House Bill 4177 (as passed by the House) Sponsor: Representative Jim Ananich House Committee: Criminal Justice Senate Committee: Judiciary

CONTENT

The bill would amend the Michigan Penal Code to refer to vulnerable adult abuse in the first *or* second degree, rather than the first *and* second degree, in a provision listing crimes that constitute first-degree murder.

Under the Penal Code, murder committed in the perpetration of, or attempt to perpetrate, any of the following is first-degree murder and must be punished by imprisonment for life:

- -- Arson.
- -- First-, second-, or third-degree criminal sexual conduct.
- -- First-degree child abuse.
- -- A major controlled substance offense.
- -- Robbery.
- -- Carjacking.
- -- Breaking and entering of a dwelling.
- -- First- or second-degree home invasion.
- -- Larceny.
- -- Extortion.
- -- Kidnapping.
- -- Torture.
- -- Aggravated stalking.
- -- First- and second-degree vulnerable adult abuse.

The bill would include first- or second-degree vulnerable adult abuse.
