HOUSE SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 543

A bill to amend 2011 PA 152, entitled "Publicly funded health insurance contribution act," by amending section 4 (MCL 15.564).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 4. (1) By a majority vote of its governing body **EACH**
- 2 YEAR, PRIOR TO THE BEGINNING OF THE MEDICAL BENEFIT PLAN COVERAGE
- 3 YEAR, a public employer, excluding this state, may elect to comply
- 4 with this section for a medical benefit plan coverage year instead
- 5 of the requirements in section 3. The designated state official may
- 6 elect to comply with this section instead of section 3 as to
- 7 medical benefit plans for state employees and state officers.
- 8 (2) For medical benefit plan coverage years beginning on or
- 9 after January 1, 2012, a public employer shall pay not more than
- 10 80% of the total annual costs of all of the medical benefit plans

- 1 it offers or contributes to for its employees and elected public
- 2 officials. For purposes of this subsection, total annual costs
- 3 includes the premium or illustrative rate of the medical benefit
- 4 plan and all employer payments for reimbursement of co-pays,
- 5 deductibles, and payments into health savings accounts, flexible
- 6 spending accounts, or similar accounts used for health care but
- 7 does not include beneficiary-paid copayments, coinsurance,
- 8 deductibles, other out-of-pocket expenses, other service-related
- 9 fees that are assessed to the coverage beneficiary, or beneficiary
- 10 payments into health savings accounts, flexible spending accounts,
- 11 or similar accounts used for health care. Each FOR PURPOSES OF THIS
- 12 SECTION, EACH elected public official who participates in a medical
- 13 benefit plan offered by a public employer shall be required to pay
- 14 20% or more of the total annual costs of that plan. The public
- 15 employer may allocate the employees' share of total annual costs of
- 16 the medical benefit plans among the employees of the public
- 17 employer as it sees fit.
