## **HOUSE BILL No. 4546**

April 16, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Outman, Kelly, Rendon, VerHeulen, Johnson, Muxlow and Yonker and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1970 PA 29, entitled

"An act relating to potatoes; to create a potato commission; to prescribe its powers and duties and authority; to impose an assessment on the privilege of introducing potatoes into the channels of trade and commerce; to provide for the collection of the assessment; to provide for penalties; and to repeal certain acts and parts of acts,"

by amending sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 8, and 9a (MCL 290.421, 290.422, 290.423, 290.424, 290.428, and 290.429a), sections 1 and 3 as amended by 1980 PA 304, section 2 as amended by 2005 PA 59, and sections 4 and 8 as amended and section 9a as added by 1996 PA 99.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. As used in this act:
  - (a) "Commission" means the state potato industry commission.
  - (b) "Department" means the state—department of agriculture AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT.
    - (c) "Director" means the director of the department. of

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- 1 agriculture.
- 2 (d) "Grower" means any business unit, including a family
- 3 operation, sole proprietorship, partnership, corporation, company,
- 4 association, trust, or other business organization engaged in the
- 5 business of growing potatoes for market.
- 6 (e) "Shipper" means a person engaged in the shipping SHIPMENT
- 7 of potatoes, whether as owner, agent, or otherwise; , into the
- 8 channels of trade; or engaged in the processing of potatoes for
- 9 human or animal consumption in any form or for any other commercial
- **10** use.
- 11 (f) "Shipment of potatoes" means, and a shipment of potatoes
- 12 shall be considered to take place, when potatoes are loaded within
- 13 this state in a rail car, truck, or other conveyance in which the
- 14 potatoes are to be transported for sale or otherwise put into the
- 15 channel of trade and commerce.
- 16 (g) "Hundredweight" means a 100-pound unit or a combination of
- 17 packages making a 100-pound unit, or the equivalent in metric
- 18 units, of any shipment of potatoes.
- 19 (h) "Retailer" means a person who sells directly to the
- 20 consumer in small quantities or broken lots.
- 21 (I) "RULE" MEANS A RULE PROMULGATED PURSUANT TO THE
- 22 ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURES ACT OF 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 TO
- 23 24.328.
- 24 (J) (i) "Processor" means a person engaged in canning,
- 25 freezing, dehydrating, chipping, fermenting, distilling,
- 26 extracting, preserving, or changing the form of potatoes for the
- 27 purpose of consumption or for any other commercial use.

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- 1 (K) (j) "Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 2 corporation, association, cooperative, or any other business unit.
- 3 Sec. 2. (1) The state potato industry commission is created
- 4 within the department. The commission shall be composed of the ALL
- 5 OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 6 (A) THE director or a person designated by the director from
- 7 the director's staff, who shall serve ex officio, without vote. ; a
- 8 (B) A staff member of Michigan state university appointed by
- 9 the dean of THE [COLLEGE ] OF agriculture AND NATURAL RESOURCES of
- 10 that university to serve at the pleasure of the dean, ex officio,
- 11 without vote. ; and 10 growers, 2 processors, 2 shippers, and 1
- 12 retailer
- 13 (C) THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS appointed by the governor with the
- 14 advice and consent of the senate: -
- 15 (i) TWO INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING THE SNACK POTATO MANUFACTURING
- 16 INDUSTRY.
- 17 (ii) TWO INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING THE SEED POTATO INDUSTRY.
- 18 (iii) TWO INDIVIDUALS REPRESENTING THE FRESH POTATO INDUSTRY.
- 19 (iv) ONE INDIVIDUAL REPRESENTING SHIPPERS.
- 20 (v) ONE INDIVIDUAL REPRESENTING SHIPPERS OR RETAILERS.
- 21 (vi) ONE INDIVIDUAL FROM ANY OF THE CATEGORIES LISTED IN
- 22 SUBPARAGRAPHS (i) THROUGH (v).
- 23 (2) A member appointed by the governor UNDER SUBSECTION (1)
- 24 shall be a citizen and resident of this state and of the district
- 25 from which appointed, shall be WHO IS 18 years of age or older. 7
- 26 and shall be in compliance with this act. A commission member in
- 27 the WHO IS A grower category shall be engaged and have been engaged

- 1 in growing potatoes within this state for a period of not less than
- 2 years immediately before appointment, and shall have derived a
- 3 substantial portion of his or her income from this activity.
- 4 (2) Eight growers shall be appointed to serve on the
- 5 commission, representing 7 districts throughout the state as
- 6 follows: District 1-Upper Peninsula counties shall be represented
- 7 by 2 members. The following districts shall be represented by 1
- 8 member each: district 2-Antrim, Manistee, Wexford, Missaukee,
- 9 Roscommon, Mason, Lake, Osceola, Clare, Benzie, Charlevoix,
- 10 Cheboygan, Crawford, Emmet, Grand Traverse, Kalkaska, Leelanau, and
- 11 Otsego; district 3-Alcona, Alpena, Montmorency, Oscoda, Presque
- 12 Isle, Iosco, and Ogemaw; district 4-Kent, Montcalm, Newaygo,
- 13 Isabella, Mecosta, and Oceana; district 5 Bay, Arenac, Midland,
- 14 Tuscola, Huron, Sanilac, Gratiot, Gladwin, and Saginaw; district 6-
- 15 Allegan, Barry, Eaton, Van Buren, Kalamazoo, Calhoun, Berrien,
- 16 Cass, Clinton, Ionia, Ottawa, Muskegon, St. Joseph, and Branch;
- 17 district 7 Ingham, Livingston, Oakland, Macomb, Jackson, Washtenaw,
- 18 Wayne, Hillsdale, Lenawee, Shiawassee, Genesee, Lapeer, St. Clair,
- 19 and Monroe. The ninth and tenth growers shall serve at large. The
- 20 other members of the commission, except the ex officio members,
- 21 shall have been associated with the potato industry for not less
- 22 than 2 years immediately before appointment.
- 23 (3) The term of office of an appointed A COMMISSION member
- 24 APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(C) shall be 3 years. The term of an
- 25 appointed member shall expire on July 1, except that a term shall
- 26 continue until a successor is appointed and qualified. If during a
- 27 term a member ceases to possess any of the qualifications

- 1 prescribed in this act, that member's office shall be vacated. A
- 2 person appointed to fill a vacancy shall serve for the remainder of
- 3 the unexpired term and until a successor is appointed and
- 4 qualified.
- 5 (4) The commission shall conduct a meeting of growers and
- 6 shippers annually.
- 7 (5) The commission may conduct a meeting of growers in the
- 8 district where a vacancy will occur by expiration of a term, to
- 9 elect nominees for appointment to the commission. Instead of a
- 10 meeting, nominees may be selected by a vote of growers in the
- 11 district by mail ballot, providing ballots are mailed by the
- 12 commission to all growers of record, and in compliance with this
- 13 act. Not more than 2 nominees for each vacancy on the commission
- 14 shall be selected. The names of all nominees shall be placed on a
- 15 list of nominees recommended to the governor, and the governor
- 16 shall make appointments from that list. The growers at large shall
- 17 be nominated by a majority of the 8 growers representing the
- 18 districts. A majority of the 10 grower members shall nominate the
- 19 processor, shipper, and retail candidates for appointment to the
- 20 commission. Vacancies on the commission, except from the expiration
- 21 of term, shall be filled by the governor from nominees selected by
- 22 the commission. A person appointed as a commission member shall
- 23 qualify by filing a written acceptance and oath of office within 10
- 24 days after being notified by the governor of the appointment.
- 25 (5) (6)—Annually, the commission members shall elect a
- 26 chairperson from among its appointed members. A majority of the
- 27 voting members of the commission constitutes a quorum for the

- 1 transaction of business and the carrying out of the duties of the
- 2 commission. The business which the commission may perform shall be
- 3 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 4 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 5 Public notice of the time, date, and place of the meeting shall be
- 6 given in the manner required by the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267,
- 7 MCL 15.261 to 15.275. Meetings of the commission shall be called by
- 8 the chairperson, except that special meetings shall be called by
- 9 the chairperson on petition of 8-5 OR MORE members no-NOT later
- 10 than 7 days after receiving the petition.
- 11 (7) The commission, with the advice and consent of the
- 12 director and the commission of agriculture, may reapportion either
- 13 the number of commission members or member districts, or both.
- 14 Reapportionment of the districts shall be on the basis of
- 15 production or industry representation. Reapportionment may be
- 16 commenced not earlier than 30 days after the effective date of the
- 17 amendatory act that added this subsection. Reapportionment of
- 18 either members or districts shall not occur more than twice in any
- 19 5-year period and shall not occur within 6 months before a
- 20 referendum. After reapportionment under this subsection, if the
- 21 residence of a member of the commission falls outside the district
- 22 for which he or she serves on the commission and falls within the
- 23 district for which another member serves on the commission, then
- 24 both members shall continue to serve on the commission for a term
- 25 equal to the remaining term of the member who served for the
- 26 longest period of time. After the reapportionment described in this
- 27 subsection, if a district is created within which no member serving

- 1 on the commission resides, then a member shall be selected in the
- 2 manner as prescribed in this section. After a reapportionment or
- 3 redistricting, the commission may temporarily have more members
- 4 than prescribed by this section until the expiration of the term of
- 5 the longest-serving member from that district. In the case of a
- 6 reapportionment conducted under this subsection, the provisions of
- 7 this subsection prevail over any other conflicting provisions of
- 8 this section.
- 9 (6) (8) The per diem compensation of the appointed members of
- 10 the commission APPOINTED UNDER SUBSECTION (1)(C) shall not exceed
- 11 \$75.00 plus the reimbursement of expenses incurred in attending a
- 12 commission meeting.
- (7) (9) All funds of the commission shall be handled by the
- 14 commission and all funds received by it THE COMMISSION shall be
- 15 used to implement this act. Money received by the commission shall
- 16 be deposited in banks or other forms of security as may be
- 17 designated by the commission.
- 18 (8) (10) Retailers, processors, and others may support the
- 19 programs of the commission by paying an annual fee of \$100.00.
- 20 (9) <del>(11)</del> The commission may accept gifts, <del>and</del> grants,
- 21 ROYALTIES, LICENSE FEES, INTEREST, INCOME, OR OTHER ITEMS OF VALUE
- 22 THAT ENHANCE THE PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ACT.
- 23 (10) (12) The commission shall maintain accurate books,
- 24 records, and accounts of its transactions, which books, records,
- 25 and accounts shall be open to inspection by the public and shall be
- 26 subject to audit by the auditor general or a certified public
- 27 accountant. A document prepared, owned, used, in the possession of,

- 1 or retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 2 function shall be made available to the public in compliance with
- 3 the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246,
- 4 except as otherwise provided in section 4a.
- 5 (11) <del>(13)</del> The commission may borrow money in anticipation of
- 6 the receipt of assessments if all of the following conditions are
- 7 met:
- 8 (a) The loan will not be requested or authorized, or will not
- 9 mature, within 90 days before a resubmittal or termination
- 10 referendum regarding an assessment under this act.
- 11 (b) The amount of the loan does not exceed 50% of the annual
- 12 average assessment revenue during the previous 3 years.
- 13 (c) The loan repayment period does not exceed the time period
- 14 during which the assessment is made or the time period during which
- 15 the assessment can reasonably be expected to be imposed.
- 16 (d) The loan has the prior written consent of the director.
- 17 The director may request an audit of the commission by the auditor
- 18 general before approving the loan.
- 19 (12) <del>(14)</del> The director shall assess against the growers and
- 20 shippers all outstanding loans approved under subsection (13)-(11),
- 21 including interest, if the assessment is terminated.
- 22 (13) (15) A THE COMMISSION SHALL ANNUALLY PREPARE A financial
- 23 report shall be prepared annually and made SHALL MAKE THAT
- 24 FINANCIAL REPORT available upon request.
- Sec. 3. (1) The commission shall foster, develop, and promote
- 26 the potato industry through research, promotion, advertising,
- 27 market expansion, development of new markets, education, and the

- 1 development and dissemination of market and industry information.
- 2 The commission may develop procedures and carry out any other
- 3 activity necessary to accomplish the purposes of this act.
- 4 (2) To accomplish its purpose, the commission shall collect,
- 5 prepare, and disseminate information relating to all of the
- 6 following:
- 7 (a) The importance of potatoes in human nutrition.
- 8 (b) The manner, method, and means used and technology employed
- 9 in the production, transportation, marketing, processing, and
- 10 grading of potatoes.
- 11 (c) The laws of this state relating to the production,
- 12 transportation, marketing, processing, and grading of potatoes, to
- insure a pure and wholesome product.
- 14 (d) Factors affecting the potato industry, such as unbalanced
- 15 production, effect of the weather, influence of consumer purchasing
- 16 power, and price relative to the cost of other foods.
- 17 (e) Branding, labeling, stenciling, sealing, or packaging
- 18 potatoes to protect their identity.
- 19 (f) Other information as may be necessary to promote increased
- 20 consumption of potatoes, and a better understanding and more
- 21 efficient cooperation between producers, dealers, and the consuming
- 22 public.
- 23 (3) The commission may promulgate rules <del>pursuant to Act No.</del>
- 24 306 of the Public Acts of 1969, as amended, being sections 24.201
- 25 to 24.315 of the Michigan Compiled Laws, to implement this act.
- 26 (4) The commission may select APPOINT committees to carry out
- 27 the various projects covered under this act.

- 1 (5) The commission may employ personnel and incur other
- 2 expenses necessary to carry out this act. A member, employee, or
- 3 agent of the commission is not liable personally for the contracts
- 4 of the commission. All salaries, expenses, obligations, and
- 5 liabilities incurred by the commission are payable only from the
- 6 funds collected under this act.
- 7 Sec. 4. (1) An assessment at the rate of 1 cent NOT MORE THAN
- 8 5-1/2 CENTS per hundredweight on potatoes grown in the state shall
- 9 be levied upon each particular lot or quantity of potatoes and
- 10 imposed upon each grower WITH 20 OR MORE ACRES IN THE PRODUCTION OF
- 11 POTATOES and NOT MORE THAN 1-1/2 CENTS PER HUNDREDWEIGHT SHALL BE
- 12 LEVIED ON EACH PARTICULAR LOT OR QUANTITY OF POTATOES SHIPPED BY
- 13 each shipper within this state as provided by this act. The
- 14 commission may, by a majority vote, raise the assessment by as much
- 15 as an additional 1/2 cent per hundredweight. The increased
- 16 assessment shall be continued if it is approved by a majority vote
- 17 of those growers and shippers present at the next annual meeting.
- 18 NOT LATER THAN JULY 1 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL DETERMINE
- 19 THE ASSESSMENT RATES FOR THAT YEAR AND SHALL NOTIFY EACH GROWER AND
- 20 SHIPPER OF THE APPLICABLE RATE.
- 21 (2) In addition to the assessment imposed in subsection (1),
- 22 an additional assessment may be imposed upon growers upon the
- 23 recommendation of the commission and the conduct of a referendum in
- 24 compliance with section 8(3) through (5).
- 25 (2) A GROWER WITH LESS THAN 20 ACRES IN THE PRODUCTION OF
- 26 POTATOES IS CONSIDERED TO BE IN FULL COMPLIANCE WITH THIS ACT AND
- 27 MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAMS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS ACT IF THE

- 1 GROWER PAYS AN ASSESSMENT BASED UPON HIS OR HER PRODUCTION OVER 3
- 2 OF THE LAST 5 YEARS.
- 3 (3) Each grower shall pay the grower assessment on all
- 4 potatoes grown in the state by the grower. The shipper shall deduct
- 5 the grower assessment from money due the grower and remit the
- 6 grower assessment to the commission. In addition, each shipper
- 7 shall pay to the commission the shipper assessment on all potatoes
- 8 purchased, sold, or shipped in the state by the shipper.
- 9 (4) The assessment shall not be imposed upon potatoes retained
- 10 by a grower and used for the grower's own seed purposes or own home
- 11 consumption.
- 12 (5) Every shipper of potatoes shall file an application with
- 13 the commission on forms prescribed and furnished by the commission
- 14 which shall contain the name under which the shipper is transacting
- 15 business within the state, the place or places of business and
- 16 location of loading and shipping places and agents of the shipper,
- 17 the names and addresses of the persons constituting a firm or
- 18 partnership and, if a corporation, the corporation name and the
- 19 names and addresses of its principal officers and agents within the
- 20 state. The commission shall issue a certificate to the shipper and
- 21 a shipper shall not sell or ship potatoes until the certificate is
- 22 furnished as required by this section.
- 23 (6) Each shipper and grower shall keep, as a part of his or
- 24 her permanent records, a record of all purchases, sales, and
- 25 shipments of potatoes, which records shall be open for inspection
- 26 at all times. Each shipper and grower shall file a report with the
- 27 commission stating the quantity of potatoes received, sold, or

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- 1 shipped by him or her, on forms to be furnished by the commission.
- 2 The report to be prepared by each shipper shall be IS due not later
- 3 than 15 days after the end of the calendar quarter. The report to
- 4 be prepared by each grower shall be IS due not later than July 15
- 5 of each year. Both shippers and the growers shall report further
- 6 pertinent information as the commission prescribes. With the filing
- 7 of the report, each shipper shall pay to the commission the
- 8 assessment provided by this act.
- 9 (7) AN ASSESSMENT UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL NOT BE INCREASED
- 10 ABOVE THE RATE ASSESSED ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE AMENDATORY ACT
- 11 THAT ADDED THIS SUBSECTION UNLESS AUTHORIZED BY A REFERENDUM
- 12 PURSUANT TO SECTION 8.
- 13 Sec. 8. (1) WITHIN 60 DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE
- 14 2013 AMENDMENTS TO THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL HOLD A
- 15 REFERENDUM. For the purpose of the referenda under this act, each
- 16 grower and shipper who is in compliance with section 4 is entitled
- 17 to 1 vote. The director shall MAY promulgate rules pursuant to the
- 18 administrative procedures act of 1969, Act No. 306 of the Public
- 19 Acts of 1969, being sections 24.201 to 24.328 of the Michigan
- 20 Compiled Laws, for conducting a referendum under this act.
- 21 (2) If NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ACT, IF the
- 22 director receives a petition, bearing the signatures of not less
- 23 than 33-1/3% of all shippers, to terminate the shipper assessments,
- 24 the director shall conduct a referendum by mail. The shipper
- 25 assessments shall be terminated if [1 of the following occurs:
- 26 (a) If] more than 50%, by number, of the shippers voting
- 27 representing more than 50% of the volume of potatoes purchased,

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1 sold, or shipped the previous year, vote in favor of terminating

- 2 the assessment.
- 3 [(b) If more than 50%, by number, of the shippers voting,
- 4 representing more than 50% of the volume of potatoes purchased,
- 5 sold, or shipped the previous year, vote in favor of terminating
- 6 the assessment.
- 7 (3) If NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS ACT, IF the
- 8 director receives a petition signed by 25% , or 200, of the growers
- 9 , whichever is less, for the adoption of an assessment increase
- 10 above that provided for in section 4(1), he or she shall give
- 11 notice of a public hearing on the proposed assessment increase. The
- 12 director may require all shippers as individuals or through their
- 13 trade associations to file with him or her within 30 days a report,
- 14 properly certified, showing the correct names and addresses of all
- 15 growers from whom the shipper received potatoes in the marketing
- 16 season next preceding the filing of the report. The information
- 17 contained in the individual reports of shippers filed with the
- 18 director pursuant to this subsection shall not be made public by
- 19 the director and shall not be made available to anyone for private
- 20 use.
- 21 (4) The director shall issue a decision within 45 days after
- 22 the close of the public hearing required under subsection (3) based
- 23 upon his or her findings, and deliver, by mail or otherwise, copies
- 24 of the findings and recommendation, approving or disapproving of
- 25 the proposed assessment increase to all parties of record appearing
- 26 at the hearing and any other interested parties. The recommendation
- 27 shall contain the text in full of any proposed assessment increase.

- 1 The recommendation shall be substantially within the purview of the
- 2 notice of hearings and shall be supported by evidence taken at the
- 3 hearing or by documents of which the director is authorized to take
- 4 official notice.
- 5 (5) After recommending the increase of an assessment, the
- 6 director shall determine by a referendum whether the affected
- 7 growers assent to the proposed action. The director shall conduct
- 8 the referendum by mail within 45 days after the issuance of the
- 9 recommendation. The affected growers shall be considered to have
- 10 assented to the proposal if more than 50% by number of those voting
- 11 representing more than 50% of the volume of potatoes produced by
- 12 those voting assent to the proposal. The director shall establish
- 13 procedures for determination of volume for the conduct of referenda
- 14 and other necessary procedures.
- 15 (6) For the purpose of referenda under this act, a grower is
- 16 entitled to 1 vote representing a single firm, individual
- 17 proprietorship, corporation, company, association, partnership, or
- 18 husband-wife or family ownership.
- 19 Sec. 9a. Five years after the latest referendum held under
- 20 this act, EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED IN THIS ACT, A REFERENDUM
- 21 UNDER THIS ACT SHALL BE VALID FOR 5 YEARS. EVERY 5 YEARS, the
- 22 department shall conduct a referendum at which growers shall vote
- 23 whether or not the commission shall continue to levy the
- 24 assessments and otherwise carry out this act. If a majority of the
- 25 growers voting who represent a majority of the hundredweight sold
- 26 in the previous year vote against having the commission continue to
- 27 function, the commission shall cease its operations and deliver its

- 1 assets to the director who shall transfer the assets to Michigan
- 2 state university for potato research. A grower is entitled to 1
- 3 vote and the grower must be able to verify the hundredweight
- 4 claimed as being sold on the ballot.
