

HOUSE BILL No. 5126

November 5, 2013, Introduced by Reps. Geiss, Cochran, Santana, LaVoy, Knezek, Dillon, Brunner, Barnett, Schor and Nathan and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled
"The revised school code,"
(MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1308a.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

1 SEC. 1308A. (1) THE SAFE AND SECURE SCHOOLS FUND IS CREATED
2 WITHIN THE STATE TREASURY.

3 (2) THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DEPOSIT INTO THE SAFE AND SECURE
4 SCHOOLS FUND MONEY RECEIVED UNDER SECTION 1J(7) OF CHAPTER IX OF
5 THE CODE OF CRIMINAL PROCEDURE, 1927 PA 175, MCL 769.1J. THE STATE
6 TREASURER SHALL MAINTAIN SEPARATE ACCOUNTS IN THE FUND FOR EACH
7 SCHOOL DISTRICT AND SHALL DEPOSIT INTO THE ACCOUNT FOR A SCHOOL
8 DISTRICT ALL MONEY RECEIVED UNDER THAT SECTION THAT IS RECEIVED DUE
9 TO AN OFFENSE THAT OCCURRED IN THAT SCHOOL DISTRICT. THE STATE

1 TREASURER ALSO MAY RECEIVE MONEY OR OTHER ASSETS FROM ANY OTHER
2 SOURCE FOR DEPOSIT INTO THE FUND. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL DIRECT
3 THE INVESTMENT OF THE FUND. THE STATE TREASURER SHALL CREDIT TO THE
4 FUND INTEREST AND EARNINGS FROM FUND INVESTMENTS.

5 (3) MONEY IN THE SAFE AND SECURE SCHOOLS FUND AT THE CLOSE OF
6 THE FISCAL YEAR SHALL REMAIN IN THE FUND AND SHALL NOT LAPSE TO THE
7 GENERAL FUND.

8 (4) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE THE ADMINISTRATOR OF THE SAFE AND
9 SECURE SCHOOLS FUND FOR AUDITING PURPOSES.

10 (5) SUBJECT TO SUBSECTION (6), THE DEPARTMENT SHALL EXPEND
11 MONEY FROM A SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCOUNT IN THE SAFE AND SECURE SCHOOLS
12 FUND, UPON APPROPRIATION, ONLY FOR PROVIDING A GRANT TO THAT SCHOOL
13 DISTRICT FOR 1 OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

14 (A) SEPARATING PUBLIC ENTRY POINTS FROM CLASSROOMS AND
15 HALLWAYS LEADING TO CLASSROOMS.

16 (B) EMERGENCY NOTIFICATION SYSTEMS TO NOTIFY LOCAL LAW
17 ENFORCEMENT OF AN EMERGENCY, IN ORDER TO DECREASE RESPONSE TIME.

18 (C) HIRING SECURITY PERSONNEL.

19 (D) IMPROVING EXTERNAL WINDOWS TO MAKE THEM BULLET-PROOF.

20 (E) TRAINING TEACHERS AND OTHER PERSONNEL IN EMERGENCY
21 RESPONSE PROCEDURES.

22 (F) PURCHASING METAL DETECTORS.

23 (G) OBTAINING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES TO EVALUATE SAFETY AND
24 SECURITY ISSUES AT SCHOOL.

25 (H) FUNDING LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT OVERTIME COSTS FOR
26 PATROLLING FOR EXTRACURRICULAR EVENTS OR EVENTS OCCURRING DURING
27 SCHOOL HOURS.

1 (I) FUNDING SECURITY FOR TRANSPORTATION OF PUPILS FOR
2 AUTHORIZED SCHOOL TRIPS OR OTHER OFF-SITE ACTIVITIES.

3 (J) ANOTHER PROJECT THAT IS DESIGNED TO IMPROVE SAFETY AND
4 SECURITY AT SCHOOL, IS IDENTIFIED BY THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, AND IS
5 APPROVED BY THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION.

6 (6) THE DEPARTMENT MAY EXPEND MONEY IN THE SAFE AND SECURE
7 SCHOOLS FUND THAT IS NOT IN ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT ACCOUNT, UPON
8 APPROPRIATION, FOR PROVIDING A GRANT TO ANY SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR A
9 PURPOSE DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (5). IF THE DEPARTMENT DETERMINES
10 THAT A SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT HAS RECEIVED 1 OR MORE GRANTS UNDER
11 SUBSECTION (5) DOES NOT HAVE ANY FURTHER NEED FOR AN ADDITIONAL
12 GRANT UNDER SUBSECTION (5), THE DEPARTMENT MAY EXPEND MONEY IN THAT
13 SCHOOL DISTRICT'S ACCOUNT IN THE FUND, UPON APPROPRIATION, FOR
14 PROVIDING A GRANT TO ANY OTHER SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR A PURPOSE
15 DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (5).

16 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
17 unless Senate Bill No.____ or House Bill No. 5127 (request no.
18 03654'13) of the 97th Legislature is enacted into law.
