HOUSE BILL No. 4304

February 21, 2013, Introduced by Rep. Kurtz and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1980 PA 299, entitled "Occupational code,"

by amending section 1810 (MCL 339.1810), as amended by 2006 PA 300.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1810. (1) A person shall be IS subject to the penalties

 of article 6 if the person commits 1—ANY of the following:
- 3 (a) Solicitation of a dead human body by IF THE PERSON IS a
- 4 licensed person or an agent, assistant, representative, employee,5 or person acting on behalf and with the knowledge and consent,
- 6 express or implied, of the licensed person, DOING ANY OF THE
- 7 FOLLOWING:
 - (i) SOLICITING A DEAD HUMAN BODY, whether the solicitation occurs after death or while death is impending. ; or the procuring

- 1 (ii) PROCURING or allowing directly or indirectly of ALLOWING a
- 2 person to call upon ON an institution or individual by whose
- 3 influence—THAT MAY HAVE INFLUENCE OVER A DECISION TO TURN OVER a
- 4 dead human body may be turned over to the licensed person or A
- 5 funeral establishment.
- 6 (b) Procuring a person, known as A capper, steerer, or
- 7 solicitor, to obtain funeral directing or embalming; or allowing or
- 8 permitting a capper, steerer, or solicitor to obtain funeral
- 9 directing or embalming for a licensed person or funeral
- 10 establishment.
- 11 (c) The direct or indirect payment or offer of payment of a
- 12 commission by IF THE PERSON IS a licensed person or an agent,
- 13 representative, assistant, or employee of the licensed person,
- 14 DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY PAYING OR OFFERING TO PAY A COMMISSION for
- 15 the purpose of securing business.
- 16 (d) Aiding or abetting an unlicensed person to engage in the
- 17 practice of funeral directing or embalming.
- 18 (e) Using profane, indecent, or obscene language in the
- 19 presence of a dead human body, or within the immediate hearing of
- 20 the family or relatives of a deceased, whose IF THE body has not
- 21 yet been interred or otherwise disposed of.
- 22 (f) Solicitation or acceptance by IF THE PERSON IS a licensed
- 23 person, of SOLICITING OR ACCEPTING a commission or bonus or rebate
- 24 in consideration of recommending or causing a dead human body to be
- 25 disposed of in a crematory, mausoleum, or cemetery.
- 26 (g) Using a casket or part of a casket which THAT has been
- 27 previously used as a receptacle for, or in connection with, the

- 1 burial or other disposition of a dead human body.
- 2 (h) A violation of a state law or municipal or county
- 3 ordinance or regulation affecting the handling, custody, care or
- 4 transportation of a dead human body.
- 5 (i) Refusing to promptly surrender the custody of a dead human
- 6 body , upon AFTER RECEIVING the express order of the person
- 7 lawfully entitled to the THAT custody.
- 8 (j) Failure to secure a permit for removal or burial of a dead
- 9 human body before interment or disposal.
- 10 (k) Obtaining possession or embalming a dead human body
- 11 without first being expressly directed or authorized to do so by a
- 12 relative of the deceased person or a person entitled to custody OF
- 13 THE BODY.
- 14 (l) Knowingly making a false statement on a certificate of
- 15 death.
- 16 (m) Removing or embalming a dead human body if there is
- 17 information indicating crime or violence in connection with the
- 18 cause of death, unless permission of the county medical examiner
- 19 has—IS first been—obtained.
- 20 (n) If **THE PERSON IS** a public officer or employee, an official
- 21 of a public institution, convalescent home, private nursing home,
- 22 maternity home, public or private hospital, physician or surgeon,
- 23 or any other person having a professional relationship with a
- 24 decedent or county medical examiner or other public official having
- 25 temporary custody of the decedent, sending or causing to be sent to
- 26 a person or establishment licensed under this article the remains
- 27 of a deceased person without having first made MAKING inquiry as to

- 1 the desires of the person with authority over the disposal of the
- 2 remains of the decedent under section 3206 of the estates and
- 3 protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.3206, and of the
- 4 person who may be chargeable with the funeral expenses of the
- 5 decedent. If a person with authority over the disposal of the
- 6 remains of the decedent under section 3206 of the estates and
- 7 protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.3206, is found,
- 8 the person's authority and directions shall govern the disposal of
- 9 the remains of the decedent.
- 10 (o) If THE PERSON IS a licensee, receiving remains in
- 11 violation of the requirements of subdivision (n) and making a
- 12 charge for a service in connection with the remains before the
- 13 delivery of the remains as stipulated by the person with authority
- 14 over the disposal of the remains of the decedent under section 3206
- 15 of the estates and protected individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL
- 16 700.3206. This subdivision shall DOES not prevent a person or
- 17 establishment licensed under this article from charging and being
- 18 reimbursed for services rendered in connection with the removal of
- 19 the remains of a deceased person in case of accidental or violent
- 20 death, and OR rendering necessary services required until the
- 21 person with authority over the disposal of the remains of the
- 22 decedent under section 3206 of the estates and protected
- 23 individuals code, 1998 PA 386, MCL 700.3206, or the person who is
- 24 chargeable with the funeral expenses is notified.
- 25 (p) If **THE PERSON IS** a funeral establishment or a licensee,
- 26 entering upon—INTO an agreement, directly or indirectly, in which
- 27 the practice of embalming or funeral directing is to be rendered in

- 1 consideration for the **DESIGNATION OF THE** funeral establishment, **THE**
- 2 licensed person, or an agent, assistant, or representative of the
- 3 establishment or licensed person, being designated as beneficiary
- 4 in an insurance policy or certificate. This subdivision does not
- 5 govern or limit the authority of a personal representative,
- 6 trustee, or other person who has a fiduciary relationship with the
- 7 deceased.

- 10 (R) FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE PREPAID FUNERAL AND CEMETERY
- 11 SALES ACT, 1986 PA 255, MCL 328.211 TO 328.235.
- 12 (2) The department, in consultation with the director of
- 13 public THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY health, shall promulgate rules
- 14 to prescribe training standards for licensees and nonlicensees who
- 15 handle medical waste in a funeral establishment.
- 16 (3) A licensee who owns or operates a funeral establishment
- 17 shall train his or her employees pursuant to the rules promulgated
- 18 under subsection (2).
- 19 (4) IF A PERSON LICENSED UNDER THIS ARTICLE IS CONVICTED OF
- 20 CONVERSION OR EMBEZZLEMENT OF FUNDS RECEIVED UNDER THE PREPAID
- 21 FUNERAL AND CEMETERY SALES ACT, 1986 PA 255, MCL 328.211 TO
- 22 328.235, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVOKE THAT LICENSE, AND THE PERSON
- 23 SHALL NOT APPLY FOR AND THE DEPARTMENT SHALL NOT GRANT A LICENSE
- 24 UNDER THIS ARTICLE FOR AT LEAST 5 YEARS AFTER THE REVOCATION.
