A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled "Public health code," by amending sections 16184 and 16185 (MCL 333.16184 and 333.16185),

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16184. (1) An individual who is retired from ENGAGING IN
- 2 the active practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 3 podiatric medicine and surgery, optometry, or dentistry A HEALTH
- 4 PROFESSION and who wishes to donate his or her expertise for the
- 5 medical, optometric, or dental HEALTH care and treatment of
- 6 indigent and needy individuals in this state or for the medical,
- 7 optometric, or dental HEALTH care and treatment of individuals in
- 8 medically underserved areas of this state may obtain a special
- 9 volunteer license to engage in the practice of medicine,

as amended by 2012 PA 4.

- 2 optometry, or dentistry THE HEALTH PROFESSION FROM WHICH HE OR SHE
- 3 IS RETIRED by submitting an application to the board pursuant to

- 18 (c) If the applicant has been out of practice for 3 or more
- 19 years, documentation that, during the 3 years immediately preceding
- 20 the application, he or she has attended at least 2/3 of the
- 21 continuing education courses or programs required FOR THAT HEALTH
- 22 PROFESSION under part 170, 175, 180, 174, or 166 THIS ARTICLE OR
- 23 ANY RULES PROMULGATED UNDER THIS ARTICLE for the renewal of a
- 24 license FOR THAT HEALTH PROFESSION.
- 25 (2) If the board determines that the application of the
- 26 individual satisfies the requirements of subsection (1) and that
- 27 the individual meets the requirements for a license as prescribed

- 2 board shall grant a special volunteer license to the applicant. A
- 3 licensee seeking renewal under this section shall provide the board

- 17 (4) For purposes of this section, an individual is considered
- 18 retired from ENGAGING IN THE practice OF A HEALTH PROFESSION if the
- 19 individual's license has expired with the individual's intention of
- 20 ceasing to engage, FOR REMUNERATION, in the practice of medicine,
- 21 osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery,
- 22 optometry, or dentistry for remuneration. THE HEALTH PROFESSION.
- 23 (5) An individual who is granted a special volunteer license
- 24 under this section shall only engage in activities within the scope
- 25 of practice of the **HEALTH** profession for which he or she was
- 26 licensed prior to BEFORE HIS OR HER retirement.
- 27 (6) AS USED IN THIS SECTION AND SECTION 16185, "HEALTH

- 1 PROFESSION" MEANS A HEALTH PROFESSION FOR WHICH AN INDIVIDUAL MUST
- 2 BE LICENSED, REGISTERED, OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER ARTICLE 15
- 3 TO PRACTICE IN THIS STATE.
- 4 Sec. 16185. (1) Subject to subsection (2), an individual who
- 5 provides care under a special volunteer license to engage in the
- 6 practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric
- 7 medicine and surgery, optometry, or dentistry A HEALTH PROFESSION
- 8 granted under section 16184 is not liable in a civil action for
- 9 personal injury or death proximately caused by the professional
- 10 negligence or malpractice of the individual in providing the care
- if both of the following apply:
- 12 (a) The care is provided at a health facility or agency that
- 13 provides at least 75% of its care annually to medically indigent
- 14 individuals.
- 15 (b) The individual does not receive and does not intend to
- 16 receive compensation for providing the care.
- 17 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply if the negligent conduct or
- 18 malpractice of the individual is gross negligence.
- 19 (3) As used in this section:
- 20 (a) "Gross negligence" means conduct so reckless as to
- 21 demonstrate a substantial lack of concern for whether an injury
- 22 results.
- (b) "Medically indigent individual" means that term as defined
- 24 in section 106 of the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.106.
