HOUSE BILL No. 4690

May 2, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Graves and Denby and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1982 PA 44, entitled "Polygraph protection act of 1981," by amending section 3 (MCL 37.203).

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 3. (1) Except as provided in this section, an employer or employment agency shall not as a condition of employment, promotion, or change in status of employment, or as an express or implied condition of a benefit or privilege of employment, do any of the following:
 - (a) Request or require that an employee or applicant for employment take or submit to a polygraph examination.
 - (b) Administer, cause to be administered, threaten to administer, or attempt to administer a polygraph examination to an
