## **HOUSE BILL No. 4619**

April 24, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Singh, Tlaib, Irwin, Zemke, Dillon, Knezek, Schor and Ananich and referred to the Committee on Transportation and Infrastructure.

A bill to amend 1949 PA 300, entitled

"Michigan vehicle code,"

by amending section 307 (MCL 257.307), as amended by 2012 PA 55.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 307. (1) If an applicant for an operator's license or
- 2 chauffeur's license is a citizen of the United States, the
- 3 applicant shall supply a photographic identity document, a birth
- 4 certificate, or other sufficient documents as the secretary of
- 5 state may require to verify the identity and citizenship of the
- 6 applicant. If an applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's
- 7 license is not a citizen of the United States, the applicant
- 8 shall supply a photographic identity document and other
- 9 sufficient documents to verify the identity of the applicant and

- 1 the applicant's legal presence OR DEFERRED STATUS in the United
- 2 States under subdivision (b). The documents required under this
- 3 subsection shall include the applicant's full legal name, date of
- 4 birth, and address and residency and demonstrate that the
- 5 applicant is a citizen of the United States, or is legally
- 6 present in the United States, OR HAS DEFERRED STATUS IN THE
- 7 UNITED STATES. If the applicant's full legal name differs from
- 8 the name of the applicant that appears on a document presented
- 9 under this subsection, the applicant shall present documents to
- 10 verify his or her current full legal name. The secretary of state
- 11 shall accept as 1 of the required identification documents an
- 12 identification card issued by the department of corrections to
- 13 prisoners who are placed on parole or released from a
- 14 correctional facility, containing the prisoner's legal name,
- 15 photograph, and other information identifying the prisoner as
- 16 provided in section 37(4) of the corrections code of 1953, 1953
- 17 PA 232, MCL 791.237. An application for an operator's or
- 18 chauffeur's license shall be made in a manner prescribed by the
- 19 secretary of state and shall contain all of the following:
- (a) The applicant's full legal name, date of birth,
- 21 residence address, height, sex, eye color, signature, intent to
- 22 make an anatomical gift, other information required or permitted
- 23 on the license under this chapter, and, only to the extent
- 24 required to comply with federal law, the applicant's social
- 25 security number. The applicant may provide a mailing address if
- 26 the applicant receives mail at an address different from his or
- 27 her residence address.

- 1 (b) If the applicant is not a citizen of the United States,
- 2 the applicant shall provide, and the department shall verify,
- 3 documents demonstrating his or her legal presence in the United
- 4 States OR DEFERRED STATUS IN THE UNITED STATES. Nothing in this
- 5 act shall obligate or be construed to obligate this state to
- 6 comply with title II of the real ID act of 2005, Public Law 109-
- 7 13. The secretary of state may adopt rules under the
- 8 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- 9 24.328, as are necessary for the administration of this
- 10 subdivision. A determination by the secretary of state that an
- 11 applicant is not legally present in the United States OR DOES NOT
- 12 HAVE DEFERRED STATUS IN THE UNITED STATES may be appealed under
- 13 section 631 of the revised judicature act of 1961, 1961 PA 236,
- **14** MCL 600.631.
- 15 (c) The following notice shall be included to inform the
- 16 applicant that under sections 5090 and 509r of the Michigan
- 17 election law, 1954 PA 116, MCL 168.5090 and 168.509r, the
- 18 secretary of state is required to use the residence address
- 19 provided on this application as the applicant's residence address
- 20 on the qualified voter file for voter registration and voting:
- 21 "NOTICE: Michigan law requires that the same address
- 22 be used for voter registration and driver license
- purposes. Therefore, if the residence address
- you provide in this application differs from your
- voter registration address as it appears on the
- 26 qualified voter file, the secretary of state
- 27 will automatically change your voter registration

- 1 to match the residence address on this application,
- after which your voter registration at your former
- address will no longer be valid for voting purposes.
- 4 A new voter registration card, containing the
- 5 information of your polling place, will be provided
- 6 to you by the clerk of the jurisdiction where your
- 7 residence address is located.".
- **8** (d) For an original or renewal operator's or chauffeur's
- 9 license with a vehicle group designation or indorsement, the
- 10 names of all states where the applicant has been licensed to
- 11 drive any type of motor vehicle during the previous 10 years.
- 12 (e) For an operator's or chauffeur's license with a vehicle
- 13 group designation or indorsement, the following certifications by
- 14 the applicant:
- 15 (i) The applicant meets the applicable federal driver
- 16 qualification requirements under 49 CFR parts 383 and 391 if the
- 17 applicant operates or intends to operate in interstate commerce
- 18 or meets the applicable qualifications of the department of state
- 19 police under the motor carrier safety act of 1963, 1963 PA 181,
- 20 MCL 480.11 to 480.25, if the applicant operates or intends to
- 21 operate in intrastate commerce.
- 22 (ii) The vehicle in which the applicant will take the driving
- 23 skills tests is representative of the type of vehicle the
- 24 applicant operates or intends to operate.
- 25 (iii) The applicant is not subject to disqualification by the
- 26 United States secretary of transportation, or a suspension,
- 27 revocation, or cancellation under any state law for conviction of

- 1 an offense described in section 312f or 319b.
- 2 (iv) The applicant does not have a driver's license from more
- 3 than 1 state or jurisdiction.
- 4 (f) An applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's license
- 5 with a vehicle group designation and a hazardous material
- 6 indorsement shall provide his or her fingerprints as prescribed
- 7 by state and federal law.
- 8 (2) An applicant for an operator's or chauffeur's license
- 9 may have his or her image and signature captured or reproduced
- 10 when the application for the license is made. The secretary of
- 11 state shall acquire equipment purchased or leased under this
- 12 section under standard purchasing procedures of the department of
- 13 technology, management, and budget based on standards and
- 14 specifications established by the secretary of state. The
- 15 secretary of state shall not purchase or lease equipment until an
- 16 appropriation for the equipment has been made by the legislature.
- 17 A digital photographic image and signature captured under this
- 18 section shall appear on the applicant's operator's license or
- 19 chauffeur's license. A person's digital photographic image and
- 20 signature shall be used as follows:
- 21 (a) By a federal, state, or local governmental agency for a
- 22 law enforcement purpose authorized by law.
- (b) By the secretary of state for a use specifically
- 24 authorized by law.
- 25 (c) By the secretary of state for forwarding to the
- 26 department of state police the images of persons required to be
- 27 registered under the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295,

- 1 MCL 28.721 to 28.736, upon the department of state police
- 2 providing the secretary of state an updated list of the names of
- 3 those persons.
- 4 (d) As necessary to comply with a law of this state or of
- 5 the United States.
- 6 (3) An application shall contain a signature or verification
- 7 and certification by the applicant, as determined by the
- 8 secretary of state, and shall be accompanied by the proper fee.
- 9 The secretary of state shall collect the application fee with the
- 10 application. The secretary of state shall refund the application
- 11 fee to the applicant if the license applied for is denied, but
- 12 shall not refund the fee to an applicant who fails to complete
- 13 the examination requirements of the secretary of state within 90
- 14 days after the date of application for a license.
- 15 (4) In conjunction with the application for an operator's
- 16 license or chauffeur's license, the secretary of state shall do
- 17 all of the following:
- (a) Provide the applicant with all of the following:
- 19 (i) Information explaining the applicant's right to make an
- 20 anatomical gift in the event of death in accordance with section
- **21** 310.
- 22 (ii) Information describing the anatomical gift donor
- 23 registry program under part 101 of the public health code, 1978
- 24 PA 368, MCL 333.10101 to 333.10123. The information required
- 25 under this subparagraph includes the address and telephone number
- 26 of Michigan's federally designated organ procurement organization
- 27 or its successor organization as defined in section 10102 of the

- 1 public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10102.
- 2 (iii) Information giving the applicant the opportunity to be
- 3 placed on the donor registry described in subparagraph (ii).
- 4 (b) Provide the applicant with the opportunity to specify on
- 5 his or her operator's or chauffeur's license that he or she is
- 6 willing to make an anatomical gift in the event of death in
- 7 accordance with section 310.
- 8 (c) Inform the applicant that, if he or she indicates to the
- 9 secretary of state under this section a willingness to have his
- 10 or her name placed on the donor registry described in subdivision
- 11 (a) (ii), the secretary of state will mark the applicant's record
- 12 for the donor registry.
- 13 (5) The secretary of state may fulfill the requirements of
- 14 subsection (4) by 1 or more of the following methods:
- 15 (a) Providing printed material enclosed with a mailed notice
- 16 for an operator's or chauffeur's license renewal or the issuance
- 17 of an operator's or chauffeur's license.
- (b) Providing printed material to an applicant who
- 19 personally appears at a secretary of state branch office.
- 20 (c) Through electronic information transmittals for
- 21 operator's and chauffeur's licenses processed by electronic
- 22 means.
- 23 (6) The secretary of state shall maintain a record of an
- 24 individual who indicates a willingness to have his or her name
- 25 placed on the donor registry described in subsection (4)(a)(ii).
- 26 Information about an applicant's indication of a willingness to
- 27 have his or her name placed on the donor registry that is

- 1 obtained by the secretary of state under subsection (4) and
- 2 forwarded under subsection (14) is exempt from disclosure under
- 3 section 13(1)(d) of the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- 4 MCL 15.243.
- 5 (7) If an application is received from a person previously
- 6 licensed in another jurisdiction, the secretary of state shall
- 7 request a copy of the applicant's driving record and other
- 8 available information from the national driver register. When
- 9 received, the driving record and other available information
- 10 become a part of the driver's record in this state.
- (8) If an application is received for an original, renewal,
- 12 or upgrade of a vehicle group designation or indorsement, the
- 13 secretary of state shall request the person's complete driving
- 14 record from all states where the applicant was previously
- 15 licensed to drive any type of motor vehicle over the last 10
- 16 years before issuing a vehicle group designation or indorsement
- 17 to the applicant. If the applicant does not hold a valid
- 18 commercial motor vehicle driver license from a state where he or
- 19 she was licensed in the last 10 years, this complete driving
- 20 record request must be made not earlier than 24 hours before the
- 21 secretary of state issues the applicant a vehicle group
- 22 designation or indorsement. For all other drivers, this request
- 23 must be made not earlier than 10 days before the secretary of
- 24 state issues the applicant a vehicle group designation or
- 25 indorsement. The secretary of state shall also check the
- 26 applicant's driving record with the national driver register and
- 27 the federal commercial driver license information system before

- 1 issuing that group designation or indorsement. If the application
- 2 is for the renewal of a vehicle group designation or indorsement,
- 3 and if the secretary of state enters on the person's historical
- 4 driving record maintained under section 204a a notation that the
- 5 request was made and the date of the request, the secretary of
- 6 state is required to request the applicant's complete driving
- 7 record from other states only once under this section.
- 8 (9) Except for a vehicle group designation or indorsement or
- 9 as provided in this subsection or section 314(5), the secretary
- 10 of state may issue a renewal operator's or chauffeur's license
- 11 for 1 additional 4-year period or until the person is no longer
- 12 determined to be legally present under this section by mail or by
- 13 other methods prescribed by the secretary of state. The secretary
- 14 of state may check the applicant's driving record through the
- 15 national driver register and the commercial driver license
- 16 information system before issuing a license under this section.
- 17 The secretary of state shall issue a renewal license only in
- 18 person if the person is a person required under section 5a of the
- 19 sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295, MCL 28.725a, to
- 20 maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's license or official
- 21 state personal identification card. If a license is renewed by
- 22 mail or by other method, the secretary of state shall issue
- 23 evidence of renewal to indicate the date the license expires in
- 24 the future. The department of state police shall provide to the
- 25 secretary of state updated lists of persons required under
- 26 section 5a of the sex offenders registration act, 1994 PA 295,
- 27 MCL 28.725a, to maintain a valid operator's or chauffeur's

- 1 license or official state personal identification card.
- 2 (10) Upon request, the secretary of state shall provide an
- 3 information manual to an applicant explaining how to obtain a
- 4 vehicle group designation or indorsement. The manual shall
- 5 contain the information required under 49 CFR part 383.
- 6 (11) The secretary of state shall not disclose a social
- 7 security number obtained under subsection (1) to another person
- 8 except for use for 1 or more of the following purposes:
- 9 (a) Compliance with 49 USC 31301 to 31317 and regulations
- 10 and state law and rules related to this chapter.
- 11 (b) To carry out the purposes of section 466(a) of the
- 12 social security act, 42 USC 666, in connection with matters
- 13 relating to paternity, child support, or overdue child support.
- 14 (c) To check an applicant's driving record through the
- 15 national driver register and the commercial driver license
- 16 information system when issuing a license under this act.
- 17 (d) With the department of community health, for comparison
- 18 with vital records maintained by the department of community
- 19 health under part 28 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL
- 20 333.2801 to 333.2899.
- (e) As otherwise required by law.
- 22 (12) The secretary of state shall not display a person's
- 23 social security number on the person's operator's or chauffeur's
- 24 license.
- 25 (13) A requirement under this section to include a social
- 26 security number on an application does not apply to an applicant
- 27 who demonstrates he or she is exempt under law from obtaining a

- 1 social security number.
- 2 (14) As required in section 10120 of the public health code,
- 3 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.10120, the secretary of state shall maintain
- 4 the donor registry in a manner that provides electronic access,
- 5 including, but not limited to, the transfer of data to this
- 6 state's federally designated organ procurement organization or
- 7 its successor organization, tissue banks, and eye banks, in a
- 8 manner that complies with that section.
- 9 (15) The secretary of state, with the approval of the state
- 10 administrative board created under 1921 PA 2, MCL 17.1 to 17.3,
- 11 may enter into agreements with the United States government to
- 12 verify whether an applicant for an operator's license or a
- 13 chauffeur's license under this section who is not a citizen of
- 14 the United States is authorized under federal law to be present
- 15 in the United States.
- 16 (16) The secretary of state shall not issue an operator's
- 17 license or a chauffeur's license to a person holding an
- 18 operator's license or chauffeur's license issued by another state
- 19 without confirmation that the person is terminating or has
- 20 terminated the operator's license or chauffeur's license issued
- 21 by the other state.
- 22 (17) The secretary of state shall do all of the following:
- (a) Ensure the physical security of locations where
- 24 operator's licenses and chauffeur's licenses are produced and the
- 25 security of document materials and papers from which operator's
- 26 licenses and chauffeur's licenses are produced.
- (b) Subject all persons authorized to manufacture or produce

- 1 operator's licenses or chauffeur's licenses and all persons who
- 2 have the ability to affect the identity information that appears
- 3 on operator's licenses or chauffeur's licenses to appropriate
- 4 security clearance requirements. The security requirements of
- 5 this subdivision and subdivision (a) may require that licenses be
- 6 manufactured or produced in this state.
- 7 (c) Provide fraudulent document recognition programs to
- 8 department of state employees engaged in the issuance of
- 9 operator's licenses and chauffeur's licenses.
- 10 (18) The secretary of state shall have electronic access to
- 11 prisoner information maintained by the department of corrections
- 12 for the purpose of verifying the identity of a prisoner who
- 13 applies for an operator's or chauffeur's license under subsection
- **14** (1).
- 15 (19) AS USED IN THIS SECTION, "DEFERRED STATUS" MEANS THAT
- 16 THE INDIVIDUAL HAS BEEN GRANTED A DEFERRAL FROM PROSECUTION FOR
- 17 UNLAWFUL STATUS IN THE UNITED STATES BY THE UNITED STATES
- 18 DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY THROUGH THE FEDERAL EXECUTIVE
- 19 BRANCH PROGRAM KNOWN AS DEFERRED ACTION FOR CHILDHOOD ARRIVALS
- 20 (DACA).
