## **HOUSE BILL No. 5327**

February 13, 2014, Introduced by Reps. Rendon, Nesbitt, McBroom, Jenkins, Pettalia, Cotter, Crawford, LaVoy, MacGregor, Lauwers, Pscholka, MacMaster, Heise, Schmidt, Dianda and Kivela and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

(MCL 28.421 to 28.435) by adding section 1b.

- 16 (D) TO ENSURE THE SAFETY OF A PEACE OFFICER BEFORE A LAWFUL
- 17 SEARCH AND SEIZURE.
- 18 (E) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ACT.
- 19 (3) A PERSON WHO INTENTIONALLY VIOLATES SUBSECTION (2) IS
- 20 GUILTY OF A CRIME AS FOLLOWS:
- 21 (A) FOR A FIRST OFFENSE, THE PERSON IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 22 PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 93 DAYS OR A FINE OF

- 24 (B) FOR A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, THE PERSON IS GUILTY
- 25 OF A FELONY PUNISHABLE BY IMPRISONMENT FOR NOT MORE THAN 4 YEARS OR
- 26 A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$2,000.00, OR BOTH.
