## **HOUSE BILL No. 4846**

June 18, 2013, Introduced by Rep. Foster and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to establish and provide for the administration of the early graduation achievement scholarship program; to create the early graduation achievement scholarship fund; and to provide for the powers and duties of certain state officers and entities.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "early 2 graduation achievement scholarship act".
  - Sec. 2. As used in this act:
  - (a) "Academic year" means the period from September 1 of a calendar year to August 31 of the next calendar year.
  - (b) "Approved postsecondary educational institution" means any of the following:

- 1 (i) A public or private college or university, junior college,
- 2 or community college that grants degrees or certificates and is
- 3 located in this state.
- 4 (ii) A postsecondary educational institution, other than an
- 5 educational institution described in subparagraph (i), that is
- 6 located in this state, grants degrees, certificates, or other
- 7 recognized credentials, and is designated by the department as an
- 8 approved postsecondary educational institution.
- 9 (iii) A service academy.
- 10 (c) "Department" means the department of treasury.
- 11 (d) "Early graduation achievement scholarship" means a
- 12 scholarship awarded by the department under this act.
- (e) "Fiscal year" means a fiscal year of this state. A fiscal
- 14 year begins on October 1 of a calendar year and ends on September
- 15 30 of the next calendar year.
- 16 (f) "Fund" means the early graduation achievement scholarship
- 17 fund created in section 3.
- 18 (g) "Service academy" means the United States military
- 19 academy, United States naval academy, United States air force
- 20 academy, United States coast guard academy, or United States
- 21 merchant marine academy.
- (h) "Tuition" means the quarter or semester charges imposed to
- 23 attend an approved postsecondary educational institution, and all
- 24 mandatory fees required as a condition of enrollment at that
- 25 institution, as determined by the department.
- 26 Sec. 3. (1) The early graduation achievement scholarship fund
- 27 is established in the department of treasury. The fund shall

- 1 consist of money deposited into the fund under section 21q of the
- 2 state school aid act of 1979, 1979 PA 94, MCL 388.1621g; money
- 3 allocated, donated, or paid to the fund from any other source; and
- 4 interest and earnings from fund investments.
- 5 (2) The state treasurer shall direct the investment of the
- 6 fund.
- 7 (3) Money in the fund at the close of a fiscal year shall
- 8 remain in the fund and shall not revert to the general fund.
- 9 (4) Money in the fund shall be disbursed for grants under this
- 10 act and the administrative costs of the department and the
- 11 department of treasury in implementing and administering this act.
- 12 Sec. 4. (1) The early graduation achievement scholarship
- 13 program is established. The department shall provide early
- 14 graduation achievement scholarships under this act from the fund
- 15 and administer the early graduation achievement scholarship
- 16 program.
- 17 (2) Subject to subsection (3), each student who completes the
- 18 requirements for a high school diploma, and ceases to attend high
- 19 school, in 7 semesters or 11 trimesters of high school or fewer, is
- 20 eligible for the award of an early graduation achievement
- 21 scholarship in an amount determined under section 5.
- 22 (3) In addition to the requirements set forth in subsection
- 23 (2), the department must find that a student meets all of the
- 24 following eligibility requirements to award the student an early
- 25 graduation achievement scholarship under this act:
- 26 (a) The department has received a completed application for
- 27 payment as described in section 6(1), including the certification

- 1 described in section 6(2), on or before November 15 of the state
- 2 fiscal year in which he or she is eligible to receive payment.
- 3 (b) The student attended high school in this state for at
- 4 least 4 semesters or 6 trimesters, has ceased to attend high
- 5 school, and is a resident of this state.
- 6 (c) The student is enrolled in an approved postsecondary
- 7 educational institution, and first enrolled in that institution
- 8 within 2 years after he or she ceased to attend high school. The
- 9 department shall extend the 2-year period if the student becomes a
- 10 member of the United States armed forces or peace corps during the
- 11 2-year period.
- Sec. 5. (1) Subject to subsection (2), a student who meets the
- 13 eliqibility requirement under section 4 shall receive an early
- 14 graduation achievement scholarship in the amount of \$2,500.00.
- 15 (2) If in any fiscal year the department determines that the
- 16 amount appropriated by the legislature for the payment of early
- 17 graduation achievement scholarships is not sufficient to pay each
- 18 eligible student the early graduation achievement scholarship
- 19 amount required under this section for an academic year, the
- 20 department shall adjust the amount of early graduation achievement
- 21 scholarships paid under this section by prorating the amounts as
- 22 necessary to reflect the available resources and amounts
- 23 appropriated in that fiscal year. The department shall notify the
- 24 governor, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the
- 25 majority leader of the senate in writing at least 30 days before
- 26 implementing a proration under this subsection.
- Sec. 6. (1) The department shall determine the manner and form

- 1 of application to receive an early graduation achievement
- 2 scholarship under section 5.
- 3 (2) A student shall include a written certification to the
- 4 department in his or her application to receive an early graduation
- 5 achievement scholarship that contains all of the following:
- 6 (a) His or her certification that he or she meets the
- 7 requirements of section 4.
- 8 (b) His or her certification that he or she is enrolled in an
- 9 approved postsecondary educational institution and the name of the
- 10 approved postsecondary educational institution.
- 11 (c) The amount of his or her tuition expense at the approved
- 12 postsecondary educational institution for the current academic
- 13 year.
- 14 (3) An approved postsecondary educational institution shall
- 15 not consider an early graduation achievement scholarship in
- 16 determining a student's eligibility for a financial aid program
- 17 administered by this state. It is the intent of the legislature
- 18 that an approved postsecondary educational institution does not
- 19 reduce other institutionally funded student aid for which a student
- 20 is eligible because of the student's receipt of or eligibility for
- 21 an early graduation achievement scholarship.
- Sec. 7. (1) The department shall disburse early graduation
- 23 achievement scholarship money to an approved postsecondary
- 24 institution on the student's behalf according to a payment
- 25 procedure established by the department.
- 26 (2) An approved postsecondary educational institution shall
- 27 apply money received under subsection (1) on a student's behalf to

- 1 the student's outstanding indebtedness for tuition and retain the
- 2 remaining balance on the student's behalf and apply it to his or
- 3 her future tuition indebtedness. However, if the student is no
- 4 longer enrolled in the institution, the institution shall return
- 5 any remaining balance to the department, and the student has no
- 6 further right to any money returned to the department under this
- 7 subdivision.
- 8 (3) Subsection (2) does not create an obligation on the part
- 9 of an approved postsecondary educational institution to loan or
- 10 advance money to a student for the payment of tuition, fees, or
- 11 other costs or expenses incurred by the student at that
- 12 institution.
- 13 (4) The department may promulgate rules to implement and
- 14 administer this act, including, but not limited to, 1 or more of
- 15 the following:
- 16 (a) Rules establishing the department's administrative
- 17 procedures for the early graduation achievement scholarship
- 18 program.
- 19 (b) Rules governing the qualification requirements for or the
- 20 award of early graduation achievement scholarships under this act.
- 21 (c) Rules establishing an appeals process from a determination
- 22 of ineligibility for an early graduation achievement scholarship.
- 23 (d) Rules establishing what information or reports a student
- 24 or an approved postsecondary educational institution must provide
- 25 to establish eligibility and when that information or those reports
- 26 must be provided.
- (e) Rules prescribing the reports to be made by a student

- 1 awarded an early graduation achievement scholarship and by an
- 2 approved postsecondary educational institution to which an early
- 3 graduation achievement scholarship is paid.
- 4 Sec. 8. By April 1 of each year, the department shall submit a
- 5 report on its activities under this act to the governor and to the
- 6 standing committees of the senate and house of representatives with
- 7 primary jurisdiction over higher education issues. The report shall
- 8 contain all of the following information:
- 9 (a) The number of early graduation achievement scholarships
- 10 and the amount of early graduation achievement scholarship money
- 11 paid by the department in the immediately preceding fiscal year.
- 12 (b) A list of the number of early graduation achievement
- 13 scholarships and the amount of early graduation achievement
- 14 scholarship money paid in the immediately preceding fiscal year at
- 15 each approved postsecondary educational institution.
- 16 Enacting section 1. This act does not take effect unless
- 17 Senate Bill No. or House Bill No. 4845 (request no. 01857'13
- 18 a) of the 97th Legislature is enacted into law.
