## **HOUSE BILL No. 5024**

October 1, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Victory, Lauwers and VerHeulen and referred to the Committee on Regulatory Reform.

A bill to amend 1956 PA 217, entitled

"Electrical administrative act,"

by amending section 7 (MCL 338.887), as amended by 2013 PA 69.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 Sec. 7. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this act or in
- 2 subsection (3), a person shall not engage in the business of
- 3 electrical contracting unless the person has received from the
- 4 board or from the appropriate municipality an electrical
- 5 contractor's license.
- 6 (2) Except as otherwise provided in this act or in subsection
- 7 (3), an individual, other than an individual who is licensed under
- 8 this act and employed by and working under the direction of a
- 9 holder of an electrical contractor's license, shall not in any

- 1 manner undertake to execute any electrical wiring.
- 2 (3) A license under this act is not required in the execution
- 3 of the following classes of work:
- 4 (a) Minor repair work.
- 5 (b) The installation, alteration, repairing, rebuilding, or
- 6 remodeling of elevators, dumbwaiters, escalators, or man lifts
- 7 performed under a permit issued by an elevator inspection agency of
- 8 this state or political subdivision of this state.
- 9 (c) The installation, alteration, or repair of electrical
- 10 equipment and its associated wiring installed on the premises of
- 11 consumers or subscribers by or for an electrical energy supply or
- 12 communication agency for use by that agency in the generation,
- 13 transmission, distribution, or metering of electrical energy or for
- 14 the operation of signals or transmission of intelligence.
- 15 (d) The installation, alteration, or repair of electric wiring
- 16 for the generation and primary distribution of electric current, or
- 17 the secondary distribution system up to and including the meters,
- 18 where that work is an integral part of the system owned and
- 19 operated by an electric light and power utility in rendering its
- 20 duly authorized service.
- (e) Any work involved in the manufacture of electric
- 22 equipment, including the testing and repairing of that manufactured
- 23 equipment.
- 24 (f) The installation, alteration, or repair of equipment and
- 25 its associated wiring for the generation or distribution of
- 26 electric energy for the operation of signals or transmission of
- 27 intelligence if that work is performed in connection with a

- 1 communication system owned or operated by a telephone or telegraph
- 2 company in rendering PROVIDING its authorized service as a
- 3 telephone or telegraph company.
- 4 (g) Any installation, alteration, or repair of electrical
- 5 equipment by a homeowner in a single family home and accompanying
- 6 outbuildings owned and occupied or to be occupied by the individual
- 7 who is performing the installation, alteration, or repair of
- 8 electrical equipment.
- 9 (h) Any work involved in the use, maintenance, operation,
- 10 dismantling, or reassembling of motion picture and theatrical
- 11 equipment used in any building with approved facilities for
- 12 entertainment or educational use and that has the necessary
- 13 permanent wiring and floor and wall receptacle outlets designed for
- 14 the proper and safe use of that theatrical equipment, but not
- 15 including any permanent wiring.
- 16 (i) Work performed by a mechanical contractor licensed in a
- 17 classification listed in section 6(3)(a), (b), (d), (e), and OR (f)
- 18 of the Forbes mechanical contractors act, 1984 PA 192, MCL 338.976,
- 19 a plumbing contractor licensed under the state plumbing act, 2002
- 20 PA 733, MCL 338.3511 to 338.3569, and employees of persons OR AN
- 21 EMPLOYEE OF A PERSON THAT IS licensed under those acts, while
- 22 performing INSTALLATION, maintenance, service, repair, replacement,
- 23 alteration, modification, reconstruction, or upgrading of control
- 24 wiring circuits and electrical component parts within existing IN
- 25 mechanical systems defined in the mechanical and plumbing codes
- 26 provided for in the Stille-DeRossett-Hale single state construction
- 27 code act, 1972 PA 230, MCL 125.1501 to 125.1531, including, but not

- 1 limited to, energy management systems, relays and controls on
- 2 boilers, water heaters, furnaces, air conditioning compressors and
- 3 condensers, fan controls, thermostats and sensors, and all
- 4 interconnecting wiring associated with the mechanical systems in
- 5 buildings which THAT are on the load side of the unit disconnect,
- 6 which is located on or immediately adjacent to the equipment,
- 7 except for life safety systems wiring.
- 8 (j) Electrical wiring associated with the installation,
- 9 removal, alteration, or repair of a water well pump on a single
- 10 family dwelling to the first point of attachment in the house
- 11 DWELLING from the well, by a pump installer registered under part
- 12 127 of the public health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.12701 to
- **13** 333.12771.
- 14 (k) The installation, maintenance, or servicing of security
- 15 alarm systems in a building or structure. As used in this
- 16 subdivision, "security alarm system" means that term as defined in
- 17 section 6(2)(c).
- (l) The installation, maintenance, or servicing of listed
- 19 residential and commercial lawn irrigation equipment, except any
- 20 permanent wired connections exceeding THAT EXCEED 30 volts.
- 21 (m) The installation, maintenance, or servicing of listed
- 22 landscape lighting systems and equipment, except any permanent
- 23 wired connections exceeding THAT EXCEED 30 volts.
- 24 (n) The installation, alteration, maintenance, or repair of
- 25 electric signs and related wiring by an unlicensed individual under
- 26 the direct supervision of a licensed sign specialist except that
- 27 the ratio of unlicensed individuals engaged in this activity shall

- 1 not exceed 2 unlicensed individuals to 1 licensed sign specialist.
- 2 An enforcing agency shall enforce this ratio on a jobsite basis.
- 3 (o) The construction, installation, maintenance, repair, and
- 4 OR renovation of telecommunications equipment and related systems
- 5 by a person that is primarily engaged in the telecommunications and
- 6 related information systems industry. This exemption does not
- 7 include the construction, installation, maintenance, repair, or
- 8 renovation of a fire alarm system.
