authorization would increase by \$948,600. Additionally, the state share would increase by \$6.0 million with a corresponding \$6.0 million reduction in the college share. The adjustment in the sources of financing would put the state share close to the 50% match the state has traditionally provided to community college projects (statutory maximum).

The bill would also provide a project cost increase to the Lake Superior State University - School of Business project initially authorized for construction in 2013 PA 102. The project cost would be increased by \$1.5 million and fully covered by university resources.

Renovation to the 87,500 sq. ft. building would include reconfiguration of existing space to modernize classrooms and lab spaces with new technology and flexible use spaces for research and instruction and updating fire suppression system and replacing existing HVAC, plumbing, and electrical systems to improve energy efficiency and help reduce existing operating costs. Funding for the university's share of project costs would be made available from university reserves, donations, and/or capital funding (including bond financing). DTMB ranked the project 4th among university requests.

3. Ferris State University – Swan Building Annex Renovations Total project cost is \$30.0 million. University share is \$7.5 million; state share is \$22.5 million. The project would involve the renovation of 47,086 sq. ft. of existing space and the addition of 34,462 sq. ft. of new space to provide classroom and laboratory space for Welding Engineering and Advanced Manufacturing which the university determined had outgrown their current space. The Swan Building was built in 1966 and the project would include major renovations including complete building mechanical, electrical, and plumbing upgrades to the existing portion of the Swan Building Annex. The university is working to raise match dollars through private fundraising and would bond for any remainder. Total project cost is \$120.0 million. University share is \$90.0 million; state share is \$30.0 million. The project includes the construction of a new 170,000 sq. ft. building to support wet bench and computational research space, research support space, offices, conference rooms, and common collaboration areas. The purpose of the project is provide expanded laboratory space and support co-location and integration of programs and researchers based on common research themes within the broad areas of science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). Funding for the university's share of project costs would be made available through university resources and, if necessary, through sale of bonds. This original project request was revised downward from a \$207.0 million 300,000 sq. ft. facility to the current proposal. As originally proposed, DTMB ranked the project 11th among university requests.

7. Northern Michigan University – Learning Resources Center Renovations Total project cost is \$40.0 million. University share is \$10.0 million; state share is \$30.0 million. The project would renovate a 198,000 sq. ft. library built in 1966 and transform the building into a high-tech instructional support hub and learning resource center. Renovations would include enhancements for the Olson Library, the Central Upper Peninsula and NMU Archives, public broadcasting stations, audio-visual services, and instructional and student support areas. Structural facility upgrades include windows, building support, HVAC, plumbing, electrical, and information technology systems. Approximately \$1.7 million of life/safety issues have been identified along with \$16.0 million in deferred maintenance. Funding for the university's share of project costs would be made available from the NMU Foundation, industry contributions, and capital bonding.
