## **HOUSE BILL No. 5124**

October 31, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Leonard, Cotter and Walsh and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1961 PA 236, entitled
"Revised judicature act of 1961,"
by amending sections 502, 504, 516, and 8121 (MCL 600.502, 600.504, 600.516, and 600.8121), section 504 as amended by 2011 PA 300 and section 8121 as amended by 2012 PA 37.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- Sec. 502. (1) The EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), THE
  first judicial circuit consists of the county of Hillsdale and has
  judge.
  - (2) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2016, THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT
    CONSISTS OF THE COUNTIES OF HILLSDALE AND BRANCH AND HAS 2 JUDGES.
    THE ADDITIONAL JUDGESHIP IN THIS CIRCUIT SHALL BE FILLED BY THE
    INCUMBENT JUDGE OF THE FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, WHO SHALL BECOME
    A JUDGE OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT FOR THE BALANCE OF THE TERM
    TO WHICH HE OR SHE WAS ELECTED OR APPOINTED. BEGINNING JANUARY 2,

- 1 2016, THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT HAS 1 CIRCUIT JUDGE BEGINNING ON
- 2 THE EARLIER OF THE FOLLOWING DATES:
- 3 (A) THE DATE ON WHICH A VACANCY OCCURS IN THE OFFICE OF
- 4 CIRCUIT JUDGE IN THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, UNLESS THE VACANCY
- 5 OCCURS AFTER A JUDGE'S SUCCESSOR IN OFFICE HAS BEEN ELECTED BUT
- 6 BEFORE THAT SUCCESSOR TAKES OFFICE.
- 7 (B) THE BEGINNING DATE OF THE TERM FOR WHICH AN INCUMBENT
- 8 CIRCUIT JUDGE IN THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT NO LONGER SEEKS
- 9 ELECTION OR REELECTION TO THAT OFFICE.
- 10 (3) IF 2 CIRCUIT JUDGES ARE TO BE ELECTED AT THE NOVEMBER 2020
- 11 GENERAL ELECTION IN THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT, FOR THAT ELECTION
- 12 ONLY THE TERM OF THE CANDIDATE FOR CIRCUIT JUDGE WHO RECEIVES THE
- 13 GREATEST NUMBER OF VOTES IS 8 YEARS AND THE TERM OF THE CANDIDATE
- 14 FOR CIRCUIT JUDGE WHO RECEIVES THE SECOND GREATEST NUMBER OF VOTES
- 15 IS 6 YEARS.
- 16 Sec. 504. The third judicial circuit consists of the county of
- 17 Wayne and has the following number of judges:
- 18 (a) Until 12 noon, January 1, <del>2013, 61</del> **2015, 60** judges.
- 19 (b) Beginning 12 noon, January 1, <del>2013, 60</del> **2015, 56** judges.
- Sec. 516. (1) The EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (2), THE
- 21 fifteenth judicial circuit consists of the county of Branch and has
- 22 1 judge.
- 23 (2) BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2016, ALL OF THE FOLLOWING APPLY:
- 24 (A) THE FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT IS ABOLISHED AND THE
- 25 INCUMBENT JUDGE OF THE FIFTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT SHALL BECOME A
- 26 JUDGE OF THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT FOR THE BALANCE OF THE TERM TO
- 27 WHICH HE OR SHE WAS ELECTED OR APPOINTED.

- 1 (B) ALL FILES, RECORDS, AND PENDING CASES OF THE FIFTEENTH
- 2 JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURT SHALL BE TRANSFERRED TO THE FIRST JUDICIAL
- 3 CIRCUIT COURT, AND THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURT SHALL EXERCISE
- 4 ALL POWERS IN REGARD TO THOSE FILES, RECORDS, AND CASES AS
- 5 PRESCRIBED BY THE SUPREME COURT. THE FIRST JUDICIAL CIRCUIT COURT
- 6 SHALL HAVE JURISDICTION TO HEAR AND DETERMINE ALL CASES TRANSFERRED

- 20 of the third class, and has 2 judges. IF THE GOVERNING BODIES OF
- 21 THE CITY OF WESTLAND AND THE CITY OF WAYNE APPROVE BY RESOLUTIONS
- 22 THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE EIGHTEENTH AND TWENTY-NINTH DISTRICTS

- 27 A DISTRICT OF THE THIRD CLASS, AND HAS 3 JUDGES. THE ADDITIONAL

- 2 INCUMBENT JUDGE OF THE TWENTY-NINTH DISTRICT, WHO SHALL BECOME A

- 8 DISTRICT JUDGE IN THE EIGHTEENTH DISTRICT WHO RECEIVES THE SECOND-
- 9 GREATEST NUMBER OF VOTES IS 6 YEARS.
- 10 (B) THE CLERK OF THE CITY OF WESTLAND AND THE CLERK OF THE
- 11 CITY OF WAYNE SHALL FILE COPIES OF THE RESOLUTIONS WITH THE STATE
- 12 COURT ADMINISTRATOR, WHO, AS AUTHORIZED BY THE SUPREME COURT, SHALL
- 13 NOTIFY THE ELECTIONS DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE THAT THE
- 14 CONSOLIDATION HAS BEEN APPROVED UNDER THIS SECTION.
- 15 (C) BY PROPOSING OR AUTHORIZING THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE
- 16 EIGHTEENTH AND TWENTY-NINTH DISTRICTS, THE LEGISLATURE IS NOT
- 17 CREATING A NEW OBLIGATION FOR ANY AFFECTED DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT.
- 18 IF A DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT, ACTING THROUGH ITS GOVERNING BODY,
- 19 APPROVES THE CONSOLIDATION, THEN THE APPROVAL CONSTITUTES AN
- 20 EXERCISE OF THE DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT'S OPTION TO INCREASE THE
- 21 LEVEL OF ACTIVITY AND SERVICE OFFERED IN THAT DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT
- 22 BEYOND THAT REQUIRED BY EXISTING LAW, AS THE ELEMENTS OF THAT
- 23 OPTION ARE DEFINED BY 1979 PA 101, MCL 21.231 TO 21.244, AND A
- 24 VOLUNTARY ACCEPTANCE BY THAT DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT OF ALL EXPENSES
- 25 AND CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS THAT MAY RESULT FROM THE CONSOLIDATION OF
- 26 THE DISTRICTS. HOWEVER, THE EXERCISE OF THE OPTION DOES NOT AFFECT
- 27 THE STATE'S OBLIGATION TO PAY THE SAME PORTION OF EACH JUDGE'S

- 1 SALARY THAT IS PAID BY THE STATE TO OTHER DISTRICT JUDGES AS
- 2 PROVIDED BY LAW, OR TO APPROPRIATE AND DISBURSE FUNDS TO THE
- 3 DISTRICT CONTROL UNIT FOR THE NECESSARY COSTS OF STATE REQUIREMENTS
- 4 ESTABLISHED BY A STATE LAW THAT BECOMES EFFECTIVE ON OR AFTER
- 5 DECEMBER 23, 1978.
- 6 (4) The nineteenth district consists of the city of Dearborn,
- 7 is a district of the third class, and has 3 judges.
- **8** (5) The twentieth district consists of the city of Dearborn
- 9 Heights, is a district of the third class, and has 2 judges.
- 10 (6) The twenty-first district consists of the city of Garden
- 11 City, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 12 (7) The twenty-second district consists of the city of
- 13 Inkster, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 14 (8) The twenty-third district consists of the city of Taylor,
- 15 is a district of the third class, and has 2 judges.
- 16 (9) The twenty-fourth district consists of the cities of Allen
- 17 Park and Melvindale, is a district of the third class, and has 2
- 18 judges.
- 19 (10) The twenty-fifth district consists of the city of Lincoln
- 20 Park, is a district of the third class, and has 2 judges. Beginning
- 21 April 1, 2012, the twenty-fifth district consists of the cities of
- 22 Ecorse, Lincoln Park, and River Rouge, is a district of the third
- 23 class, and has 3 judges. The additional judgeship in the twenty-
- 24 fifth district shall be filled by the incumbent judge of the
- 25 twenty-sixth district, who shall become a judge of the twenty-fifth
- 26 district for the balance of the term to which he or she was elected
- 27 or appointed. Sections 8175 and 8176 do not apply to the

- 1 consolidation of the twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth districts.
- 2 Beginning April 2, 2012, the twenty-fifth district has 2 judges.
- 3 (11) The twenty-sixth district consists of the cities of River
- 4 Rouge and Ecorse, is a district of the third class, and has 1
- 5 judge. Beginning on April 1, 2012, the twenty-sixth district is
- 6 abolished and the judge of the twenty-sixth district shall become a
- 7 judge of the twenty-fifth district for the balance of the term to
- 8 which he or she was elected or appointed.
- 9 (12) The twenty-seventh district consists of the cities of
- 10 Wyandotte and Riverview, is a district of the third class, and has
- **11** 1 judge.
- 12 (13) The twenty-eighth district consists of the city of
- 13 Southgate, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 14 (14) The EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (3), THE twenty-
- 15 ninth district consists of the city of Wayne, is a district of the
- 16 third class, and has 1 judge.
- 17 (15) The thirtieth district consists of the city of Highland
- 18 Park, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 19 (16) The thirty-first district consists of the city of
- 20 Hamtramck, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 21 (17) The thirty-second-a district consists of the city of
- 22 Harper Woods, is a district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 23 (18) The thirty-second-b district consists of the cities of
- 24 Grosse Pointe Woods, Grosse Pointe Park, Grosse Pointe, and Grosse
- 25 Pointe Farms, and the village of Grosse Pointe Shores, is a
- 26 district of the third class, and has 1 judge.
- 27 (19) The thirty-third district consists of the cities of

- 1 Trenton, Gibraltar, Woodhaven, Rockwood, and Flat Rock and the
- 2 townships of Brownstown and Grosse Ile in the county of Wayne, is a
- 3 district of the third class, and has the following number of
- 4 judges:
- 5 (a) Until the date determined under subdivision (b), 3 judges.
- 6 (b) Beginning on the earlier of the following dates, 2 judges:
- 7 (i) The date on which a vacancy occurs in the office of
- 8 district judge in this district UNLESS THE VACANCY OCCURS AFTER THE
- 9 JUDGE'S SUCCESSOR IN OFFICE HAS BEEN ELECTED BUT BEFORE THAT
- 10 SUCCESSOR TAKES OFFICE.
- 11 (ii) The beginning date of the term for which an incumbent
- 12 district judge in this district no longer seeks election or
- 13 reelection to that office.
- 14 (20) The thirty-fourth district consists of the townships of
- 15 Sumpter, Van Buren, and Huron in the county of Wayne and the cities
- 16 of Romulus and Belleville, is a district of the third class, and
- 17 has 3 judges.
- 18 (21) The thirty-fifth district consists of the cities of
- 19 Northville and Plymouth and the townships of Northville, Plymouth,
- 20 and Canton in the county of Wayne, is a district of the third
- 21 class, and has 3 judges.
