House Bill 4125 (as reported without amendment)

CONTENT

The bill would repeal Sections 2, 3, and 4 of Public Act 162 of 1969 (which authorized the establishment of the Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine) to eliminate the Michigan Osteopathic Medicine Advisory Board.

Section 2 of the Act established the Advisory Board and prescribes its membership. Section 3 provides for officers of the Advisory Board, and requires the Board to advise the board of control of the institution of higher education to which the school is assigned on all matters relevant to the School of Osteopathic Medicine.

Section 4 pertains to the conduct of Advisory Board business and authorizes the Board to make recommendations regarding the following:

- -- Operation of the school.
- -- Tuition and other fees and charges.
- -- The appointment or removal of personnel.
- -- Compensation to be paid for services and materials.
