## **HOUSE BILL No. 4621**

April 24, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Dillon, Tlaib, Irwin, Zemke, Singh, Schor, Hovey-Wright, Santana, Robinson, Stallworth, Lipton, Rutledge and Ananich and referred to the Committee on Government Operations.

A bill to create a commission to study the impact of 2008 PA 7, 2008 PA 31, 2011 PA 158, and 2011 PA 159; to provide for certain powers and duties for state agencies; and to provide for the issuance of certain reports and recommendations.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- (a) "Commission" means the commission created under section 2 to assess the economic, social, and security impact of the legal presence requirement.
  - (b) "Legal presence requirement" means all of the following:
- (i) Requiring an applicant for an operator's license and chauffer's license to submit documentation to prove that he or she

- 1 is a citizen of the United States or legally present in the United
- 2 States as required under 2008 PA 7 and 2011 PA 159.
- 3 (ii) Requiring an applicant for an official state personal
- 4 identification card to submit documentation to prove that he or she
- 5 is a citizen of the United States or legally present in the United
- 6 States as required by 2008 PA 31 and 2011 PA 158.
- 7 Sec. 2. (1) The commission is created within the department of
- 8 civil rights in conjunction with the Michigan economic development
- 9 corporation.
- 10 (2) The commission consists of all of the following:
- 11 (a) The director of the department of agriculture and rural
- 12 development or his or her designee.
- 13 (b) The chair of the civil rights commission or his or her
- 14 designee.
- 15 (c) The director of the department of community health or his
- 16 or her designee.
- 17 (d) The director of the department of human services or his or
- 18 her designee.
- 19 (e) The director of the department of licensing and regulatory
- 20 affairs or his or her designee.
- 21 (f) The chief executive officer of the Michigan economic
- 22 development corporation or his or her designee.
- 23 (g) The secretary of state or his or her designee.
- 24 (h) The chairperson of the Hispanic/Latino commission of
- 25 Michigan or his or her designee.
- 26 (i) The chairperson of the Asian Pacific American affairs
- 27 commission or his or her designee.

- 1 (j) Three additional members, appointed by the governor as
- 2 follows:
- 3 (i) One representative of the insurance industry.
- 4 (ii) One representative of the agricultural industry.
- 5 (iii) One member of the advisory council on Arab and Chaldean
- 6 American affairs.
- 7 (3) The members first appointed to the commission shall be
- 8 appointed within 60 days after the effective date of this act.
- 9 (4) Members of the commission shall serve for a term of 3
- 10 years.
- 11 (5) If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the person who
- 12 appointed the member shall make an appointment for the unexpired
- 13 term in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 14 (6) The person who appointed the member may remove a member of
- 15 the commission for incompetency, dereliction of duty, malfeasance,
- 16 misfeasance, or nonfeasance in office, or any other good cause.
- 17 (7) The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the
- 18 chair of the civil rights commission in consultation with the chief
- 19 executive officer of the Michigan economic development corporation.
- 20 At the first meeting, the commission shall elect from among its
- 21 members a chairperson and other officers as it considers necessary
- 22 or appropriate. After the first meeting, the commission shall meet
- 23 at least monthly until it issues the report under subsection (13),
- 24 or more frequently at the call of the chairperson or if requested
- 25 by 3 or more members.
- 26 (8) A majority of the members of the commission constitute a
- 27 quorum for the transaction of business at a meeting of the

- 1 commission. A majority of the members present and serving are
- 2 required for official action of the commission.
- 3 (9) The business that the commission may perform shall be
- 4 conducted at a public meeting of the commission held in compliance
- 5 with the open meetings act, 1976 PA 267, MCL 15.261 to 15.275.
- 6 (10) A writing prepared, owned, used, in the possession of, or
- 7 retained by the commission in the performance of an official
- 8 function is subject to the freedom of information act, 1976 PA 442,
- **9** MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 10 (11) Members of the commission shall serve without
- 11 compensation. However, members of the commission may be reimbursed
- 12 for reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance
- 13 of their official duties as members of the commission.
- 14 (12) The commission shall do all of the following:
- 15 (a) Determine if the department of state promulgated rules to
- 16 implement the legal presence requirement pursuant to the
- 17 administrative procedures act of 1969, 1969 PA 306, MCL 24.201 to
- **18** 24.328.
- 19 (b) Determine if the department of state has administered the
- 20 legal presence requirement fairly and efficiently.
- 21 (c) Evaluate how the legal presence requirement has affected
- 22 individuals relating to citizenship and immigration status.
- 23 (d) Assess the economic impact the legal presence requirement
- 24 is having on this state. The assessment under this subdivision
- 25 includes, but is not limited to, the legal presence requirement's
- 26 impact on the insurance industry and the agricultural industry.
- (e) Assess the legal presence requirement's impact on public

- 1 safety and security.
- 2 (f) Assess the legal presence requirement's impact on the
- 3 delivery of health and human services in this state.
- 4 (g) Develop findings and recommendations related to the topics
- 5 listed in subdivisions (a) to (f), including suggestions for
- 6 legislation it considers appropriate.
- 7 (13) Not later than 18 months after the effective date of this
- 8 act, the commission shall issue a report of its findings and
- 9 recommendations to the legislature.
- 10 (14) In connection with its duties under this section, the
- 11 commission may issue subpoenas, direct the service of the subpoena
- 12 by any police officer, and compel the attendance and testimony of
- witnesses; administer oaths and examine any person as necessary;
- 14 and compel the production of books, accounts, papers, documents,
- 15 and records. The orders and subpoenas the commission issues may be
- 16 enforced upon application to any circuit court as provided by law.
