HOUSE BILL No. 4881

June 20, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Cavanagh, Faris, Smiley, Driskell, Hovey-Wright and Slavens and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to allow 1 or both parties to a marriage to change his or her name as part of the solemnization of the marriage; and to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state departments and agencies.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
 "Michigan name equality act".
 - Sec. 2. (1) Parties to a marriage are not required to have the same name. Neither party is required to change his or her name. A person's name shall not change upon marriage unless that person elects to change his or her name under this section.
 - (2) One party or both parties to a marriage may elect to

- 1 change the middle or last name, or both, by which that party wishes
- 2 to be known after solemnization of the marriage by entering the new
- 3 name in the spaces provided on the marriage license application
- 4 without intent to defraud.
- 5 Sec. 3. (1) A person may adopt any of the following last names
- 6 according to section 1:
- 7 (a) The current last name of the other spouse.
- 8 (b) The last name of either spouse given at birth.
- 9 (c) A name combining into a single last name all or a segment
- 10 of the current last name or the last name of either spouse given at
- 11 birth.
- 12 (d) A hyphenated combination of last names.
- 13 (2) A person may adopt any of the following middle names
- 14 according to section 1:
- 15 (a) The current last name of either spouse.
- (b) The last name of either spouse given at birth.
- 17 (c) A hyphenated combination of the current middle name and
- 18 the current last name of the person or spouse.
- 19 (d) A hyphenated combination of the current middle name and

- 21 Sec. 4. An election by a person to change his or her name
- 22 under section 1 serves as a record of the name change. A certified
- 23 copy of a marriage certificate containing the new name, or
- 24 retaining the former name, constitutes proof that the use of the
- 25 new name or retention of the former name is lawful.
- 26 Sec. 5. (1) A certified copy of a marriage certificate shall
- 27 be accepted as identification establishing a true, full name for

- 11 Sec. 6. The adoption of a new name, or the choice not to adopt
- 12 a new name, by means of a marriage license application under
- 13 section 1 shall only be made at the time the marriage license is
- 14 issued. After a marriage certificate is registered by the local
- 15 registrar, the certificate may not be amended to add a new name or
- 16 change the name adopted under section 1. An amendment may be issued
- 17 to correct a clerical error in the new name fields on the marriage
- 18 license. In this instance, the amendment must be signed by 1 of the
- 19 parties to the marriage and the county clerk or his or her
- 20 designee, and the reason for the amendment must be stated as
- 21 correcting a clerical error. A clerical error as used in this
- 22 section is an error made by the county clerk, his or her designee,
- 23 or a notary authorized to issue confidential marriage licenses,
- 24 where the information shown in the new name field does not match
- 25 the information shown on the marriage license application. This
- 26 requirement does not abrogate the right of either party to adopt a
- 27 different name through usage at a future date or to petition the

- 1 court for a change of name under the laws of this state.
- 2 Sec. 7. Nothing in this act abrogates the common law right of
- 3 any person to change his or her name or the right of any person to
- 4 petition the court for a change of name under the laws of this
- 5 state.
- Enacting section 1. This act takes effect January 1, 2015.
