SUBSTITUTE FOR

HOUSE BILL NO. 5451

A bill to provide for tuition assistance at certain educational institutions for Michigan national guard members; and to prescribe duties for certain state officials.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- 2 "Michigan national guard tuition assistance act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Active service" means that term as defined in section 105
- 5 of the Michigan military act, 1967 PA 150, MCL 32.505.
- 6 (b) "Adjutant general" means the adjutant general of this
- 7 state.
- 8 (c) "Eligible educational institution" means a public or
- 9 private college, university, vocational school, technical school,
- 10 or trade school located in this state.

- 1 (d) "Eligible person" means a member of the Michigan national
- 2 guard who meets all of the following conditions:
- 3 (i) Is in active service.
- 4 (ii) Is not absent without leave or under charges described in
- 5 the Michigan code of military justice of 1980, 1980 PA 523, MCL
- 6 32.1001 to 32.1148.
- 7 (iii) Maintains a minimum grade point average as determined by
- 8 the adjutant general, which grade point average shall apply for
- 9 each eligible person.
- 10 (iv) Any other criteria determined by the adjutant general
- 11 consistent with Michigan national guard recruiting and retention
- 12 requirements.
- (e) "Fund" means the Michigan national guard tuition
- 14 assistance fund created in section 4.
- 15 (f) "Tuition" means the cost of a course of study at an
- 16 eligible educational institution, including the cost of
- 17 instructional fees, laboratory fees, computer fees, and other fees
- 18 directly related to that eligible person's specific course of study
- 19 at that eligible educational institution. Tuition does not include
- 20 the cost of books and study materials.
- 21 (g) "Tuition assistance program" means the Michigan national
- 22 guard tuition assistance program created in section 3.
- 23 Sec. 3. (1) The Michigan national guard tuition assistance
- 24 program is created within the department of military and veterans
- 25 affairs.
- 26 (2) The adjutant general shall administer the tuition
- 27 assistance program and prescribe forms and procedures to

- 1 effectively carry out the tuition assistance program.
- 2 (3) An eligible person may apply for tuition assistance, not
- 3 to exceed \$4,500.00 in any academic year, from the tuition
- 4 assistance program before enrolling in an eligible educational
- 5 institution. The adjutant general shall approve the application if
- 6 the applicant is an eligible person and if there is sufficient
- 7 money in the fund to cover the cost of the amount requested on the
- 8 application.
- 9 (4) If an eligible person has enrolled in an eligible
- 10 educational institution and has not applied for and received
- 11 tuition assistance from the tuition assistance program, the
- 12 eligible person may apply for tuition assistance for the full
- 13 amount of the tuition paid to the eligible educational institution
- 14 not to exceed \$4,500.00 in any academic year. The adjutant general
- 15 shall approve the application if the applicant is an eligible
- 16 person and if there is sufficient money in the fund to cover the
- 17 cost of the amount requested on the application.
- 18 (5) The tuition assistance program applies to any course of
- 19 study that is intended to culminate in vocational or technical
- 20 training, a certificate, or the eligible person's first associate
- 21 degree, bachelor's degree, or master's degree.
- 22 (6) The tuition assistance program applies to an eligible
- 23 person notwithstanding any other educational incentive or benefit
- 24 received by the eligible person under any other educational
- 25 assistance program provided by any other law.
- 26 (7) Upon completion of a course of study, an eligible person
- 27 who successfully applied for and received tuition assistance under

- 1 subsection (3) or (4) shall provide evidence of attendance and
- 2 completion of the course of study in a manner prescribed by the
- 3 adjutant general.
- 4 (8) An eligible person who received tuition assistance under
- 5 subsection (3) or who received reimbursement for the cost of
- 6 tuition under subsection (4) and who did not complete the course of
- 7 study for which it was granted shall reimburse the fund the full
- 8 amount received in a manner prescribed by the adjutant general.
- 9 Sec. 4. (1) The Michigan national guard tuition assistance
- 10 fund is created within the state treasury.
- 11 (2) The state treasurer may receive money or other assets from
- 12 any source for deposit into the fund. The state treasurer shall
- 13 direct the investment of the fund. The state treasurer shall credit
- 14 to the fund interest and earnings from the fund.
- 15 (3) Money in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall
- 16 remain in the fund and shall not lapse to the general fund.
- 17 (4) The department of military and veterans affairs shall be
- 18 the administrator of the fund for auditing purposes.
- 19 (5) The adjutant general shall expend money from the fund to
- 20 provide tuition assistance to an eligible person for the cost of
- 21 tuition to an eligible educational institution under section 3(3)
- 22 or to reimburse an eligible person for the cost of tuition paid to
- 23 an eligible educational institution under section 3(4) for a course
- 24 of study completed by the eligible person.
