## **HOUSE BILL No. 4156**

January 31, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Potvin, Lauwers, Hooker, Bumstead, Lane, Johnson, O'Brien, Foster, Shirkey and Franz and referred to the Committee on Health Policy.

A bill to amend 1978 PA 368, entitled

"Public health code,"

by amending sections 16184 and 16185 (MCL 333.16184 and 333.16185), as amended by 2012 PA 4.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 16184. (1) An individual who is retired from the active
- 2 practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric
- 3 medicine and surgery, NURSING, optometry, or dentistry and who
- 4 wishes to donate his or her expertise for the medical, optometric,
- 5 or dental care and treatment of indigent and needy individuals in
- 5 this state or for the medical, optometric, or dental care and
- 7 treatment of individuals in medically underserved areas of this
- 8 state may obtain a special volunteer license to engage in the
- practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric

- 1 medicine and surgery, NURSING, optometry, or dentistry by
- 2 submitting an application to the board pursuant to UNDER this
- 3 section. An application for a special volunteer license shall be on
- 4 a form provided by the department and shall include each of the
- 5 following:
- 6 (a) Documentation that the individual has been previously
- 7 licensed to engage in the practice of medicine, osteopathic
- 8 medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery, NURSING,
- 9 optometry, or dentistry in this state and that his or her license
- 10 was in good standing prior to the expiration AT THE TIME of his or
- 11 her license EXPIRED.
- 12 (b) Acknowledgment and documentation that the applicant will
- 13 not receive any payment or compensation, either direct or indirect,
- 14 or have the expectation of any payment or compensation, for any
- 15 medical, NURSING, optometric, or dental care services provided
- 16 under the special volunteer license.
- 17 (c) If the applicant has been out of practice for 3 or more
- 18 years, documentation that, during the 3 years immediately preceding
- 19 the application, he or she has attended at least 2/3 of the
- 20 continuing education courses or programs required under part 170,
- 21 175, 180, 172, 174, or 166 for the renewal of a license.
- 22 (2) If the board determines that the application of the
- 23 individual satisfies the requirements of subsection (1) and that
- 24 the individual meets the requirements for a license as prescribed
- 25 by UNDER this article and rules promulgated under this article, the
- 26 board shall grant a special volunteer license to the applicant. A
- 27 licensee seeking renewal under this section shall provide the board

- 1 with an updated acknowledgment and documentation as described under
- 2 subsection (1)(b). Except as otherwise provided under this
- 3 subsection, the board shall not charge a fee for the issuance or
- 4 renewal of a special volunteer license under this section.
- 5 (3) Except as otherwise provided under this—IN subsection, an
- 6 individual who is granted a special volunteer license pursuant to
- 7 UNDER this section and who accepts the privilege of practicing
- 8 medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and
- 9 surgery, NURSING, optometry, or dentistry in this state is subject
- 10 to all of the provisions of this article, including those
- 11 provisions concerning continuing education and disciplinary action.
- 12 (4) For purposes of this section, an individual is considered
- 13 retired from practice if the individual's license has expired with
- 14 the individual's intention of ceasing to engage, FOR REMUNERATION,
- 15 in the practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery,
- 16 podiatric medicine and surgery, NURSING, optometry, or dentistry.
- 17 <u>for remuneration</u>.
- 18 (5) An individual who is granted a special volunteer license
- 19 under this section shall only engage in activities within the scope
- 20 of practice of the profession for which he or she was licensed
- 21 prior to BEFORE HIS OR HER retirement.
- 22 (6) AS USED IN THIS SECTION AND SECTION 16185:
- 23 (A) "PRACTICE OF DENTISTRY" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 24 SECTION 16601.
- 25 (B) "PRACTICE OF MEDICINE" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 26 SECTION 17001.
- 27 (C) "PRACTICE OF NURSING" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN

- 1 SECTION 17201.
- 2 (D) "PRACTICE OF OPTOMETRY" MEANS THAT TERM AS DEFINED IN
- 3 SECTION 17401.
- 4 (E) "PRACTICE OF OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY" MEANS THAT
- 5 TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 17501.
- 6 (F) "PRACTICE OF PODIATRIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY" MEANS THAT
- 7 TERM AS DEFINED IN SECTION 18001.
- 8 Sec. 16185. (1) Subject to subsection (2), an individual who
- 9 provides care under a special volunteer license to engage in the
- 10 practice of medicine, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric
- 11 medicine and surgery, NURSING, optometry, or dentistry granted
- 12 under section 16184 is not liable in a civil action for personal
- 13 injury or death proximately caused by the professional negligence
- 14 or malpractice of the individual in providing the care if both of
- 15 the following apply:
- 16 (a) The care is provided at a health facility or agency that
- 17 provides at least 75% of its care annually to medically indigent
- 18 individuals.
- 19 (b) The individual does not receive and does not intend to
- 20 receive compensation for providing the care.
- 21 (2) Subsection (1) does not apply if the negligent conduct or
- 22 malpractice of the individual is gross negligence.
- 23 (3) As used in this section:
- 24 (a) "Gross negligence" means conduct so reckless as to
- 25 demonstrate a substantial lack of concern for whether an injury
- 26 results.
- (b) "Medically indigent individual" means that term as defined

1 in section 106 of the social welfare act, 1939 PA 280, MCL 400.106.
