SUBSTITUTE FOR SENATE BILL NO. 535

A bill to create the methamphetamine abuse reporting act; to require the department of state police to report methamphetamine-related offenses to the national association of drug diversion investigators (NADDI); to require the entry of methamphetamine-related offenses into the national precursor log exchange (NPLEX) system; to provide civil immunity under certain circumstances; to prohibit the disclosure of certain information under certain circumstances; and to provide remedies and penalties.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "methamphetamine abuse reporting act".
- 3 Sec. 2. As used in this act:
- 4 (a) "Department" means the department of state police.

- 1 (b) "Methamphetamine-related offense" means 1 or more of the
- 2 following offenses under Michigan law:
- 3 (i) A violation or attempted violation of article 7 of the
- 4 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.7101 to 333.7545,
- 5 involving methamphetamine.
- 6 (ii) A violation or attempted violation of section 17766c or
- 7 17766f of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.17766c and
- **8** 333.17766f.
- 9 (iii) Conspiracy to commit an offense described in subparagraph
- 10 (i) or (ii).
- 11 (c) "NADDI" means the national association of drug diversion
- 12 investigators.
- 13 (d) "NPLEx" means the national precursor log exchange.
- 14 Sec. 3. If the department is notified by the court that an
- 15 individual has been convicted of a methamphetamine-related offense
- 16 on or after the effective date of this act, the department shall
- 17 notify NADDI of that conviction. The department may consult with
- 18 NADDI regarding the conviction information that is to be provided
- 19 under this act and may limit the information provided to NADDI
- 20 based upon those requirements. However, the information provided to
- 21 NADDI under this section shall, at a minimum, include all of the
- 22 following:
- 23 (a) The individual's full name.
- 24 (b) The individual's date of birth.
- 25 (c) The individual's driver license number or state personal
- 26 identification card number, if known by the department.
- 27 (d) A statement that the individual has been convicted of a

- 1 methamphetamine-related offense. A statutory citation to the
- 2 violation satisfies the requirements of this subdivision.
- 3 (e) A statement of the date of conviction.
- 4 Sec. 4. The information provided to NADDI under this section
- 5 shall be for the purpose of generating a stop-sale alert through
- 6 NPLEx for individuals who have been convicted of methamphetamine-
- 7 related offenses. The stop-sale alert applies until the expiration
- 8 of 10 years after the individual is convicted of the
- 9 methamphetamine-related offense.
- 10 Sec. 5. NADDI may provide a statement on NPLEx that the stop-
- 11 sale alert is generated because of a conviction for a
- 12 methamphetamine-related offense and that the individual to whom the
- 13 stop order applies may contact the department of state police if he
- 14 or she believes that the information reported to NADDI under this
- 15 act is erroneous.
- Sec. 6. (1) The department shall notify NADDI if any of the
- 17 following apply:
- 18 (a) The department corrects or updates any information
- 19 regarding the conviction, if that information was previously
- 20 reported to NADDI.
- 21 (b) The department determines that the conviction has been set
- 22 aside under 1965 PA 213, MCL 780.621 to 780.624, or otherwise
- 23 expunged.
- 24 (2) NADDI shall promptly correct or update information in, or
- 25 remove information from, NPLEx upon receiving notification by the
- 26 department under subsection (1).
- 27 Sec. 7. The department and NADDI are immune from civil

- 1 liability for compiling, maintaining, or reporting methamphetamine-
- 2 related offense information under this act.
- 3 Sec. 8. (1) A person who sells ephedrine or pseudoephedrine at
- 4 retail may rely on information provided by the department to NADDI
- 5 under this act for enforcing a stop-sale alert based upon a report
- 6 of a conviction for a methamphetamine-related offense and, except
- 7 as provided in subsection (2), is immune from civil liability for
- 8 the reliance upon and use of that information under this act.
- 9 (2) A person shall not intentionally disclose to any person
- 10 any information that he or she knows was provided under this act,
- 11 except as authorized under this act. Information provided under
- 12 this act and information entered in NPLEx under this act is not
- 13 subject to disclosure under the freedom of information act, 1976 PA
- 14 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 15 (3) A person who discloses information in violation of
- 16 subsection (2) is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by
- 17 imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not more than
- 18 \$500.00, or both.
- 19 Enacting section 1. This act takes effect January 1, 2015.
- 20 Enacting section 2. This act does not take effect unless
- 21 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. (request no. 02722'13
- 22 a) of the 97th Legislature is enacted into law.
