## **SENATE BILL No. 112**

January 30, 2013, Introduced by Senators GREEN, CASPERSON, COLBECK, NOFS, JANSEN and PAPPAGEORGE and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

A bill to amend 1927 PA 372, entitled

"An act to regulate and license the selling, purchasing, possessing, and carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices; to prohibit the buying, selling, or carrying of certain firearms, gas ejecting devices, and electro-muscular disruption devices without a license or other authorization; to provide for the forfeiture of firearms and electro-muscular disruption devices under certain circumstances; to provide for penalties and remedies; to provide immunity from civil liability under certain circumstances; to prescribe the powers and duties of certain state and local agencies; to prohibit certain conduct against individuals who apply for or receive a license to carry a concealed pistol; to make appropriations; to prescribe certain conditions for the appropriations; and to repeal all acts and parts of acts inconsistent with this act,"

by amending section 50 (MCL 28.4250), as amended by 2012 PA 123.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

Sec. 50. (1) Subject to subsection (5), an individual licensed

under this act to carry a concealed pistol, or who is exempt from

licensure under section  $\frac{12a(1)(f)}{(f)}$ , -12A(1)(H), shall not carry a

- 1 concealed pistol on the premises of any of the following:
- 2 (a) A school or school property except that a AS FOLLOWS:
- 3 (i) AN INDIVIDUAL LICENSED UNDER THIS ACT TO CARRY A CONCEALED
- 4 PISTOL MAY CARRY A CONCEALED PISTOL IN A SCHOOL OR ON SCHOOL
- 5 PROPERTY IF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OR SCHOOL BOARD OF THE
- 6 SCHOOL HAS AUTHORIZED THE CARRYING OF CONCEALED PISTOLS IN THAT
- 7 SCHOOL OR ON THAT SCHOOL PROPERTY BY INDIVIDUALS OR EMPLOYEES
- 8 LICENSED UNDER THIS ACT, AS DETERMINED BY THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE
- 9 OFFICER OR SCHOOL BOARD OF THE SCHOOL. A CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OR
- 10 SCHOOL BOARD SHALL NOT DISCHARGE, DEMOTE, SUSPEND, THREATEN,
- 11 HARASS, OR IN ANY OTHER MANNER DISCRIMINATE AGAINST A TEACHER,
- 12 ADMINISTRATOR, OR OTHER EMPLOYEE IN THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF
- 13 EMPLOYMENT BECAUSE THE EMPLOYEE CARRIES A CONCEALED PISTOL UNDER
- 14 THIS SUBPARAGRAPH.
- 15 ( $\ddot{u}$ ) A parent or legal guardian of a student of the school is
- 16 not precluded from carrying a concealed pistol while in a vehicle
- 17 on school property, if he or she is dropping the student off at the
- 18 school or picking up the child STUDENT from the school. As used in
- 19 this section, "school" and "school property" mean those terms as
- 20 defined in section 237a of the Michigan penal code, 1931 PA 328,
- **21** MCL 750.237a.
- 22 (b) A public or private child care center or day care center,
- 23 public or private child caring institution, or public or private
- 24 child placing agency.
- (c) A sports arena or stadium.
- 26 (d) A bar or tavern licensed under the Michigan liquor control
- 27 code of 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, where the

- 1 primary source of income of the business is the sale of alcoholic
- 2 liquor by the glass and consumed on the premises. This subdivision
- 3 does not apply to an owner or employee of the business. The
- 4 Michigan liquor control commission shall develop and make available
- 5 to holders of licenses under the Michigan liquor control code of
- 6 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, an appropriate sign
- 7 stating that "This establishment prohibits patrons from carrying
- 8 concealed weapons". The owner or operator of an establishment
- 9 licensed under the Michigan liquor control code of 1998, 1998 PA
- 10 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, may, but is not required to, post the
- 11 sign developed under this subdivision. A record made available by
- 12 an establishment licensed under the Michigan liquor control code of
- 13 1998, 1998 PA 58, MCL 436.1101 to 436.2303, necessary to enforce
- 14 this subdivision is exempt from disclosure under the freedom of
- 15 information act, 1976 PA 442, MCL 15.231 to 15.246.
- 16 (e) Any property or facility owned or operated by a church,
- 17 synagogue, mosque, temple, or other place of worship, unless the
- 18 presiding official or officials of the church, synagogue, mosque,
- 19 temple, or other place of worship permit the carrying of concealed
- 20 pistol on that property or facility.
- 21 (f) An entertainment facility with a seating capacity of 2,500
- 22 or more individuals that the individual knows or should know has a
- 23 seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals or that has a sign
- 24 above each public entrance stating in letters not less than 1-inch
- 25 high a seating capacity of 2,500 or more individuals.
- 26 (g) A hospital.
- 27 (h) A dormitory or classroom of a community college, college,

- 1 or university.
- 2 (2) Subject to subsection (5), an individual shall not carry a
- 3 portable device that uses electro-muscular disruption technology on
- 4 any of the premises described in subsection (1).
- 5 (3) An individual licensed under this act to carry a concealed
- 6 pistol, or who is exempt from licensure under section  $\frac{12a(1)(f)}{f}$ ,
- 7 12A(1)(H), shall not carry a concealed pistol in violation of R
- 8 432.1212 or a successor rule of the Michigan administrative code
- 9 promulgated under the Michigan gaming control and revenue act, 1996
- 10 IL 1, MCL 432.201 to 432.226.
- 11 (4) As used in subsection (1), "premises" does not include
- 12 parking areas of the places identified under subsection (1).
- 13 (5) Subsections (1) and (2) do not apply to any of the
- 14 following:
- 15 (a) An individual licensed under this act who is a retired
- 16 police officer or retired law enforcement officer. The concealed
- 17 weapon licensing board may require a letter from the law
- 18 enforcement agency stating that the retired police officer or law
- 19 enforcement officer retired in good standing.
- 20 (b) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is
- 21 employed or contracted by an entity described under subsection (1)
- 22 to provide security services and is required by his or her employer
- 23 or the terms of a contract to carry a concealed firearm on the
- 24 premises of the employing or contracting entity.
- 25 (c) An individual who is licensed as a private investigator or
- 26 private detective under the professional investigator licensure
- 27 act, 1965 PA 285, MCL 338.821 to 338.851.

- 1 (d) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 2 corrections officer of a county sheriff's department.
- 3 (e) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 4 motor carrier officer or capitol security officer of the department
- 5 of state police.
- 6 (f) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 7 member of a sheriff's posse.
- 8 (q) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is an
- 9 auxiliary officer or reserve officer of a police or sheriff's
- 10 department.
- 11 (h) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 12 parole or probation officer of the department of corrections.
- 13 (i) A state court judge or state court retired judge who is
- 14 licensed under this act. The concealed weapon licensing board may
- 15 require a state court retired judge to obtain and carry a letter
- 16 from the judicial tenure commission stating that the state court
- 17 retired judge is in good standing as authorized under section 30 of
- 18 article VI of the state constitution of 1963, and rules promulgated
- 19 under that section, in order to qualify under this subdivision.
- 20 (j) An individual who is licensed under this act and who is a
- 21 court officer.
- 22 (6) An individual who violates this section is responsible for
- 23 a state civil infraction or quilty of a crime as follows:
- 24 (a) Except as provided in subdivisions (b) and (c), the
- 25 individual is responsible for a state civil infraction and may be
- 26 fined not more than \$500.00. The court shall order the individual's
- 27 license to carry a concealed pistol suspended for 6 months.

- 1 (b) For a second violation, the individual is guilty of a
- 2 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than \$1,000.00. The
- 3 court shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed
- 4 pistol revoked.
- 5 (c) For a third or subsequent violation, the individual is
- 6 guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4
- 7 years or a fine of not more than \$5,000.00, or both. The court
- 8 shall order the individual's license to carry a concealed pistol
- 9 revoked.
