HOUSE BILL No. 5144

November 12, 2013, Introduced by Rep. Stallworth and referred to the Committee on Education.

A bill to amend 1976 PA 451, entitled "The revised school code," (MCL 380.1 to 380.1852) by adding section 1280g.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

- 1 SEC. 1280G. (1) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING
- 2 TO HELP ENSURE THAT MORE PUPILS WILL ACHIEVE A SCORE OF AT LEAST
- 3 PROFICIENT IN READING ON THE GRADE 3 STATE ASSESSMENT:
- 4 (A) NOT LATER THAN APRIL 1, 2014, DEVELOP AND SUBMIT TO THE
- 5 SENATE AND HOUSE STANDING COMMITTEES ON EDUCATION A REPORT
- 6 IDENTIFYING PROGRAMS THAT HAVE BEEN DEMONSTRATED TO BE SUCCESSFUL
- 7 IN HELPING LOW-PERFORMING ELEMENTARY GRADE STUDENTS TO BECOME MORE
- 8 PROFICIENT IN READING.
- 9 (B) NOT LATER THAN JUNE 1, 2014, RECOMMEND OR DEVELOP 1 OR
- 10 MORE READING PROGRAMS FOR IMPROVING THE READING SKILLS OF PUPILS TO
 - A LEVEL THAT WILL ALLOW THEM TO BECOME PROFICIENT IN READING BY THE

- 1 END OF GRADE 3, AS MEASURED BY THE GRADE 3 STATE ASSESSMENT. THE
- 2 PROGRAM OR PROGRAMS SHALL FOCUS ON DIAGNOSTIC EVALUATION, EARLY
- 3 INTERVENTION, TUTORING, AND MENTORING.
- 4 (C) FOR THE 2014-2015 SCHOOL YEAR, IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM OR
- 5 PROGRAMS RECOMMENDED OR DEVELOPED UNDER SUBDIVISION (B) AS A PILOT
- 6 PROGRAM FOR A COMBINED TOTAL OF UP TO 400 PUPILS IN GRADES K-3 IN
- 7 UP TO 4 SCHOOL DISTRICTS OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMIES, AT LEAST 1 OF
- 8 WHICH IS LOCATED IN AN URBAN AREA.
- 9 (D) DEVELOP A PROCESS TO ALLOW PUPILS TO RETAKE THE GRADE 3
- 10 READING ASSESSMENT AS ALLOWED UNDER SECTION 1280F.
- 11 (2) BEGINNING IN THE 2014-2015 SCHOOL YEAR, THE BOARD OF A
- 12 SCHOOL DISTRICT OR BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF A PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY
- 13 SHALL DO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING TO HELP ENSURE THAT MORE PUPILS WILL
- 14 ACHIEVE A SCORE OF AT LEAST PROFICIENT IN READING ON THE GRADE 3
- 15 STATE ASSESSMENT:
- 16 (A) USE EFFECTIVE EARLY SCREENING INSTRUMENTS TO IDENTIFY
- 17 EARLY LITERACY DELAYS FOR ALL PUPILS IN GRADES K TO 2 AND FOR GRADE
- 18 3 PUPILS WHO HAVE PREVIOUSLY BEEN IDENTIFIED AS EXPERIENCING EARLY
- 19 LITERACY DELAYS. THIS EARLY SCREENING SHALL BE CONDUCTED WITHIN THE
- 20 FIRST 30 SCHOOL DAYS OF EACH SCHOOL YEAR.
- 21 (B) IF A PUPIL IS IDENTIFIED AS HAVING AN EARLY LITERACY
- 22 DELAY, NOTIFY THE PUPIL'S PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OF THE DELAY IN
- 23 WRITING AND PROVIDE TOOLS TO ASSIST THE PARENT OR LEGAL GUARDIAN TO
- 24 ENGAGE IN INTERVENTION AT HOME.
- 25 (C) USE INTENSIVE INTERVENTION PROGRAMS TO PROVIDE
- 26 INTERVENTION FOR ANY PUPIL IDENTIFIED AS EXPERIENCING AN EARLY
- 27 LITERACY DELAY. THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY MAY

- 1 CHOOSE THE INTENSIVE INTERVENTION PROGRAM OR PROGRAMS THAT IT WILL
- 2 USE TO COMPLY WITH THIS SUBDIVISION. IF A SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC
- 3 SCHOOL ACADEMY USES A SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM AS THE INTENSIVE
- 4 INTERVENTION FOR A PUPIL WHO IS IDENTIFIED AS HAVING AN EARLY
- 5 LITERACY DELAY IN GRADE 3, THE PUPIL IS STILL SUBJECT TO SECTION
- 6 1280F AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT OR PUBLIC SCHOOL ACADEMY SHALL ENSURE
- 7 THAT THE PUPIL IS GIVEN THE OPPORTUNITY TO RETAKE THE GRADE 3
- 8 READING ASSESSMENT BEFORE ENROLLING IN GRADE 4, AS ALLOWED UNDER
- 9 SECTION 1280F.
- 10 (D) SUBMIT EARLY LITERACY DATA TO THE DEPARTMENT ANNUALLY IN
- 11 THE FORM AND MANNER PRESCRIBED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
- 12 (3) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL SEEK FUNDING FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM OR
- 13 PROGRAMS UNDER SUBSECTION (1) FROM PRIVATE AND PUBLIC SOURCES. THE
- 14 LEGISLATURE SHALL APPROPRIATE FUNDS FROM THESE SOURCES, AND FROM
- 15 THE STATE SCHOOL AID FUND AS NECESSARY, FOR THE 2014-2015 STATE
- 16 FISCAL YEAR FOR THE PILOT PROGRAM OR PROGRAMS.
- 17 Enacting section 1. This amendatory act does not take effect
- 18 unless House Bill No. 5111 of the 97th Legislature is enacted into
- **19** law.
