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HOUSE BILL No. 4372

March 6, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Pettalia, McMillin, McBroom, Genetski, Franz, Somerville, Shirkey and Johnson and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to designate English as the official state language; to require the use of English in certain documents and at certain public meetings; and to provide the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies and officials.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. English is designated as the official language of this
 state.
- 3 Sec. 2. English shall be the language used for all of the 4 following:
 - (a) Each public record, as defined in section 2 of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.232.
 - (b) Each public meeting, as defined in section 2 of the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.262.
 - (c) Official acts of this state, including those governmental documents, records, meetings, actions, or policies that are legally

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- 1 enforceable in this state.
- 2 Sec. 3. This act shall not be construed in any way to deny a
- 3 person's rights under the state constitution of 1963 or the
- 4 constitution of the United States or any state or federal law as a
- 5 result of that person's inability to communicate in English.
- 6 Sec. 4. (1) In addition to printing official documents and
- 7 forms in English, a state agency or a local unit of government may
- 8 use or print official documents and forms in languages other than
- 9 English.
- 10 (2) A document filed or recorded with a state agency or with a
- 11 local unit of government shall be in English or, if the original
- 12 document is in a language other than English, an English
- 13 translation of the document shall be simultaneously filed.
- Sec. 5. (1) This act does not apply under any of the following
- 15 circumstances:
- 16 (a) If there is a conflict with federal law.
- 17 (b) If the public safety, health, or justice requires the use
- 18 of languages other than English.
- 19 (2) This act does not apply to any of the following:
- (a) Instruction designed to teach the speaking, reading, or
- 21 writing of foreign languages.
- 22 (b) Instruction designed to aid students with limited English
- 23 proficiency in their transition and integration into the education
- 24 system of the state.
- 25 (c) The promotion of international commerce, tourism, sporting
- 26 events, or cultural events.
