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SENATE BILL No. 348

May 2, 2013, Introduced by Senators BIEDA, KOWALL, JONES, HOPGOOD, SMITH, JOHNSON, WARREN, ANDERSON and HOOD and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

A bill to amend 1969 PA 287, entitled

"An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines and to provide remedies,"

by amending the title and section 1 (MCL 287.331), as amended by 1997 PA 7, and by adding section 5b.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MICHIGAN ENACT:

TITLE

An act to regulate pet shops, animal control shelters, and animal protection shelters; to establish uniform procedures and minimum requirements for adoption of dogs, cats, and ferrets; TO REGULATE THE SALE OF DOGS AND CATS BY CERTAIN PERSONS; TO PROVIDE CERTAIN PROTECTIONS FOR PURCHASERS OF DOGS AND CATS; and to prescribe penalties and civil fines; and to provide remedies.

Sec. 1. As used in this act:

- 1 (a) "Adoption" means a transfer of ownership, with or without
- 2 remuneration, of a dog, cat, or ferret from an animal control
- 3 shelter or animal protection shelter to an individual for the
- 4 purpose of being a companion animal for that individual. As used in
- 5 this subdivision, a companion animal includes but is not limited to
- 6 a dog that is used for hunting or as a guard dog.
- 7 (b) "Alteration" means a professional sterilization procedure
- 8 performed by a veterinarian that renders a dog, cat, or ferret
- 9 incapable of reproducing.
- 10 (c) "Altered", in reference to a dog, cat, or ferret, means
- 11 having undergone alteration.
- 12 (d) "Animal" means a mammal. except ANIMAL DOES NOT INCLUDE
- 13 livestock as THAT TERM IS defined in SECTION 1 OF 1937 PA 284, MCL
- 14 287.121, to 287.131, and OR rodents.
- 15 (e) "Animal control shelter" means a facility operated by a
- 16 municipality for the impoundment and care of animals that are found
- 17 in the streets or at large, animals that are otherwise held due to
- 18 the violation of a municipal ordinance or state law, or animals
- 19 that are surrendered to the animal control shelter.
- 20 (f) "Animal protection shelter" means a facility operated by a
- 21 person, humane society, society for the prevention of cruelty to
- 22 animals, or any other nonprofit organization for the care of
- 23 homeless animals.
- 24 (G) "BREEDER" MEANS A PERSON WHO BREEDS OR RAISES DOGS OR CATS
- 25 FOR SALE TO THE PUBLIC. BREEDER DOES NOT INCLUDE AN ANIMAL CONTROL
- 26 SHELTER OR AN ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER.
- 27 (H) $\frac{g}{g}$ "Cat" means a domestic $\frac{g}{g}$ ANIMAL of any age of the

- 2 (I) (h)—"Department" means the state department of agriculture
- 3 AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT.
- 4 (J) (i) "Director" means the director of the department or his
- 5 or her authorized representative.
- 6 (K) (j) "Dog" means a domestic dog ANIMAL of any age of the
- 7 species canis familiaris.
- 8 (l) (k) "Ferret" means an animal of any age of the species
- 9 mustela furo.
- 10 (M) $\frac{(l)}{(l)}$ "Health certificate" means a certificate in a form
- 11 prescribed by the department in which a veterinarian attests to the
- 12 age, sex, breed, and description of an animal, and to the fact that
- 13 at the time of preparation of the certificate, the veterinarian
- 14 examined the animal and found the animal free from visual evidence
- 15 of communicable disease.
- 16 (N) (m) "Municipality" means a county, city, village, or
- 17 township.
- 18 (O) (n)—"Person" means an individual, partnership,
- 19 corporation, association, governmental entity, or other legal
- 20 entity.
- 21 (P) "PET DEALER" MEANS A PERSON WHO FOR COMPENSATION BUYS OR
- 22 SELLS DOGS OR CATS. PET DEALER DOES NOT INCLUDE AN ANIMAL CONTROL
- 23 SHELTER OR ANIMAL PROTECTION SHELTER.
- 24 (Q) (O)—"Pet shop" means a place where animals are sold or
- 25 offered for sale, exchange, or transfer.
- 26 (R) (p) "Veterinarian" means a person AN INDIVIDUAL licensed
- 27 to practice veterinary medicine under article 15 of the public

- 1 health code, 1978 PA 368, MCL 333.16101 to 333.18838.
- 2 SEC. 5B. (1) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO ALL OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 3 (A) A PET SHOP THAT SELLS DOGS OR CATS.
- 4 (B) A PET DEALER.
- 5 (C) A BREEDER.
- 6 (D) A PERSON OTHER THAN AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER, ANIMAL
- 7 PROTECTION SHELTER, PET DEALER, OR PET SHOP WHO ENGAGES IN THE SALE
- 8 OF DOGS OR CATS TO THE PUBLIC FOR PROFIT.
- 9 (E) A PERSON OTHER THAN AN ANIMAL CONTROL SHELTER, ANIMAL
- 10 PROTECTION SHELTER, PET DEALER, OR PET SHOP WHO SELLS MORE THAN 1
- 11 LITTER OF DOGS OR CATS UNDER 6 MONTHS OF AGE OR 2 DOGS OR CATS OVER
- 12 6 MONTHS OF AGE PER YEAR.
- 13 (2) A DOG OR CAT IS UNFIT FOR SALE AT THE TIME OF PURCHASE IF
- 14 ANY OF THE FOLLOWING OCCUR:
- 15 (A) WITHIN 10 DAYS AFTER A PURCHASER RECEIVES THE DOG OR CAT
- 16 FROM A PERSON DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1), A VETERINARIAN, AFTER
- 17 EXAMINATION OF THE DOG OR CAT, PROVIDES A WRITTEN DIAGNOSIS THAT
- 18 THE DOG OR CAT HAS SYMPTOMS OF A CONTAGIOUS OR INFECTIOUS DISEASE
- 19 OR ILLNESS THAT EXISTED IN THE DOG OR CAT AT THE TIME THE DOG OR
- 20 CAT WAS RECEIVED BY THE PURCHASER.
- 21 (B) WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER A PURCHASER RECEIVES THE DOG OR CAT
- 22 FROM A PERSON DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (1), A VETERINARIAN, AFTER
- 23 EXAMINATION OF THE DOG OR CAT, PROVIDES A WRITTEN DIAGNOSIS THAT
- 24 THE DOG OR CAT DIED OR IS ILL DUE TO A HEREDITARY OR CONGENITAL
- 25 DEFECT.
- 26 (3) IF A DOG OR CAT IS UNFIT FOR SALE AT THE TIME OF PURCHASE
- 27 AS DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION (2), THE PERSON DESCRIBED IN SUBSECTION

- 1 (1) THAT SOLD THE DOG OR CAT TO THE PURCHASER SHALL ALLOW THE
- 2 PURCHASER OF THE DOG OR CAT TO DO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING WITHIN 10
- 3 BUSINESS DAYS AFTER A WRITTEN DIAGNOSIS BY A VETERINARIAN UNDER
- 4 SUBSECTION (2):
- 5 (A) RETURN THE DOG OR CAT FOR A REFUND OF THE FULL PURCHASE
- 6 PRICE.
- 7 (B) IF A REPLACEMENT DOG OR CAT IS AVAILABLE, EXCHANGE THE DOG
- 8 OR CAT FOR ANOTHER DOG OR CAT OF THE PURCHASER'S CHOICE THAT IS OF
- 9 EQUAL VALUE.
- 10 (C) RETAIN THE DOG OR CAT AND RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR
- 11 REASONABLE VETERINARY FEES. THE REIMBURSEMENT OF REASONABLE
- 12 VETERINARY FEES SHALL NOT EXCEED THE ORIGINAL PURCHASE PRICE OF THE
- 13 DOG OR CAT.
- 14 (D) IF THE DOG OR CAT DIES, RECEIVE ANOTHER DOG OR CAT OF
- 15 EQUAL VALUE, IF AVAILABLE, AND RECEIVE REIMBURSEMENT FOR REASONABLE
- 16 VETERINARY FEES. THE REIMBURSEMENT OF REASONABLE VETERINARY FEES
- 17 SHALL NOT EXCEED THE ORIGINAL PURCHASE PRICE OF THE DOG OR CAT.
- 18 (E) IF THE DOG OR CAT DIES, RECEIVE A REFUND OF THE FULL
- 19 PURCHASE PRICE.
- 20 (4) A PET SHOP THAT SELLS DOGS OR CATS OR A PET DEALER SHALL
- 21 DELIVER TO EACH POTENTIAL PURCHASER OF A DOG OR CAT ALL OF THE
- 22 FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 23 (A) THE NAME, ADDRESS, AND USDA LICENSE NUMBER OF THE BREEDER
- 24 OF THE DOG OR CAT AND ANY BROKER WHO HAS HAD POSSESSION OF THE DOG
- 25 OR CAT BEFORE THE PET SHOP OR PET DEALER.
- 26 (B) THE DATE OF THE DOG'S OR CAT'S BIRTH.
- 27 (C) THE DATE THE PET SHOP OR PET DEALER RECEIVED THE DOG OR

- 1 CAT.
- 2 (D) THE BREED, SEX, COLOR, AND IDENTIFYING MARKS OF THE DOG OR
- 3 CAT.
- 4 (E) THE INDIVIDUAL IDENTIFYING TAG, TATTOO, OR COLLAR NUMBER
- 5 OF THE DOG OR CAT.
- 6 (F) THE NAME AND REGISTRATION NUMBER OF THE SIRE AND DAM AND
- 7 THE LITTER NUMBER, IF THE DOG OR CAT IS A PUREBRED DOG OR CAT.
- 8 (G) THE INOCULATIONS, WORMING TREATMENTS, AND MEDICATION GIVEN
- 9 TO THE DOG OR CAT WHILE IN POSSESSION OF THE PET SHOP OR PET
- 10 DEALER.
- 11 (H) A STATEMENT SIGNED BY AN AUTHORIZING REPRESENTATIVE OF THE
- 12 PET SHOP OR PET DEALER THAT THE DOG OR CAT HAS NO KNOWN HEALTH
- 13 PROBLEM, OR A STATEMENT SIGNED BY THE PET SHOP OR PET DEALER
- 14 DISCLOSING ANY KNOWN HEALTH PROBLEM AND A STATEMENT SIGNED BY A
- 15 VETERINARIAN THAT RECOMMENDS NECESSARY TREATMENT.
- 16 (5) THIS SECTION DOES NOT LIMIT THE RIGHTS OR REMEDIES
- 17 OTHERWISE AVAILABLE TO THE PURCHASER OF A DOG OR CAT UNDER ANY
- 18 OTHER LAW.
